Finally! Pharaoh let the Israelites go. Of course, Pharaoh changed his mind and sent his armies after the Israelites. We know he'd done that before, right? The Egyptians were closing in on the Israelites, and the Israelites were trapped at the Red Sea with no way to get across. The Israelites were afraid, thinking they were going to die. But God parted the Red Sea for the Israelites. Can you imagine? Having a sea open up right in front of you so you can walk across on dry land? Then you see these huge walls of water on both sides of you! It must have been an awesome sight! Then the Egyptians started to cross. Well, God wasn't going to let that happen! As soon as the Israelites were safe on the other side, the waves of the Red Sea crashed down on the Egyptians. God helped his people when they were afraid and rescued them from their enemies.

Bible Point: God helps us when we're afraid.

Key Verse: "I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me" (Psalm 23:4).

Don't Be Afraid

As a family, take time to discuss the things that you are most afraid of and how to overcome those fears. For



example, if one family member is afraid of the house catching on fire, point out the smoke detectors in the house, and have a family fire drill. Write out emergency phone numbers, and put them in a special place. Look up verses in the Bible in which God promises to take care of us. Also, make a promise to one another not to tease anyone about his or her fears. That means if Mom is afraid of mice, no toy mice are to be left in her shoes.



Choose a way you'll turn to God to overcome your fears this week.

- Pay attention this week to areas of your life in which you feel afraid. Pray and ask God to help you learn to trust him instead of being afraid.
- Look up fear in the dictionary. Write down the definition. Then look up antonyms of fear.
 Write those down, and pray that God will help you become more filled with trust and hope in God. Put these definitions in your journal or Bible to remind you to ask God for help when you're afraid.
- Use yarn to make yourself a bracelet. As you make the bracelet, pray that God will help you when you're afraid. Anytime you feel afraid, let the bracelet remind you to trust God instead.



The Israelites were free from the Egyptians at last! But as they wandered through the desert, they became afraid. "We're hungry!" they grumbled. "We would have been better off if we'd stayed in Egypt; at least we had food. We're going to starve!"

God hadn't brought them to the desert to starve, though. So he miraculously provided for the Israelites, covering their desert camp with quail in the evening and with strange flakes called "manna" every morning. Everyone in the camp had plenty to eat because God provided. Bible Point: God gives us what we need.

Key Verse: "You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows" (Psalm 23:5).

God's Gifts Chart

Have everyone in the family work together to create a chart of things God provides for your



family. Make the chart out of construction paper maybe it could look like a big present—and hang it on your refrigerator. Throughout the week, have family members draw or write on the chart things God provides for them.



Choose a way we can continue to thank God for the things he provides for us.

- Write a letter to yourself about the kind of thankfulness you want to have for the things God gives you, and seal it in an envelope. Spend your week thanking God for all he gives you. At the end of the week, open the letter and read it.
- Give one thing that God gave you to someone else. God wants us to share what he gives us with others!
- Read a psalm of thanks such as Psalm 95, Psalm 118, or Psalm 138. Think about the psalm you read, and be aware of things you see that God gave to you.







As the Israelites wandered in the desert, they didn't know where they were or where they were going. The desert was hot and dry, and they feared they would die of thirst. "Have we been freed from slavery in Egypt simply to die in the desert?" they asked Moses. They complained and complained, angry with God for forgetting about them.

But God had not forgotten about them. Even though the Israelites chose to complain rather than to remember all the wonderful things God had done for them, God helped them. God caused water to flow from a rock, and the Israelites drank.

Bible Point: God is patient with us.

Key Verse: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters" (Psalm 23:1-2).

Remembering to Trust


Sit down with your family, and make a list of as many good gifts from God as you can think of—food to eat, a good family, and a place to live, for example. Ask your family members to think of times God helped them, and write those, too. Post the list where everyone can find it, and ask everyone to look at the list when he or she feels like complaining. The list can help you and your family remember to trust God and to be thankful when you feel like complaining.



Choose a way you'll remember to trust God instead of complaining.

- Pray about something you need or want from God. Practice patience this week by waiting for an answer from God.
- Help someone who's younger than you as he or she learns to do something new. Be patient, and remember how God is patient with you.
- Think of something you're trying to accomplish—whether you're learning to play
 the piano or trying to get better grades in
 math—and pray for patience as you try to
 learn to do that thing. Remember how God
 is patient.







No one would ever forget this meeting with God. Thunder rumbled and lightning flashed, and a thick cloud covered the mountain. Then the Israelites heard a very loud blast from a trumpet! Everyone in the camp was terrified! But there was no time to be scared; it was time to meet God. Moses led the Israelites to the foot of Mount Sinai. Smoke covered the mountain, and it shook violently. It was like a volcano erupting and an earthquake at the same time. The trumpet became louder and louder.

God really knew how to get people's attention! By giving us the Ten Commandments, he let us know how we could live our lives in a way that would honor him.

Bible Point: Honor God by obeying him.

Key Verse: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:5).



FAMILY FUN Mountain Rumble

Sit down with your family and spend a few minutes thinking of verbs that you can do inside your

home. Gather index cards and pens, and have family members each write one verb per index card. After there are several, shuffle them together and stand up.

Stand in front of your family with the pile of cards. Pick up one card and hold it out so your family can read it. The first person to act out the verb on that card gets to come take your role and choose a new card. Repeat this until all the cards have been done.

Then sit together and talk about how you can each obey God in your lives. Discuss similarities and differences between this game and what it's like to follow God on daily decisions in your life. Pray as a family for one area in which each of you would like to honor God by showing more obedience to him.

BIBLE FOCUS (THE BASICS)

Respecting others must be very important to God. Six of the commandments he gave us are all about showing others respect. So let's review what those things are. First, honor your father and mother—all the time. Second, don't murder—show forgiveness and kindness instead. Third, don't commit adultery. When you do get married, be true to the person you marry. Fourth, don't steal—anything. Fifth, don't lie—ever. Sixth, don't covet anything your neighbor has—even if it's really cool. Basically, do just what Jesus told us to do: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Bible Point: God tells us how to respect others.

Key Verse: " 'Do not murder, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not give false testimony, honor your father and mother,' and 'love your neighbor as yourself' " (Matthew 19:18–19).



The Israelites grew impatient while waiting for Moses to come back from Mount Sinai. They stopped doing what God had commanded them and created and worshipped a golden calf. When Moses returned, he was hopping mad with what he saw! He destroyed the golden calf, ground it into powder, put it in water, and had the Israelites drink it! The Israelites had really gotten out of hand, and now they were a laughingstock to their enemies.

Bible Point: Only God deserves our worship.




Worship

to worship together as a family. Think of things you can praise God for, and share those things. Read a psalm together, and discuss what that particular passage means to you. Then pray together and sing a favorite worship song or make up one of your own.







God told the Israelites exactly what they needed to do to build a Tabernacle. It would be a tent that would be used to worship God and would be portable so that it could be taken apart and moved as the Israelites traveled through the desert. Not only did the Israelites complete this huge project, but they also gave everything used to build it as a gift to God. The Tabernacle symbolized the great things that can be accomplished when all of God's people give joyfully of their time, talent, and treasures.

Bible Point: We all can serve God.

Key Verse: "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Colossians 3:17).

Choose a way you'll serve God this week with words, deeds, or both.

- One day this week when you're getting ready (when you're brushing your teeth, washing your hair, or eating breakfast), use that time to dedicate your day to serving God. Ask God to use you in each moment of that day, and as often as possible remind yourself that you're serving God with everything you do that day.
- Use one of your God-given talents to help someone else. You might help a neighbor with yardwork, paint a picture for someone who's sick, cook a good meal for your family, or play music for someone who needs to be encouraged. Do that thing for God, and serve him as you use your talent.
- Pay attention to the things you see and the things that happen around you. When you see someone using a talent God gave him or her, thank that person for blessing you with that talent. For example, if a clerk at the grocery store is very kind, thank that person for blessing you.







God told Moses to send 12 spies into Canaan to scout the land. Ten of the spies said that it was beautiful but that there were giants in the land and there was no way the Israelites could fight against them. Only two spies, Joshua and Caleb, came back and said that the land was beautiful and they should live there. Yes, there were giants in the land, but Israel had God on their side to help them.

Bible Point: Be brave for God.

Key Verse: "Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you" (1 Corinthians 15:58).



FAMILY FUN Spy Snacks

Bake brownies with a surprise hidden inside. Place half of the brownie batter in the pan. Place a

caramel in what would be the center of each brownie after it's cut. Cover the caramels with the remaining brownie batter. Everyone will be surprised by the treat inside.

When the brownies are ready, serve one brownie to each family member and sit together. As people discover the surprise inside the brownies, talk about how that's like or unlike realizing we can be brave for God. Perhaps our bravery is hidden inside, but in tough times when we rely on God, we find that bravery there. Or it could be that we hide God's Word in our hearts and when we're tested, we find that we're able to stand strong and be brave for God. Ask family members to share about a time they each were brave for God. Close your time in prayer, asking God to help each person have bravery in their hearts.

- When a friend tells you about something difficult going on in his or her life, be brave for God and ask if you can pray with your friend about that situation.
- One morning when you're getting ready for your day, stand on the feet you made today. Pray that God will help you stand firm for him and bravely do what's right.
- Invite a friend to church with you. Pray about which friend God would like you to invite, and then be brave by asking that person to join you at church.





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BIBLE FOCUS (THE BASICS)

The king of Moab was worried about his new neighbors. Lots and lots of Israelites had settled nearby, and the king was worried that they would take over the whole land. So he sent his princes to get a man named Balaam to come help. Balaam at first said no, but he later agreed to come. As Balaam was riding his donkey toward Moab, an angel of the Lord carrying a sword appeared in the road. The donkey could see the angel, but Balaam couldn't. How amazing! The donkey saw the angel three times, and three times she tried to turn away or stop. And all three times, Balaam beat the poor donkey.

After the third time, the donkey turned around and talked to Balaam. That's amazing, too! Then the Lord let Balaam see the angel, and Balaam apologized and offered to go back. The angel said he could go on to Moab, but could only say what the Lord told him to say.

Bible Point: Pay attention to God.

Key Verse: "Come and see what God has done, how awesome his works in man's behalf!" (Psalm 66:5).



FAMILY FUN Donkeys in Demand

Draw pictures of animals you might see at the zoo. As you draw the animals, talk about how Balaam's donkey helped you pay attention to God in a new way. Use biblegateway.com to search for words like

animal and donkey. You can find other times in the Bible that animals played an important role in what God was doing. Talk about how you think these animals might help us pay attention to God in a different way than if God hadn't included animals as much. (For example, Jesus rode a young donkey for his triumphal entry into Jerusalem, Noah used different kinds of birds to help him know when dry land would appear, and God came down and blessed Jesus in the form of a dove when Jesus was baptized.)



Choose a way you'll pay attention to God.

• Take a walk, and ask God to help you pay attention to

him. Notice all the things around you that help you pay attention to God.

• Draw a picture of something amazing God has done for you or for someone you know. Hang up the picture as a reminder to pay attention to see what other amazing things God will do for you.

• Make your favorite snack with your mom or dad. Don't eat the snack right away. Every time you think about the snack, say a prayer to God. Remember that God wants you to pay attention to him.

Joshua had been an aide to Moses. Then Moses died, and God appointed Joshua to lead the Israelites into the land he had promised them long ago. God told Joshua, "I will give you every place where you set your foot." And God told Joshua to be strong and courageous—not to be terrified or discouraged—because God would be with him wherever he went. What a great promise!

Bible Point: God is with us.

Key Verse: "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" (Joshua 1:9).



Get some watercolor paints, white crayons, and white paper. Sit down with your family and use

the white crayons to write or draw things on your papers that help you understand the ways God is with you. Discuss the ways that the white crayon on the white paper can feel similar to God being with you.

Then talk together about the things that most help you realize that God is with you as you create a watercolor painting to go over the white crayon pictures. The words or drawings you made with the white crayon will stay white. Talk about how God being with you is like what happened to your papers. Hang your pictures on your fridge for the week, and remind each other that God is with you even though you can't see him.

Choose a way you can remember God is with you.

• Write "God is with me" on a sticky note. Stick it to the inside of your backpack and take it to school with you. When you see it throughout the day, remember that God is always with you.

- Make a sign that says "God is with me," and hang it on your bedroom door. When you see it, thank God for being with you everywhere you go.
- Stand up for someone who's being treated unfairly. Thank God for being with you as you did something that was strong and courageous.



Joshua was getting ready to lead the Israelites into the Promised Land. He decided to send two spies ahead to check out the area—especially Jericho. The two spies went to the house of a woman named Rahab, who lived in the wall that surrounded the city. (Obviously, the walls were very thick!) Anyway, the king of Jericho sent soldiers to Rahab who said that they knew Israelite spies had come to her house. Although Rahab told the soldiers that the men had left, she really had hidden them up on her roof. After the soldiers left, Rahab told the spies she knew that God had given the land to the Israelites. She asked them to spare her family when they came to take the city. Then she used a rope to lower them out of her window to escape. The spies said that if Rahab would hang a scarlet cord in her window when they came back, the Israelites would save her and her family.

Bible Point: We can have faith that God will do big things in our lives. **Key Verse:** "And without faith it is impossible to please God" (Hebrews 11:6).



The big day had finally arrived! It was time for Joshua to lead the Israelites across the Jordan River and into the land God had promised to them. The river was at flood stage, but God had a plan. When the priests carried the Ark of the Covenant to the river, God stopped the waters and the priests stood in the middle of a dry riverbed! The Israelites crossed over on dry land to the Promised Land.

Then God told Joshua to choose 12 men (one from each tribe of Israel) to each pick up a stone from the middle of the river and to use the stones to make a monument in the new land. The monument would remind everyone of what God had done for the Israelites that day.

Bible Point: Remember what God has done.

Key Verse: "Give thanks to the Lord, call on his name; make known among the nations what he has done" (1 Chronicles 16:8).

Sit down with your family, and together look at old photo albums. Recall your favorite family celebrations and trips, and talk about what made them special. Talk about the friends and relatives you remember while looking at the pictures. Then go back through the albums, and talk about how God has blessed your family through the years. Discuss how God has guided your family, helping you through hard times and blessing you with good times. Close with a family prayer in which each of you thanks God for one specific thing he has done.



After marching around the city each day, they went back to their camp to rest. The people inside the city probably thought they were crazy! On the seventh day, the Israelites marched around the walls of Jericho seven times. After the seventh time, the trumpets sounded one long blast, and the people shouted. Then the walls collapsed! The strong and sturdy walls surrounding the city of Jericho crumbled to the ground! The Israelites charged in and took control of the city. God gave the Israelites victory over Jericho. Maybe it wasn't such a crazy plan after all!

Bible Point: God's power works for good.

Key Verse: "Humbe yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you" (I Peter 5:6-7).



FAMiLYFUN Walls of Jericho

Gather together graham crackers, marshmallow creme, and chocolate bars. As a family, build the walls of Jericho using these food

items. Talk about some of the "walls" that divide families. For example, walls are built up in the family when family members stay angry with one another instead of resolving a conflict. Name-calling also builds up walls among family members. When the wall has been built, talk about the Bible passage or have someone read Joshua 6:12-16, 20.

Remind everyone that even the toughest walls will crumble when God uses his power. Have everyone say one way that God is powerful. As they give their answers, family members each may take off part of the wall and eat it! Do this until the wall is gone or you can't eat anymore!





Choose a way to help you remember that God's power works for good in your life.

- Every time you worry about something, write it down on a piece of paper. Then throw it away, asking God to take that worry away.
- Whenever you use a TV, microwave, or radio, thank God for all the ways he uses his power for good.
- Read the headlines of a news website that your parents trust. Pray for the situations that you read about. Ask God to use his power for good in each of those situations.




