The Israelites Cross the Red Sea Exodus 13:17–14:31

Voung children are just becoming aware of their feelings. They need help finding the language to describe their emotions. When you recognize a feeling that a child is experiencing, name it. You might say, "I see that Josh is feeling happy!" or "Oh, Katie! I see you're feeling sad." Help children look to God by turning these acknowledgments into prayers. For example, you could pray, "Thank you, God, for Josh's happy feelings" or "Dear God, help Katie as she's feeling sad." By doing this, you're helping them learn to express their feelings to God as they grow in their relationship with him.

The Israelites Cross the Red Sea

Exodus 13:17-14:31



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

God Cares for His People

As the mass of more than 2 million Hebrews left Egypt, God knew that facing the warlike Philistines immediately would likely have made the Hebrews lose hope and turn back to Egypt. The pillar of cloud by day and pillar of fire by night must have been awesome and comforting.

God's Unusual Strategy

God instructed the Israelites to turn back somewhat toward Egypt and camp at a spot between Migdol and the Red Sea. God had a bigger plan than anyone else could know. Pharaoh would've been confident that he could easily defeat the Israelites.

The Israelites were slaves of the Egyptians only days prior to this event. They'd been beaten by the whips of the slave drivers and were familiar with the weapons the Egyptians carried. They must've realized that their fighting talents were nothing compared with the Egyptians'. And they were backed against the sea, with mountains on two sides and the Egyptians bearing down on them. The situation must've seemed hopeless.

God Shows His Power

We can realize that God had all this planned. He knew that the people would be frightened. He knew that they would doubt him. But he also knew that his power would be remembered forever. God knew that he would prevail, that the Hebrews would be saved from Pharaoh, and that the result would be a people growing greatly in their faith in him.

It may seem odd that no record of this event has been found in Egyptian history. However, it's likely that all records were wiped from the books because it would've been an embarrassment for the world to know that mighty Egypt had been devastated by its own lowly slaves.

The Jesus Connection

We live in troubled times when it's easy for people to lose heart and feel hopeless and lost. But a relationship with Jesus can give us peace and joy. Jesus is our light in dark times.

When have you felt out of sorts and desperate to find some control over your situation? Perhaps the Israelites felt these things after they escaped from Egypt. Although they may not have recognized it at the time, eventually they were able to look back and see how God used that time to protect them and bring glory to himself.

What part of your life might God have his hand in

now? What can you do to connect with God during times of fear and desperation? Take a few minutes to reflect on God's hand in your life. Write your reflection here.



Hidden Moses

What You'll Do

Set a baby on the floor near you.

Say: Where's Moses? Pause. He's under the blanket. Is he afraid under there? Pause. Then lift the blanket, and peek at Moses. Have Moses say, "I was afraid, but God helped me."

Put the blanket over baby's head. Say: [Baby's name], are you afraid under there? God is always with us, and ▶GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID. Sneak the Moses puppet under the blanket, and say: Brave Moses! Brave baby! ▶GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID.

Running From Egypt

What You'll Do

Sit on the floor with one or two toddlers. Open your Bible to Exodus 13, and show toddlers the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book. Hold up the Moses puppet.

Fall Quarter

Say: The Bible tells about a man named Moses. Moses and his people were running away from Egypt. Let's make the sound of people running. Show toddlers how to pat their hands on their legs. Moses and his people ran until they came to some water. Splish, splash, splash. Show toddlers how to slap the floor with open hands. The people were afraid. They didn't know how to get across the water. But we know that

GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID.



Show toddlers the teaching picture. Put the Moses puppet through the slit, and make him walk on dry land.

Say: God made some dry land to walk on. Listen to the sound of the dry sand. Rub your palms together, encouraging the toddlers to copy the motion. Off Moses and his friends went. Hooray! They walked to the other side. Then the water filled the sea again. Clap your hands together. God helped the people when they were afraid.

• GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID, too. Thank you, God!

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Flee Through the Sea

What You'll Do

Set one or two toddlers next to the blanket tunnel. Say: **Moses and his people had to go from one place to another really fast.** Encourage children to see how quickly they can crawl through the tunnel. Some may not like the dark inside the tunnel and may resist crawling through.

Say: God helped Moses when he was afraid. ► GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID, too.

Give each child a big hug when he or she makes it through the tunnel. Many children will want to repeat this experience several times.

In God's Hands

What You'll Do

Have everyone sit on the floor, and enjoy this finger play with toddlers. Encourage toddlers to repeat the motions after you.

Say: Many, many Israelites tromping through the sand, (rock from side to side, and slap your palms against the floor as you go from one side to the other)

One stepped out and touched wet land. Splash! (bring arms to chest; then push arms out on the word "splash")

Through the Water

What You'll Do

Lay the "Israelites Cross the Red Sea" poster on the floor, and let children look at it while you tell about the Israelites crossing the Red Sea.

Open your Bible to Exodus 13, and show children the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book. Say: **Show me what you do when you're afraid.** Let the twos share. **Show me your scared face.** Pause.

Say: There was a man named Moses who was the leader of God's people. Point out Moses on the poster. The Israelites were running away from Egypt. Let's stand up and run in place. Lift your legs and run fast! Continue telling what happened as twos run in place. The Israelites came to some water. Then they stopped. After twos have run in place for about 30 seconds, spray some water in the air above them, letting it fall on them. Encourage them to stop when they feel the water. Then point to the waves in the poster. The waves were big. There was too much water to walk through. There was too much water to swim across. Allow each child to spray water on the Israelites in the poster. The Israelites didn't know what to do. They were afraid.

Let's pretend that you're the Israelites. I'll be Moses. Follow me wherever I go.

March around the room. Encourage the children to follow you. Lead them back to where

you started. Then point out Moses on the poster, and say: God led Moses, and Moses led his people, just as I led you. God knew the people were afraid, so God helped them. He made dry land for them to walk on, while the water stood high all around them. Walk around the group of children, spraying the water bottle away from them. God helped the people stay safe. God helped the Israelites when they were afraid. ► GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID, too.

Red Sea Walk

What You'll Do

Form two groups of 2-year-olds. One group will be the Israelites; the other will be the Red Sea. Have the Red Sea group stand in two lines facing each other. Give the children in the Red Sea group each a crepe paper streamer to hold up high and shake while the Israelites are walking through.

Sing "Red Sea Walk" to the tune of "Ring Around the Rosie" while children are walking through the "Red Sea." Have the Red Sea group fall down after the "Israelites" have walked through. If necessary, sing the song twice to give time for all the Israelites to walk through the "Red Sea."

Walking through the Red Sea,

The Israelites are home free! Splashes, splashes,

The sea falls down!

Have the groups change roles, and do the activity and song again.

Afterward, say: God helped the Israelites when they were afraid. ▶ GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID, too.



Pray with children about their fears. Children this age are relatively new to praying aloud in a group. You may need to word the prayers for them. For example, you could say, "God, Susie is afraid when her mom leaves her at preschool. Please help her not be afraid." Then say to the child, "You can pray, too. Say, 'I'm afraid; please help me.' " Allow time for the child to pray.



After all the children have had an opportunity to pray with you, give each a copy of the "Moses Crosses the Red Sea" page. Squirt about a nickel-sized dot of glue on the dry land part of each child's handout, and show children how to use cotton swabs to spread the glue on the path through the parted Red Sea. Have children sprinkle glitter onto the glue to help them remember the dry land the Israelites walked on.

Say: The Israelites were afraid when they couldn't get across the water. God helped the Israelites by giving them dry land. ▶ GOD HELPS US WHEN WE'RE AFRAID, too.

A newborn's response to a loud noise or sudden shift in position is known as the startle reflex. While pediatricians tell us it's simply a reflex response, sometime between their fourth and sixth months, many children begin to develop specific fears. Depending on the child, he or she will deal with these fears differently, but you can help. In addition to praying with your child, show your child how to handle the thing that's causing him or her to be afraid. For example, if your child is afraid of a family pet, talk through the steps you take in approaching the animal.



Your child learned God helps us when we're afraid (from Exodus 13:17–14:31). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

Drops of Water

Lay a plastic tablecloth on the floor. Spray some drops of water onto the tablecloth, and encourage your child to explore the drops of water.

Say: Moses and his people couldn't get across the water. They were afraid. But God helped them. God helps us when we're afraid, too.

TODDLER

Flee Through the Sea

Drape a blanket over two chairs to create a tunnel for your toddler to crawl through. Tell your child that Moses and his people had to go from one place to another really fast. Encourage your child to see how quickly he or she can crawl through the tunnel.

Say: God helped Moses when he was afraid. God helps us when we're afraid, too.

2-YEAR-OLD

Fear Prayers

Sit down with your child. Say: I was afraid of [name something you were afraid of], but God helped me. God helps us when we're afraid. Ask your child about things he or she is afraid of.

Pray for your child about his or her fears. Then say to your child: You can pray, too. Say, "I'm afraid; please help me." Allow time for your child to pray.

Say: The Israelites were afraid when they couldn't get across the water. God helped the Israelites by giving them dry land. God helps us when we're afraid, too.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

While your child is taking a bath, tell about Moses crossing the Red Sea and how God helped Moses when Moses was afraid. Have your child try to separate the water, and talk about the miracle God performed that day.

Play a game of Hide-and-Seek. When your child comes near your hiding place, jump out and say, "Hey, you!" After a good laugh, tell your child that you're proud of how brave he or she is becoming with God's help.



God Sends Quail and Manna

Exodus 16:1-26



The People Become Hungry in the Wilderness

Approximately 30 days had passed since the Hebrew people left Egypt. Apparently the food they had brought with them had run out, and they began complaining. How quickly they had forgotten the oppression of the Egyptians! The people were just starting to get to know God, and they had very little framework to realize God would provide for them. This event marks a learning point for the Israelites.

God's Glory Shown to the People

We don't know exactly what "the glory of the Lord" was that the Israelites saw in the morning, but it was a visible sign to them (perhaps like the cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night mentioned in Exodus 13). God wanted Israel to know that he was still there, that he was aware of their need, and that he was going to provide for them.

God Provides for the People

When the manna appeared the first morning, the Hebrews' question "What is it?" apparently caught on as its name because manna means "What is it?" Though some have suggested various possibilities for what manna was, nothing we know of today is a good match for the description given in Exodus 16:31: "It was white like coriander seed and tasted like wafers made with honey."

The miraculous nature of manna is further exhibited in what happened to it over the course of a Sabbath as opposed to a weekday. The Israelites were not to work on the Sabbath but to keep it as a day for worship. Gathering manna on the Sabbath would have been work, so God simply didn't make it appear. If anyone tried to keep manna from one weekday to the next, it would spoil. However, if anyone kept it

from the morning before the Sabbath, it would stay good through the Sabbath.

The Jesus Connection

God is our provider. Everything we have is from God, and he has provided a way for us to have a relationship with him through Jesus.

What do you find yourself wanting more than anything? How often do you view this desire as a need? It's important to recognize the difference. God allowed the Hebrews to live as slaves for many years. When God decided they needed to leave Egypt, he provided the miraculous opportunity to do so.

Our greatest need is to honor and glorify God. Regardless of our wants, we're fulfilled when living in God's will. Write a prayer here to glorify God for giving you what you need.

God Provides Quail

What You'll Do

Gather one or two toddlers together. Place the feather and round crackers behind your back. Open your Bible to Exodus 16:1-26, and point to the words.

Say: The Bible tells of a time the Israelites were very hungry. Slightly bend over, and hold your tummy while you talk. They walked a long way in the hot, dry desert. They didn't stop to eat. Some of them were so hungry that they began crying. Trace imaginary tears down your cheeks.

Say: Moses prayed to God, "The people are hungry, God." God heard Moses and gave the people food. God sent yummy quail to eat for dinner. Pull out the feather. This feather is from a bird like a quail. The Israelites had to catch the birds. Can you catch this feather? Drop the feather, giving each child a chance to catch it.

Say: God also sent the Israelites food to eat for breakfast and lunch. The food might have tasted like these yummy crackers. Would you like to taste a cracker? Let each child have a cracker. These crackers remind us that ▶ GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED, too. Thank you, God!

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Feed the Birds

What You'll Do

Say: God provided the food the Israelites needed. God provides what we need, too. Let's make bird feeders that'll provide for the birds' needs just as God provides for our needs.

Give each child a cardboard circle on a sheet of wax paper. Spread one side of the cardboard circles with nontoxic glue. Help children stick bread cubes onto the glue. Watch carefully that bread cubes covered with glue don't go into toddlers' mouths. As they work, play the song "He Cares for You" (1 Peter 5:7) (track 4 on the CD) in the background.

When a toddler is finished, put his or her name on the completed bird feeder, and set it aside for the glue to dry. Wash and dry each child's hands. Remind toddlers that **GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED.**

Say: Today we're learning about how the Israelites wandered in the desert. The desert was different from their old home in Egypt. Nothing grew there...no lettuce, apples, bananas, or other good food. The Israelites were running out of the food they carried with them. They were hungry. Let's pretend we're hungry. Have children imitate you by holding their tummies and saying, "I'm hungry." Some of the children were so hungry that they even cried. Let's pretend to cry from hunger. Have children pretend to cry and wipe tears from their eyes.

Say: Moses heard the children crying. He asked God for food. God heard Moses' prayer and answered by sending birds called quail. The quail landed on the ground around the Israelites. Shine a flashlight on the floor near the children. Pretend there's quail landing near you! Try to catch the quail so you can eat it for dinner. Encourage each child to "catch" the beam of light before you move on to another child. God provided quail for the Israelites to eat.

God also gave the Israelites food called manna to gather off the ground each day. The manna tasted a little like our crackers. Hold up one cracker for the children to see. Each day the Israelites gathered manna to feed their families. Would you like to gather some pretend manna? Point out the crackers on the paper towels. Tell children they can gather two crackers each. Before we eat our crackers, let's thank God and remember that ▶ GOD GIVES US WHAT WE NEED. When I count to three, we'll say, "Thank you, God." One, two, three...Thank you, God.

God Provides Water

Exodus 17:1-7



Food and Whine

As we begin today's lesson, we find the Israelites continuing their journey toward the Promised Land. They're still getting manna every morning and quail every evening, but they can't find water at their latest campsite. It's important to take a moment to recall that the Israelites were just beginning to know God. This is the first time God had interacted with the Israelite community as a whole. Though this doesn't excuse their actions, it might give some context for us to see ourselves in more clearly.

Again, instead of calling in faith upon the God who had secured their freedom, turned bitter water sweet, and provided manna and quail, the people complained to Moses. Again, instead of trusting God, they lamented that they were going to die in the desert for lack of water. As you can see from Exodus 17:4, Moses was exasperated. God, however, proves his patience and love in this passage, giving the Hebrews the water they needed in spite of their complaining and their lack of faith.

Acting on Faith

God had a plan. His instructions to Moses must have seemed ludicrous! Moses was to take with him the leaders of the people—likely representatives from each tribe—so that they could see firsthand what God was going to do. In front of these leaders, Moses was to hit with his staff a rock that God would point out to him. And enough water would come out of the rock to take care of the needs of 2 million people. As unlikely as God's plan seemed, Moses didn't question God. He did what God told him to do, and God did what he said he would do. Moses and God gave a convincing demonstration of what acting on faith in God can do. And God was glorified when the leaders brought back their report.

Be Encouraged

The names Moses gave to the place where all this happened mean "temptation" and "murmuring." No doubt Moses' intent was to make this place a reminder of the people's unbelief but also an encouragement toward faith in the God who had provided for them.

The Jesus Connection

Think of someone who has frustrated you recently. What needs to happen to resolve the situation? A relationship with Jesus brings us forgiveness, not perfection. Pray for clarity and the opportunity to recognize when you need to extend the same type of grace and understanding that Jesus has given you. On the lines below, write a prayer for the person who has recently frustrated you.



Say: The Bible tells about Moses and the Israelites. Look at the Israelites' sad faces. Point to the picture. These people have been traveling in the desert with Moses. They can't find any water. They're grumbling or complaining. Show me how you grumble. Pause. Moses asked, "What am I supposed to do with these people?" God said, "I'll always love these people." God told Moses to hit a rock with his stick. Give each child a straw and a cup. Take the bag-covered jug to each child. Ask each child to hit the bag with his or her straw. As each child hits the bag, pour some water into his or her cup.

Say: That's what happened when Moses hit the rock with his stick. Enough water came out for all the Israelites to drink.

Turn the teaching picture over to show twos the people getting water. Say: Now the people are happy. Point to the picture. ▶ GOD ALWAYS LOVES US, even when we grumble. He takes care of our needs. Put your straws in your cups, and drink the water. Thank you, God, for giving the Israelites water and reminding us that you always love us.

Loving All the Time

Your child will learn about God's constant and unending love from your example. An adage reminds us that children need love the most when they deserve it the least. That includes the colicky baby and the cross 2-year-old.

Some parents worry that they'll spoil the infant who requires a great deal of comfort. Instead, studies show quick responses to early needs help a baby develop trust and self-reliance. In the long run, your early loving kindness will help develop a child who's less demanding than one who's unsure that his or her needs matter.

OK TO COPY our child learned God always loves us (from Exodus 17:1-7). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

hildren need boundaries to feel safe. However, in the search for independence, children are bound to push limits. When that happens, it's good to give children choices. God Gives the Ten Commandments

(Part 1) Exodus 19:16–20:21



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

This week's Bible Background concentrates on the events surrounding the giving of the Ten Commandments, while next week's concentrates on the commandments themselves. You may want to read both Bible Backgrounds before beginning this lesson.

The Israelites Battle the Amalekites

The Amalekites attacked the Israelites where they were camped. God had prepared the Israelites' faith for this test through his provision for them in so many ways. So the Israelites put together an army under the leadership of Joshua and went on the attack. Moses held high in the air the staff that had struck the rock to get water—"the staff of God." As long as Moses held the staff in the air, the Israelites continued to win—so Aaron and Hur helped hold Moses' hands up, and the Israelites defeated the Amalekites (Exodus 17:8-16).

Jethro Advises Moses to Focus on God

Moses' father-in-law, Jethro, came to visit after the battle with the Amalekites. Seeing Moses burdened with judging disagreements among the 2 million Israelites, Jethro gave Moses some good advice. He suggested that Moses appoint judges to serve the people so that Moses could concentrate on what was most important—being the people's representative before God. Moses took the advice and then led the Israelites on to Mount Sinai, where Moses had previously met God in the burning bush. They arrived at Mount Sinai three months to the day from when they left Egypt (Exodus 18:5–19:2).

Moses Receives the Commandments From God

A significant event is recorded in the next few verses (Exodus 19:3-9): God spoke to Moses and promised

him that Israel would be his treasured possession, his holy people—if they would obey him. After Moses told the people what God had said, they responded gratefully: "We will do everything the Lord has said." God responded by telling Moses that God himself would come down and speak with the Israelites from a cloud.

The law God gave spelled out how the Israelites were to honor him through their obedience. In the thousands of years that have passed since this event, one thing hasn't changed: The best way we can honor God is by obeying him.

The Jesus Connection

Following Jesus is not about obeying rules; it's about knowing him. However, our obedience in honoring and glorifying God in our everyday lives allows our relationship with Jesus to grow.

Establishing Early Rules

As you teach young children about rules, let them know rules are designed to keep us safe and happy. Having too many rules often makes children insecure about when they're going to step over the line. Having too few (or unenforced) rules causes a child to feel adrift rather than connected to an important support system. So it's wise to have just enough rules to keep track of-just as God gave the Ten Commandments.

For now, make sure the rules are simple and memorable. For example, "Obey and be kind."



God Gives the Ten Commandments

(Part 2) Exodus 19:16-20:21



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Last week's Bible Background concentrated on the events surrounding the giving of the Ten Commandments, while this week's concentrates on the commandments themselves. If you haven't already done so, you may want to read both of them before beginning this lesson.

Commandments With a Purpose

These commandments weren't given to force the Israelites to follow an arbitrary set of rules. These commands were intended to help the people live their lives to the fullest in relationship with one another.

With the death and resurrection of Jesus, we live no longer under the law but under grace. Jesus said he came to fulfill the law (Matthew 5:17-18). Certainly we are not bound to follow these laws to try to win God's favor, but the principles behind the Ten Commandments are valid principles for all time.

Commandments in Two Categories

Over the centuries, scholars have divided the commandments into categories in varying ways. For the purpose of these studies, we're dividing them into two sections. The first four commandments have to do with our relationship with God; the last six have to do with our relationships with others.

God's Commandments Establish Priorities

•••••

The commandments regarding our relationship with God clearly spell out the priority and honor that he is to hold in our lives. How often—even in the Christian community—do we let other things come before our relationship with God?

One commandment that is often taken too lightly, especially in today's culture, is the instruction not

to misuse God's name. To use it in swearing or frivolously in joking is not appropriate. How we use God's name directly reflects how we feel about God. He and his name are worthy of all the honor we can muster!

The commandments regarding our relationships with others (Exodus 20:12-17) give us lots of guidance on how to respect others. Though even our Christian culture can fail to take many of these commands seriously, living by them gives people the honor and respect due them as unique creations of God. No matter what we see around us, we must hold true to these principles if we are to honor God and respect others the way God intends.

The Jesus Connection

As our relationship with Jesus grows, we can begin to see this world and other people through his eyes of unconditional love. We will enjoy fellowship more—and others will see Jesus' presence in our lives.

God wants us to alter our lives to reflect our Savior who loves us enough to die for us. It's easy to get distracted, even by good things, and we can get caught up trying to be like other Christians more than we try to be like Jesus himself.

God loves his creation so much that he gave us commandments to help preserve it and glorify him. God's greatest creation is humanity—and we are surrounded by it. Every person you have contact with today gives you an opportunity to glorify God by lifting up his greatest creation—people. At the end of the day, take note of who God blessed through you and how you were blessed in his service. You can write your prayer in the space below.

Empathy and Behavior

While children are very focused on themselves in the early years, parents can encourage empathy that leads to kind behavior.
Remember that you're shaping your little one for adulthood.
Here are some tips for encouraging empathy and kind behavior:

- Take note of how things make your child feel. Find ways to help your child see when others might feel the same way.
- Find ways to help your child understand how his or her actions make you feel and why.
- Find ways to help your child understand how his or her actions affect others.



Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

Each time you catch your child treating others kindly, put a chocolate chip in a see-through container. When you accumulate enough chips, bake cookies together. Invite some friends over to play, with the purpose of practicing kindness with friends.

The Israelites Worship a Golden Calf

Exodus 32:1-25



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Out of Sight

Moses was up on the mountain for a long time receiving all the laws from God—almost six weeks (Exodus 24:18)! It's likely that the Israelites feared Moses had perished on the mountain. Since he had been their main contact with God, they may have reasoned that they had lost contact with God, too.

The Hebrews spent more than 400 years seeing "gods" in Egypt, and now they'd been asked to serve and follow a God they couldn't see. For the majority of the time they'd known God, he'd had personal relationships with individuals among them. They may not have realized God was interested in each of them individually and as an entire community.

They'd been camped in the same place for six weeks and were likely getting anxious to move on. They couldn't even see God's representative, so they fell back on what they were familiar with and asked for a god they could see who would continue to lead them.

What Was Aaron Thinking?

Aaron's willingness to go along suggests that he, too, had some doubt about Moses' return. However, some believe that Aaron's request for gold earrings was an attempt to avert the people's desire for a god. If they realized they had to give up things of value, they might decide they didn't really want a golden god after all. If that was Aaron's intent, his attempt failed.

After making the idol, Aaron's proclamation was that there'd be a "festival to the Lord." The name translated Lord (Yahweh) is the name by which God had announced himself to Moses at the burning bush. Apparently, Aaron thought that this idol could somehow represent the true God. Regardless of his motives, Aaron was wrong in making the idol. He led the people in disobeying God's second commandment (Exodus 20:4).

In talking to Moses, Aaron tried to make it seem as if he had no choice and that the fire itself had mysteriously shaped the calf. God's sparing of Aaron in this situation was certainly an example of his mercy and grace.

The Jesus Connection

We are surrounded by things that promise to bring us immediate pleasure and satisfaction. Many of these promises are deceitful, leading to destruction. But even God's blessings themselves can distract us from our true calling of worshipping God. Jesus came to offer the only thing that's truly worth having. Take a moment to write a prayer revealing your heart's desire to follow God and asking for his help in dislodging some things that might be stealing your worship away from God.

Hold up a yellow dot sticker from the sticker sheet for a baby to see. Help baby feel the sticky back and smooth front of the sticker. Guide baby in putting the sticker on the calf in the teaching picture.

Say: In the Bible, the Israelites made a golden calf. The people liked the golden calf and thought it was special. But God said, "No golden idols!" Moses crushed the calf and threw it away. Show baby how to crumple the paper. Then let him or her crumple it. Moses got rid of the calf because nothing else is special like God. God is the only God. We should WORSHIP ONLY GOD.

Then have that child hand the star to another child and repeat the words you just said. Help the child if he or she forgets some of the words, or say the words with preverbal twos. Make sure each child has a turn receiving the star and passing the star to someone else.



Concrete Representations

Young children often develop a fascination with men with beards or a special attachment to a picture of Jesus as they try to figure out who God is. They simply need a concrete representation of the one we talk so much about. Pictures help children understand that God is real in the same way that photographs help them keep in touch with distant relatives. If your child doesn't have a picture of Jesus, consider hanging one in his or her room.





The Israelites Build the Tabernacle

Exodus 35:4-36:38



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

Generous Offerings

It was time for the Israelites to build a portable dwelling place for the worship of God. When Moses asked for contributions, the people gave generously. Apparently the events of the previous months inspired them to give to God. They may have realized how they had wronged God in worshipping the golden calf and wanted to do what they could to make amends for the damage done. They gave so generously that eventually they had to be told to stop bringing more materials (Exodus 36:6-7)!

One might wonder where these former slaves got gold and fine cloth to donate to the Tabernacle. The answer lies in the generosity of the Egyptians as the Israelites were escaping. God told the Hebrews to ask for things from the Egyptians; the Egyptians responded with silver, gold, and clothing (Exodus 12:35-36).

Talented Workers

Not only did the Hebrews give things, but they gave time and talents as well. This passage singles out Bezalel and Oholiab as the leaders of the workers and also mentions women skilled in spinning goat hair (Exodus 35:26) and other skilled and willing people (Exodus 36:2).

Willing Worship

What can we learn from this event? Serving God involves all kinds of different tasks and abilities. If you can't build a structure, maybe you can spin cloth. If you can't sing, maybe you can tell a co-worker about Jesus. Each one of us has God-given abilities and spiritual gifts. God wants us to use what he's given us to serve and honor him in whatever ways we can. God can use anyone to serve him and to further his kingdom here on earth. The only thing stopping our service to him is ourselves.

The Jesus Connection

Our relationship with Jesus gives us daily opportunities to serve him. He is our friend, our Creator, and our Savior. Service is a choice we make on a daily basis. But how often do you analyze your motives for serving? Wrong motives can rob us of blessings and limit our effectiveness in service.

For the Christian, service comes out of thankfulness for salvation and devotion to honor our Creator. If we are not serving for those reasons, perhaps we're really self-serving. Write a prayer here asking God to refine and hone your heart as you serve today and each day going forward.

Moses Sends Spies Into the Promised Land Numbers 13:1-14:23

A tabout 6 months of age, babies begin to learn that things they can't see still exist. This is called object permanence. This new understanding is what makes games like Peekaboo so delightful. The more interaction a child has with someone or something, the more likely he or she will be confident that when that person or thing goes away (Mom or Dad, perhaps) it will also come back. This helps children be brave. And mastering this concept is foundational to the spiritual understanding that God exists even though we can't see him. So as you tire of the repetition of some of the games, remember that you're helping children learn they can be brave because God is with them—always.

Moses Sends Spies Into the Promised Land Numbers 13:1-14:23



Your Mission, Should You Choose to Accept It...

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The spies were sent on an exploratory mission. The purpose was to see what kinds of opposition they'd be facing and if the land could support the Israelites as they conquered it. Moses' instructions were clear: They were to explore the land from the southern end all the way to the northern end.

Mission Impossible

When the spies first returned, they simply reported what Moses had asked for. They told of the fruitfulness of the land, the powerful people, and the fortified cities (Numbers 13:26-29). But after Caleb spoke his mind, the other spies went beyond what they had been asked to do. They began to lament that there was no way they could defeat the people in the land. They exaggerated the reports of the size and strength of the land's inhabitants. The people responded by once again rebelling against Moses and against God. Once again God threatened to strike down all the people and begin again with Moses. And once again Moses interceded for the faithless Israelites.

The Faith of a Mustard Seed

Moses pointed out that what the Egyptians had learned about God through their recent experience would be nullified if God allowed the Israelites to die in the desert. Moses wanted everyone, including the Egyptians, to see God's power.

God once again forgave the Israelites. But notice he imposed a harsh punishment: No adults who were alive during the rebellion—except Joshua and Caleb—would be allowed to enter the Promised Land. Joshua and Caleb had faith that God could do what he said he would. Their faith enabled them to

stand up for God, even when it was not the popular thing to do. Although their courage didn't convince anyone else to have faith, they were rewarded.

The Jesus Connection

Jesus Christ stood up for the world through his atoning sacrifice on the cross. Through our relationship with Christ, we can stand up for what we believe and who Jesus is.

Throughout history and all over the world, people have died because they professed a faith in Jesus Christ. While most of us do not experience persecution to this degree, non-Christians can be resentful of our claims to know the truth. These confrontations put Christians in a difficult situation.

Think about non-Christians you regularly come in

contact with. Are you the same person with them that you are in front of this Sunday school group you're teaching? On the lines below, write a prayer that you will stand up for Jesus in your interactions with non-Christians.

Give each child some grape jelly on a plastic spoon to taste. Have children throw their spoons in the trash can when they're done. Say: Joshua and I returned to Moses and said, "Let's go! There are yummy grapes and milk and honey." But the other 10 spies were afraid and said, "No way! Those grapes aren't the only giant thing! There are giant men there, too." But God said this land was promised to us. Joshua and I were brave and stood up for God. We remembered his promise to be with us. You can

BE BRAVE FOR GOD and stand up for him, too. Your teacher can help you tell the rest of what happened. Set the puppet aside.

Making Choices

When it comes to the choice of whether or not to obey you, the independent "no" of your toddler or 2-year-old is foundational for the "no" to peer pressure later in life-and the ability to stand up for God.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

Play Hide-and-Seek with your child, taking turns hiding and finding a favorite doll or toy. When your child finds the doll or toy, congratulate him or her on being a brave spy like Joshua and Caleb.

As your child makes good choices, affirm him or her by saying, "I like to see you be brave for God with good choices."

Longer attention spans will develop in the latter preschool and early elementary years. As much as possible, let your little ones dictate the flow of activity in your nursery. By letting them remain focused on an activity of their choosing, you're encouraging them to develop the attentiveness that's necessary for listening to God.

Balaam's Donkey Talks

Numbers 22:1-38



The Fortuneteller

This event takes place near the end of the Israelites' time of wandering in the desert. They had defeated a few adversaries in their travels and were approaching the Promised Land again. The leader of Moab was afraid of what Israel might do to his land, so he sought the help of Balaam.

Apparently Balaam was a widely known fortuneteller, or diviner, who made his living through his divination. He probably believed in many gods and would consult anyone, including the Lord, who could help him earn his fees.

A Wrong Motive

Even though Balaam called upon the Lord and spoke God's words to the people sent by Balak, Balaam's underlying motive was for selfish gain.

When God had told Balaam "no" the first time, Balaam should have taken that as a final answer. But when Balaam came back to God a second time, it was clear that Balaam's desire for financial gain was greater than his desire to do what God told him. In letting Balaam go but not letting him do anything that would please Balak, God was showing how he disliked Balaam's money-hungry attitude.

God let Balaam go with Balak's men, but God was angry because he knew that Balaam was acting from self-interest and greed.

A Talking Donkey?

Not being able to see the angel his donkey saw must have been a huge insult to Balaam, who prided himself on knowing and seeing spiritual things. Certainly Balaam was humiliated when the donkey had to speak in order to get him to see reality. Balaam

had been blinded by his desire for riches. God finally opened his eyes to the angel standing in the path and to the evil of what Balaam had been doing.

Speaking God's Words

After getting Balaam's attention through the donkey and the angel, God let Balaam know that he wanted Balaam to go through with his trip but to speak only what God said. This whole event was intended to help Balaam think clearly and to know that he had to do what God told him.

The Jesus Connection

God is always doing things in us and through us, but we can sometimes forget that and stop paying attention to him. When we let our focus stay on God, we can be used more easily by him. Write the most recent thing you can remember that helped you see God at work. Ask God to help you pay attention to him in the big and small things in your life. You can write your prayer on the lines below.



Building Attention Skills

The technology of our time seems to cause us to rush through life at an ever-quickening pace. As a result, we rarely pay attention to any one task for very long. Paying attention is the single most important skill our children need for learning. Just as God had to get Balaam's attention before he could speak to him, we must get our children's attention before we can teach them anything of lasting value. Help your child pay attention by playing simple games that require him or her to concentrate, such as Simon Says or a memory card game.

Joshua Becomes Leader of Israel

Joshua 1:1-11



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

God With You

As we begin this passage, Moses had died and Joshua had taken over the leadership of the Israelites, as had been arranged in advance (Deuteronomy 31:1-8). Joshua 1:5 tells us that God was going to be with Joshua in the same way he had been with Moses.

God at Work Through You

The question may arise: Why was it okay for the Israelites to kill other people and take away their land? This is a complicated question. However, one point seems apparent: God was using Israel to judge the immoral people who lived in the land at the time. Just as Israel was later defeated and their land taken away because of sin, so God was using Israel as an instrument of punishment, taking away the land of the Canaanites because of their sin.

God's Plan for You

In this passage God gave Joshua a command of encouragement ("Be strong and courageous"), a condition for success ("obey all the law my servant Moses gave you"), and a promise of his presence ("the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go"). God had a plan for Israel, and Joshua was the instrument through which he was going to accomplish that plan.

God Goes Before You

What more could Joshua ask for? All he had to do was follow what God laid out for him, and God would be there to assure his success. However unsure or discouraged Joshua might have been at the death of Moses, this visit from God rejuvenated him. The first thing recorded after God's message to him is

Joshua's ordering the leaders to get the people ready to cross the Jordan. The Israelites were ready to move into the Promised Land, and God was going to give them the land.

The Jesus Connection

Our plans and God's plans don't always match. We want to be happy now; God wants to give us greater joy as we surrender our lives to his service. When we commit our lives to Christ, he uses us to accomplish his mission. God promises the same thing to us that he promised to Joshua: He'll be with us all the time. On the lines below, write a prayer about one area of your life in which you need to know God is with you.

Open your Bible to Joshua 1:1-11, and show toddlers the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: The Bible says God's people followed Joshua long ago. Show toddlers the Joshua paper doll. Joshua was their leader. But he didn't lead the people by himself. God was with Joshua, so God's people listened to Joshua, the way you listened to my whistle. Blow the whistle again, and remind toddlers to put their hands on their heads. Just as God was with Joshua, GOD IS WITH US, too.

Big Ball Bop

What You'll Do

Encourage a toddler to try to hit the inflatable ball while standing under it. Then encourage him or her to lie down and try to kick it. After the toddler makes several attempts, ask if he or she would like your help to reach the ball. Then lift the child.

Say: Because I'm with you, I can help you reach the ball! ► GOD IS WITH US and helps us with things that are too hard for us to do alone, the way I'm helping you reach the ball.

Say: ▶ GOD IS WITH US and helps us do what he asks us to do. God was with Joshua and helped him lead God's people, the way I was with you and helped you go through the obstacle course.

I'm going to lead you in a game using the whistle. When I blow the whistle, look at me and do what I do. I'll change my actions each time the whistle blows. Watch and listen very carefully.

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Blow the whistle, and begin patting your head with your hands. Encourage children to join you. Blow the whistle again, and clap your hands in a steady rhythm. Once children have joined you in clapping, blow the whistle again, and pat your knees. To end the game, blow the whistle one more time, and sit quietly with your hands in your lap.

Say: You followed me as I led you. You're such good listeners! Open your Bible to Joshua 1:1-11, and show children the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book. Say: The Bible says God's people learned to follow Moses. Then they had to learn to follow their new leader, Joshua. Hold up the Joshua paper doll. God chose Joshua to lead the Israelites into the Promised Land. Many Israelites were scared because there were giants in the land. Have a 2-year-old come and stand next to the Joshua paper doll. You look like a giant compared to this Joshua paper doll. Giants can be big and scary! But Joshua wasn't afraid. One at a time, allow children to stand by the paper doll. Joshua knew God was with him and would help him with the giants and everything else.

Help With My Day

What You'll Do

Call one or two 2-year-olds to play this game.

Say: God was with Joshua and helped him every day. Here are some cards that show parts of your day. Take the cards out of one of the envelopes, and spread the cards faceup in front of a child. Talk about the pictures; then mix them up. Help the child decide which picture goes first, second, and last. Quickly move through the cards, helping the child lay out the correct sequence. When he or she is finished, say: You did a good job playing this game. Each of these pictures reminds us that FGOD IS WITH US and helps us all day long.

Let children put the cards back in the envelopes. They can remove the cards and continue to play the game on their own or color the cards if they wish.

Helping Hands

What You'll Do

Have children clean their hands before this activity. Give each child a non-latex plastic glove to put on. Most children will need help getting their fingers in the right holes.

Say: ▶ GOD IS WITH US and gives us a helping hand. Sometimes he helps us use our helping hands to help others. God is with us and helps us do what he asks us to do—just as God was with Joshua and helped Joshua.

After all the children have a glove on one hand, help them use the gloved hand to fill another glove with cereal from the bowl. Tape the filled gloves closed. You may need to prompt children if they can't remember all the words to say. Have children take home the snack they received to eat later, or if there's time, you could let them eat part of their snack now.

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Growing With Jesus



Navigating Independence

Soon after your child learns to talk, you'll hear the famous words "I want to do it." Remind your child that you're there and offer help, but wait to be asked before you step in. Sometimes you can trade a favor with a child who needs your assistance. For example, as you dress, let your child put a piece of jewelry or a shoe on you; then encourage your child to let you fasten the snap on his or her pants in return. Your willingness to accept his or her help sets the stage for him or her to do the same. That, in turn, can set the stage for your child's willingness to accept God's help as well.



Your child learned God is with us (from Joshua 1:1-11). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

God's Help Baby-Bouncer

Play this game with your baby:

Say: **God's with the little wiggle worm.** (gently move your baby side to side)

God helps the tall giraffe. (lift your baby high)

God's with the swinging monkey. (hold your baby underneath arms, and gently swing his or her torso)

And God helps [your baby's name] laugh! (set your baby on your lap, and gently tickle his or her tummy)

When you're finished, give your baby a hug.

Say: Just as God is with the animals and helps them, God is with us and helps us, too.

TODDLER

Big Ball Bop

Blow up a large inflatable ball. Hang the ball from a door frame or the ceiling by tying a piece of yarn through the loop on the nozzle and letting the ball dangle about 2½ feet above your toddler. Use tape to secure the yarn to the door frame or ceiling.

Encourage your toddler to try to hit the ball while standing under it. Then encourage him or her to lie down and try to kick it. After your toddler makes several attempts, ask if he or she would like your help to reach the ball. Then lift your child up, and let him or her give the ball a big bop.

Say: Because I'm with you, I can help you reach the ball! God is with us and helps us with things that are too hard for us to do alone, too.

2-YEAR-OLD

Helping Hands

Help your child wash his or her hands. Give your child a disposable plastic glove to put on.

Say: God is with us and gives us a helping hand. Sometimes he helps us use our helping hands to help others. God is with us and helps us do what he asks us to do—just as God was with Joshua and helped Joshua.

Help your child use the gloved hand to fill another glove with cereal. Tape the filled glove closed. Encourage your child to give the glove filled with cereal to someone and to tell that person that God is with us and he gives us a helping hand.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

Provide opportunities for your child to master a new challenge or skill, such as putting on a sock or adding another block to make a bigger wall. Express delight in helping your child, and remind your child that God is with us and likes to help us, too.


As you read to your child about the people and events in the Bible, point out how God was with the people in the Bible. This is one small way children learn that God's nature is unchanging.

Joshua Sends Spies to Jericho

Joshua 2:1-24



A Different Method

As Joshua prepared to send spies into the Promised Land, no doubt he remembered the fiasco of 40 years earlier when Moses sent a large group of spies into the land. This time Joshua sent only two and gave them a very specific mission: Investigate Jericho. He sent them "secretly," not wanting the Canaanites to know what they were doing and probably also to protect the Israelites from the distressful result of the first spy mission.

Good Gossip

It may seem suspicious that the place the spies went was to the home of a prostitute. However, it's likely that this was a place where gossip would abound. In addition, the word most often translated "prostitute" can just as accurately be translated "innkeeper." Either way, it was a place where the spies were able to hear and gauge how the people of Jericho felt about the Israelites who were camped just across the Jordan River.

A Woman of Faith

Rahab, though she lied about hiding the spies in her house, had apparently become a believer in God through what she had heard about the Israelites' experiences and conquests. She hid the men at great personal risk. She was commended for her strong faith in the New Testament in Hebrews 11:31. Note that God did not commend her for lying but for acting in faith and hiding the spies. God blessed her for that faith.

The end of this event lies beyond the scope of today's passage. During the victory over Jericho, Rahab and her family were indeed spared from death (Joshua 6:17). Moreover, the New Testament attests to her faithfulness and includes her in the line of King David and of Jesus (Matthew 1:5)!

The Jesus Connection

Rahab's faith landed her among Jesus' ancestors.
When we venture forth with a small act of faith, God
responds and shows us his much larger faithfulness.
In what areas of your life would you like to show
more faithfulness to God? What are some ways

The Window

What You'll Do

Give each child a "Rahab's Window" handout and a piece of string.

Say: Rahab believed in God. She helped the spies go out the window with a rope. Show children how to open their windows by folding back the flap in the window. Help each child tape one end of the string to the back of his or her handout so that the string can be dropped through the window. Then help children drop the strings through the windows. Rahab put a red rope in her window to remind people she believed in God. Give each child a red-ribbon strip. Have children repeat, "Believe in God" and wave their ribbons.

What You'll Do

Work with one 2-year-old at a time to make a special rope-bracelet reminder of Rahab's belief in God. Have a child hold the center of a 1-foot-long piece of red yarn. As the child holds the yarn, begin twisting the ends together.

Say: Rahab believed in God. She may have thought about God often. Then one day some other people who believed in God came to visit. They were spies. They needed a place to hide. She hid them because she believed in God. Continue twisting until the yarn is wound tight.

When it was time for the spies to leave, they said, "Take this red rope (show the child the rope that's been created), and hang it in your window. Then you and your family will be safe when we come back." Let's tie this red rope on your wrist to show that you BELIEVE IN GOD, too.




Tie the yarn bracelet around the child's wrist loosely, and let the child wear it. If time allows, ask the child to tell you what the bracelet means to give him or her an opportunity to express belief in God or thoughts about Rahab and her red rope.

Growing Faith

Children believe in what they experience, what we talk about with them, and what they observe in us. Try adopting the following practices to help your child see the significance your belief in God has to you.

- Make your times of sharing God brief and spontaneous rather than long and structured. It's more important that your children hear you recognizing God in your daily conversations than see you praying for long stretches.
- Let your child hear you talk to God on his or her behalf as you snuggle and cuddle.

Hidden Spies

Say: I'm going to be

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Rahab and hide you. Cover your toddler with a blanket. If your toddler resists being covered completely, keep one end of the blanket up so he or she can still see out. In a deep voice, ask: Where are the spies? Are the spies hiding? I can't find any spies anywhere. I might as well go away. Use your natural voice, and say: You can come out now! God protected you just as he protected the spies at Rahab's house. As your child comes out of hiding, cheer with him or her. Yay, God! You kept us safe. We believe in you! We believe in God.

2-YEAR-OLD

Rahab's Rope Bracelets

As your child holds the center of a 1-foot-long piece of red yarn, begin twisting the ends together.

Say: Rahab believed in God. One day some spies who believed in God came to visit. They needed a place to hide. She hid them because she believed in God. Continue twisting until the yarn is wound tight.

When it was time for the spies to leave, they said, "Take this red rope (show your child the rope that's been created), and hang it in your window. Then you and your family will be safe when we come back." Let's tie this red rope on your wrist to show that you believe in God, too.

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

Use the cardboard tube from a roll of paper towels as a spyglass. Play I Spy with the spyglass to find things in your house. Talk about how we can find things we can't see but we believe in and we know are there, such as your love for God.

Pray this simple prayer together:

I believe in you, God, and I know that pleases you.



The Israelites Cross the Jordan River

Joshua 3:1-4:24



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

God Guides a Nation at the Jordan River

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Parts of this event may seem like a rerun of the Israelites' crossing of the Red Sea 40 years earlier. Remember, however, that apart from Joshua and Caleb, all of the people crossing the Jordan River were no older than children when Israel crossed the Red Sea. This totally new experience must have reminded them of the stories their parents had told them about the miracle of crossing the Red Sea.

Notice that the Jordan River was not just a trickling stream—it was at "flood stage." In the area of Jericho, it would have been 10 to 12 feet deep and the current quite strong.

Israel Memorializes God's Miracle

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The Israelites built a stone memorial with the rocks taken from the center of the Jordan River. The memorial would remind people of the wonders God had done for the Israelites as they entered the Promised Land, and the 12 stones together would remind them of the 12 tribes joined together as one nation.

The last verse of today's passage, Joshua 4:24, tells us why God dried up the Jordan for the people to cross: "so that all the peoples of the earth might know that the hand of the Lord is powerful and so that you might always fear the Lord your God." God wanted his people to fear him—to give him the worship and service he deserved. Remembering what God had done would give them encouragement and faith when they faced the difficulties of conquering this new land.

The Jesus Connection

As we grow in relationship with Christ, we become more Christ-like. We can testify that we have been renewed and delivered from our different lives of the past.

Reread Joshua 4:24. Note the public display of power that God left as a reminder of his love and power. In times of darkness, it's often helpful to rest in the truth of what we have experienced in the past. Encounters with our Savior remind us that he is with us. Write a prayer of thanks for the ways God has been present in your life. When you talk to God this week, start by thanking him for these great things, and add to the list as God continues to work in your life. You can write your prayer in the lines below.

God moved the water for the Israelites. Now the Israelites can cross the river and not get wet. Feel the wet ground. Touch baby's hand to the washcloth. Feel the dry ground. Touch baby's hand to the pan where the water was. The Israelites thanked God for helping them cross the river.

REMEMBER TO THANK GOD when he helps you, too.

Pour more water on the pan to repeat the activity with dry washcloths several times.

Sing "Give Thanks to the Lord" (not on the CD) to the tune of "The Farmer in the Dell" anytime during the lesson. Have children hold hands and walk around in a circle while singing. Crossing the River Jordan

What You'll Do

Gather twos together. Open your Bible to Joshua 3, and show children the words. Tell them the Bible is God's special book.

Say: The Bible says Joshua and the Israelites needed to cross the River Jordan. Show twos the "River Jordan" teaching picture with the tissue paper covering the dry riverbed. There's a lot of water there. "How will we cross the river?" the people asked. Joshua said, "Don't worry. God will take care of us."

The Israelites didn't want to get in the water. Let's see what happens when we get in water. Allow each child to put his or her hand in the dishpan of water. When you put your hand in the water, your hand got wet. The Israelites got across the water, but they didn't get wet. Let's see what happened. Let children dry their hands with paper towels before you continue.

When the people stepped in the water, the river stopped. The water disappeared, and the people could see dry ground. Let one child fold back the tissue paper on the teaching picture so all the children can see the dry land. The people crossed the river on dry ground. The people said, "Thank you, God. Thank you for helping us cross the river."

Let each child have a turn "walking" his or her fingers across the teaching picture. Lay the tissue paper over the teaching picture again to form the river. Then lead children in doing the motions in parentheses as you say the following rhyme.

Say: The Israelites need to cross the river. What will they do? ("walk" fingers to the edge of the river on the teaching picture)

They don't want to get wet! How will they get through? (shrug shoulders)
God will help them cross. He piles the water high! (fold back the tissue paper to reveal the dry riverbed)

Now they walk on land, and they all stay dry. ("walk" fingers across the dry riverbed)

Afterward, say: We need to **REMEMBER TO THANK GOD**, just as the Israelites did.

The river is so deep. (hold hands far apart vertically to show "deep")

He'll make the water move, (hold hands in front of you with palms together; then push them out and away from each other)

And we'll walk on dry land. (slap hands on legs one at a time as if walking)

Thank you, God! (slap hands on legs one at a time as if walking)

Yippee! (raise hands in air)

Afterward, say: The Israelites thanked God after they crossed the river. We need to • REMEMBER TO THANK GOD, too.



God Gives Victory Over Jericho

Joshua 6:1-27



BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LEADERS

God Promises Victory at Jericho

Archaeologists have found the site of ancient Jericho but are still uncertain which city is the one delivered into the hands of the Israelites because it has been destroyed so many times. In light of the curse put upon Jericho in Joshua 6:26, the archaeological findings are interesting indeed.

Joshua Receives a Message From God

While scouting out the city, Joshua was no doubt surprised to see a man with a drawn sword in front of him (Joshua 5:13). We don't know if this was an appearance of God himself, a preincarnate appearance of Jesus, or an angel; however, we do know that he was someone sent from God. Notice how the messenger responds to Joshua's question: "Are you for us or for our enemies?" The messenger was the commander of the Lord's army. It was up to Joshua and Israel to be on the Lord's side, not for the commander to be on Joshua's side!

In the middle of God's message to Joshua, the writer stops to mention a very important fact in Joshua 6:1: The people of Jericho had closed up their city, counting on its strong fortifications to protect them. It was so firmly sealed that no one could go in or out. This meant that no one from Jericho would get in the way as the Israelites marched around the city walls!

God Fulfills the Promise

Notice that God not only told Joshua what to do but also told him precisely what would happen (Joshua 6:5). Assuming that the word from God spread among the Israelites, imagine their increasing anticipation as the army marched silently around the city day after day and then seven times on the seventh day. The people knew that God was about to do something spectacular!

Just as promised, Rahab and her family were spared because of the faith she had shown in hiding the Hebrew spies. God's power worked to save her and the Israelites, while at the same time it was working to destroy the inhabitants of Jericho for their idolatry and immorality.

The Jesus Connection

A relationship with Jesus allows us to walk in confidence, as his power of forgiveness has given us freedom. His love for us provides us with what we need to be clean in his perfect eyes.

Take a few minutes to write down as many words of prayer as you can that show the character of God. Each day, meditate on one of these characteristics and how God has shown those characteristics in you life. Give God praise, and acknowledge God's mighty work in your life.

Say: The Bible says Joshua carried a horn around the wall of Jericho. Hold up the party horn for toddlers to see. This is a horn. God promised the people of Israel he would give them the city of Jericho. So when it was time for them to go into the city, they walked around the city wall for seven days. Let's march around our city. Hold hands with toddlers and walk around the chair as you count to seven. It isn't necessary to actually walk around the chair seven times. Encourage children to count with you.

Say: On the seventh day, God said the people should blow their horns (blow into the party horn), and God would make the walls fall down. The Israelites obeyed God. They marched around the city one more time. Let's march around the city again, one last time, and blow the horn. Hold hands with toddlers and walk around the chair one more time. Then blow into the party horn. After you blow the horn, start to pound your hands on the chair. Encourage toddlers to join you. That big wall made a loud noise and came tumbling down! Shake the chair; then carefully turn the chair on its side, avoiding toddlers who are standing around it. Mighty God loved his children so much that he brought the wall down, just as he promised.

GOD IS POWERFUL!

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If children enjoyed the activity, you may wish to retell a shortened version of what happened and knock the chair over again.





Paper-Cone Horns

What You'll Do

Say: Today we're going to make horns to remind us of the horns Joshua and the people of Israel blew around Jericho. Give each toddler a "Paper-Cone Horn" handout to color with crayons. As each child finishes, tape the page into a cone-shaped horn.

What should we do? God promised he would give the Israelites the city of Jericho. He told them to march around the city. On the seventh day, God said to blow horns.

I have a horn for us to blow. Let's march! Six days we'll march without a sound. Shh! March in a wide circle around the poster and the wall. Don't get too close, however. It isn't necessary to actually march around the wall six times. As you march, say: This is the first day around the city. Whisper: We must be very quiet. This is the second day around Jericho and the third day. Now we're marching into the fourth day and the fifth day. We must stay quiet to obey what God said. Now it's the sixth day, and we're still marching quietly. Stop marching, and look around. Now it's the seventh day. Do you hear the horns? Blow on the party horn. Start marching again. This time march very closely to the wall as you blow the horn. Carefully touch a bottom block with your foot. That wall fell down flat! God is so powerful that he knocked down that strong wall with one horn blast! Hooray! ▶ GOD IS POWERFUL! Encourage children to cheer for God's power.

Celebration Horns

What You'll Do

Say: Today we're going to make horns to remind us of the horns the Israelites blew as they marched around Jericho. These are celebration horns to praise God for his power. Celebration horns are colorful and fancy! Give each child a "Paper-Cone Horn" handout and markers. Encourage children to color the handout any way they choose. When a child is finished coloring, tape the handout into a cone-shaped horn. Let children tape crepe paper strips to the outer edge of their horns. When children are finished, show them how to hold the horns to their lips and blow hard to send the crepe paper streamers flying.

Say: You're blowing powerfully to make the streamers fly. Let's see if our blowing can knock blocks down. Place one block in front of each child. Have him or her blow through the horn to try to move the block. It wasn't the air from the Israelites' horns that knocked down the wall at Jericho. It was God's power that caused the wall to fall.

GOD IS POWERFUL, and he'll use his power to help you just as he used it to help the Israelites.

What You'll Do

Say: We can march around the room blowing our horns just as Joshua and the Israelites marched around Jericho. I'll be the leader. Blow your horns and follow me.

Help children form a line behind you and blow into the paper horns they made during the "Celebration Horns" activity. Play "Oh, When We March" (track 17 on the CD). Lead children in a Follow the Leader–type march around the room. As you march, encourage children to freely vocalize into their horns. At the end of each stanza of the song, stop to have everyone shout, "▶ GOD IS POWERFUL!"

Growing With Jesus



Power and Power Struggles

In your child's quest for independence, he or she is bound to try to engage you in a struggle for power. The only way to win that war is to refuse to play. As a parent you're the most powerful figure in your child's life. However, your goal needs to be to assert your authority, not your power. As often as possible, offer your child acceptable options from which to choose. Doing so allows you to exercise your authority while letting your child have a sense of power over his or her life.

OK TO COPY our child learned God is powerful (from Joshua 6:1-27). Your child participated in one of the following activities today. You can use these activities with your child to help your child grow with Jesus throughout the week.

INFANT

Horn Practice

Have your infant sit or lie on a blanket in front of you.

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Say: God knocked the wall of Jericho down when the Israelites blew on their horns. Can you blow? Pucker your lips in an exaggerated way. Hold your lips in that position, and catch your baby's eye. While holding that position, blow puffs of air. Encourage your baby to imitate you. Then gently blow on your baby's arm. This is what air feels like when it's blown.

Soon you'll be able to blow a horn the way the Israelites blew their horns. You'll be able to let the whole world know that God is powerful!

TODDLER

Jericho Knockdown

Gather a pile of blocks and some toy people and animals, and sit on the floor with your toddler.

Say: God cared for the Israelites by showing his power, knocking over the wall of Jericho. Let's build Jericho's wall around these people and animals. Have your toddler help you build a wall around the toys. These animals and people must feel safe and protected by this wall, just as the people of Jericho must've felt. God's power knocked over the wall of Jericho. Let's show God's power by knocking over this wall on three. Count to three, and help your toddler knock over the wall. God is powerful!

2-YEAR-OLD

Jericho March

Say: We can march around the room blowing our horns just as Joshua and the Israelites marched around Jericho. I'll be the leader. Blow your horn and follow me.

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Cup your hands around your mouth and pretend to blow a horn. Lead your child in a Follow the Leader-type march around the room. As you march, encourage your child to stop every few feet and shout, "God is powerful!"

Use these ideas to help your child become a FaithWeaver:

Build block walls with your child. Enjoy the fun of building and then knocking down the walls. As you play, say this rhyme:

God sent Joshua marching around,
And by God's power that wall fell down!

As you dress your child in the morning, feel his or her arm muscles. Talk about how strong he or she is becoming. Then remind your child that God is stronger and more powerful than anyone!
