BIBLE PASSAGE: Genesis 3

FOCUS VERSES: Romans 3:23; Isaiah 59:2; Exodus 15:11; James 4:17

Summary: God created a perfect world where people were in a perfect relationship with Him. A serpent tempted Eve. She and Adam ate fruit from the tree. They became separated from God. They were no longer perfect, and the world was broken by their sin. They hid from God in shame, but the Lord did not leave them without hope. He promised a Savior who would defeat the serpent and free all people from the power of sin.

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: HELPING KIDS BELONG

Child disciplinators create environments where every kid feels loved and known and has a sense of belonging.

- **Kids need to feel safe.** For kids to feel like church is a place where they belong, they must feel physically, emotionally and spiritually safe. Set boundaries for behavior and make your group a friendly, welcoming space for everyone.
- **Kids need to feel noticed.** You will have kids who come in loud, seeking attention. You will have kids who barely say a word and try to blend in. Every kid needs you to look in their eyes and acknowledge how glad you are they are there. Stand by the door as kids enter and personally welcome each one.
- **Kids need to feel known.** Use Belong activities to connect with kids and get to know them on a personal level. Ask questions about their families and interests. Remember special interests they name (even if you have to write it down.)

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: DOES GOD PUNISH US?

In 2017, 50 percent of adult believers said they believe God has punished them in their lifetime.* Many kids grow up with an unhealthy fear of God that follows them into adulthood. They could grow up obeying out of fear instead of love, or they could grow up angry with God. In today's lesson, kids will learn that sin has serious consequences but that God sent a Savior to free us from the consequence of sin that we deserve: eternal separation from Him. His desire isn't to make us face punishment, but His desire is that we would all be free from sin. Help kids see how very much God loves them. The story of Adam and Eve is a sad one where the world was broken by sin, but God's grace, mercy and love for His people are clear.

Creator: the One who made everything

Holy: set apart; perfect

Bible TEACHING

THE FALL GENESIS 3



PRAY: God, You are perfect and holy and we are not. May these verses make us thankful that although we have gone our own way, You made a way for us to enjoy closeness with You again. Amen.

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, 5 candles, matches, table

PREP:

Place the 5 candles on a table at the front of your space. Have matches out of view but accessible.

LEADER TIP:

Do not allow kids access to matches or lighters. Have a fire extinguisher nearby.

Begin by lighting all the candles.

Say: These candles today represent the light found in God's presence. God created us all to be close to Him and enjoy His light and life forever. When we choose our way instead of God's way, we separate ourselves from closeness to God. Today's story is about the very first time that ever happened.

Say: God's first people, Adam and Eve, lived in the beautiful garden of Eden in a perfect relationship with God. God placed the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the middle of the garden. God told Adam to eat from any tree except for that one. God told him, "If you eat of it, you will surely die."

Show teaching illustration: Tree of Knowledge

Say: There was a serpent who was sneakier and more deceitful than any other wild animal God had made. One day, the serpent said to Eve, "Did God actually say, 'You cannot eat from any tree in the garden'?" Eve replied, "We may eat the fruit from the trees in the garden, but God told us not to even touch the tree of knowledge of good and evil."

Say: Wait a minute! God didn't say not to touch the tree. Eve added to His words! In this moment, do we think Eve is thinking about obeying God or is her mind on that fruit in that tree? It seems like she's thinking about the fruit.

Blow out the first candle.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Read Genesis 3:4–5 directly from the Bible: *But the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die. For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”*

Say: When the woman saw that the fruit looked very good and that it would make her wise, she took the fruit and ate it.

Say: In this moment, Eve definitely chose disobedience and darkness over the light found in God’s presence.

Blow out the second candle.

Say: She also gave some to Adam, and he ate it.

Show teaching illustration: Adam and Eve Eating the Fruit

Say: Now both have chosen sin instead of following God’s command.

Blow out the third candle.

Say: Then both of their eyes were opened. Immediately they were ashamed and hid.

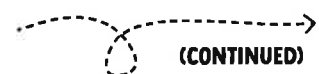
Say: When God walked through the garden, He called to Adam, who was hiding. Adam confessed that he ate the fruit, but he blamed it on Eve. Eve blamed it on the serpent. And everything was different.

Say: The blame-game is just another way Adam and Eve chose darkness over the light found close to God.

Blow out the fourth candle.

Say: Sin had entered God’s perfect world. The world was broken, including Adam and Eve’s relationship with God.

Blow out the fifth candle.

 (CONTINUED)

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: They would have to leave the garden. They would one day die instead of living forever with God in His perfect creation. Everything would be harder. God told them that the ground would be difficult for Adam to work and Eve would have pain when having babies. But then He told the serpent that one day there would be a human Child. The serpent would strike the human's heel, but the human would crush the serpent's head. One day, God would send a Rescuer who would destroy sin and death forever.

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus



POINT TO JESUS

Say: God is perfect and holy. When sin entered His perfectly created world, everything was broken, including His relationship with people. Sin is anything we think, do or say that disobeys God. And everyone sins! That means every person is separated from His holiness. That's why God had a plan from the beginning to send Jesus to take the punishment for our sin.

Relight the candles.

Say: Because Jesus died on the cross and rose again, we can be forgiven. One day He will restore all of broken creation and make it new.

WHO'S THE BEST?

SUPPLIES: Bibles, Take-Home page, writing supplies, whiteboard, dry-erase markers, dry-eraser

OR

THANK YOU CARDS

SUPPLIES: Bibles, Take-Home page, writing supplies, colored paper (1 per kid), coloring supplies



CHOOSE THE EGG

SUPPLIES:

3 uncooked eggs, 3 hard boiled eggs, plastic tablecloth, paper towels

PREP:

Spread the tablecloth on the floor.

LEADER TIP: For larger groups, provide additional eggs to make more teams.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Be sensitive to those with sensory needs. This can be an exciting and loud activity. It can also be messy. Allow for headphones or distance from messiness.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is the Creator. What did you see this week that God created?
4. **Say:** Let's see if you can make the right choice when faced with a difficult decision.
5. **Say:** I will divide you into three teams. Each team will get two eggs. One egg is raw and the other is hard-boiled. You will need to work with your team and decide which egg is hard-boiled. You can look at the egg and touch it, but you can't crack it open.
6. *Divide kids into three teams. Give each team a hard-boiled egg and a raw egg.*
7. *Give kids time to look at their eggs and choose the one that they think is hard-boiled.*
8. *Choose one person from each team to stand with their egg over the plastic tablecloth. Have the teams drop their eggs on the count of three.*
9. **Discuss:** How confident were you that you made the right choice? Why?
10. **Discuss:** Share about a time you made a bad choice. What were the consequences of your bad choice?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Today we are learning a story about a bad choice Adam and Eve made on purpose that had huge consequences.



FUNNY STATE LAWS

SUPPLIES:

Printable page

PREP:

Print the printable page.

LEADER TIP: Instead of jumping and sitting, let kids decide how they want to vote for true or false!

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is the Creator. What did you see this week that God created?
4. **Discuss:** What is a law? Can anyone give an example of a law?
5. **Say:** A law is a rule that people must follow so that people can live together well and be safe. Each state enacts laws for how people are to live and act in their state.
6. **Say:** Let's play a game!
7. **Say:** I will read a law and you will tell me if you think the law is real or not. If you think the law is true, I want you to jump up. If you think it's not a real law, you will stay seated.
8. *Read aloud each law from the printable page and allow the kids to guess if it's true or false. Allow a moment of reaction and response after each one.*



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Those were some pretty funny laws! Today we are learning about a time when God gave the first people, Adam and Eve, a law, or a rule, to follow.



CHOOSE YOUR CHALLENGE

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, teaching slide

PREP:

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find Colossians 1:16 in their Bibles. Read the verse aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** Who created the world? Why?
3. **Say:** God created the world perfectly and He created people to have a perfect relationship with God. But Adam and Eve sinned and disobeyed God.
4. **Discuss:** What was the consequence of Adam and Eve's sin?
5. **Discuss:** Can God and sin be together? Why or why not?
6. **Discuss:** Does God ever do anything wrong?
7. **Say:** God is holy and perfect! He never sins. He never makes wrong choices.
8. **Say:** Let's make some choices about how we will say our memory verse. I will give you a choice of how you will repeat the verse. As a group, you will need to agree on the choice and then say the verse together.
9. **Choose your challenge:**
Say the verse while...

• doing sit ups	OR	doing jumping jacks
• hopping on one foot	OR	running in place
• using a robot voice	OR	using a low voice
• slithering like a snake	OR	hopping like a frog
• pretending to surf	OR	playing the air guitar
• speaking the fastest	OR	passing the verse back and forth
10. *Invite kids to confer as a group, choose their challenge and complete it.*
11. *Repeat with as many additional challenges as you have time for.*



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

God is holy and perfect. He never sins and can never choose to sin. People sin and make choices to follow their own way instead of God's way.



OIL AND WATER

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, clear plastic cups (1 per kid), plastic spoons (1 per kid), vegetable oil, water, paper towels

PREP:

Add equal parts oil and water to each of the plastic cups, filling them no more than halfway to prevent spills.

LEADER TIP: This could also be a class demonstration rather than handing out cups of oil and water.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find John 3:16 in their Bibles. Read the verse aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** Why did Jesus come to Earth?
3. **Discuss:** What is sin? What are some examples of sin?
4. **Say:** Sin is anything we think, say or do that disobeys God.
5. **Discuss:** How did Adam and Eve sin?
6. **Say:** Adam and Eve sinned when they disobeyed God's rule not to eat from the fruit of the tree.
7. **Say:** Let's do an experiment! I will give each of you a plastic cup with some oil and water, along with a spoon. Your challenge is to see if you can stir the oil and water together so it mixes.
8. *Pass out the supplies and give kids time to try to mix the oil and water.*
9. **Discuss:** Were you able to mix the oil and water? Why not?
10. **Discuss:** Think of the oil as God and the water as sin. Can God ever mix or be close to sin? Can God sin?
11. *Lead kids to find Exodus 15:11 in their Bibles. Read the verse aloud together.*
12. **Say:** God is holy. This means He is set apart. He is set apart from us because He never sins. He is perfect in all ways.
13. **Discuss:** Why is our sin such a problem for God?
14. **Discuss:** What did God do to fix our sin problem?

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Sin is a big deal! God doesn't sin, so our sin separates us from God. But the great news is that even though we sin, God loves us and doesn't want to be separated from us. He had a plan to save us from our sin and fix our relationship with Him.



Discipleship DISCUSSION

HOW CAN I KNOW THIS IS TRUE?

Discuss: How do we still know today what God says is right and wrong?

Say: An ancient king, Hammurabi, had his scribes write laws that needed to be obeyed to keep order in his kingdom. Archaeologists found several large clay tablets of the oldest written laws, Hammurabi's Code. The problem with Hammurabi's Code was that only the scribes could read the laws, so soon the laws were forgotten. However, archaeologists have found more than 2,000 copies of the laws of God found in the Old Testament. Israel's law came directly from God, who gave it to Israel to help the people obey Him and also teach their children to do the same. Instead of being forgotten soon after, God's law was passed on to each generation and is remembered by His people. God's laws show His goodness!

Read Psalm 1:2 directly from the Bible: *The righteous man delights in the law of the LORD, and on His law he meditates day and night.*

BUT WHAT ABOUT ... IS GOD PUNISHING ME?

Discuss: Have you ever heard someone say God was mad at them when something bad happened?

Discuss: What do you think about that?

Discuss: What do you think God says about that?

Say: Sometimes you may have wondered, "When bad things happen, is God punishing me?" It's not wrong to wonder about this. Bad things happen as a consequence of sin entering the world. Sometimes it IS a consequence of something we have done, but because we live in a sinful and fallen world, none of us are free from trouble and sadness. When it comes to specific bad things that happen in our lives, we may never know why they occurred. But we can be certain that God isn't "getting back at us" for a sin we committed or because He doesn't love us anymore. God loves us always, no matter what. He proved that by sending Jesus to take the punishment for our sin. Romans 5:8 says: *but God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*



WHO'S THE BEST?

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, writing supplies, whiteboard, dry-erase markers, dry-eraser

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Draw a scale on the whiteboard. Write "Good" on the left side and "Perfect" on the right side.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Say:** Think of a few people that you know who are really good people. They could be people you know personally or people you have heard of. Write down their names where you think they would fall on this line from good to perfect.
2. *Give kids time to write the names of the people on the scale.*
3. *Look at the scale together and discuss where kids put people and why.*
4. **Discuss:** Is there anyone who was rated as perfect? Why or why not?
5. *Lead kids to find Romans 3:23 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
6. **Discuss:** What does this verse tell us?
7. **Say:** The Bible teaches that all people sin. Sin is anything we think, say, or do that disobeys God. No one is perfect. We can't be good enough or do enough good things to overcome the sin in our lives.
8. *Have kids erase the scale and names.*
9. **Discuss:** The story doesn't end there! What did God do to fix our sin problem?
10. *Lead kids to find Ephesians 2:8-9 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
11. **Discuss:** What do these verses tell us?
12. **Say:** We can only be saved from our sins through faith in Jesus. This is God's free gift to us. We all need Jesus. People cannot be good enough to be perfect. When we accept Jesus' free gift of salvation, we are forgiven and made perfect in Christ.
13. **Pray:** God, You are holy and perfect. Thank You for sending Jesus to conquer death and forgive our sins. Help us to trust You and follow Your ways. Amen.
14. **Say:** God is holy. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, Take-Home page, writing supplies, colored paper (1 per kid), coloring supplies

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid).

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Support active learners by giving them two expectations of what to talk to God about during this time.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** What is sin?
2. **Say:** Sin is anything we think, say or do that disobeys God.
3. *Lead kids to find Romans 3:23 and Isaiah 59:2 in their Bibles. Read them aloud together.*
4. **Discuss:** What do these verses tell us about sin?
5. **Discuss:** Why did Adam and Eve sin?
6. **Say:** God told Adam and Eve not to eat the fruit from a tree in the garden, but Adam and Eve chose their own way instead of God's way.
7. **Say:** We are just like Adam and Eve. We choose our own way instead of God's way. Everyone sins.
8. **Discuss:** What are some examples of sin?
9. **Say:** Let's talk to God and thank Him for saving us from our sins.
10. *Spread kids out around your space and give them time to talk with God.*
11. **Say:** But that's not the end of the story! God loved us so much that He didn't want our sin to separate us from Him forever. He sent Jesus to take the punishment for our sin so we can have a relationship with God forever!
12. **Say:** Let's make thank you cards for God and thank Him for loving us so much and sending Jesus. As you work on your cards, continue praying quietly, thanking God for His gift of salvation.
13. *Pass out supplies and give kids time to create their cards and pray.*
14. **Pray:** God, You are holy and perfect. Thank You for sending Jesus to conquer death and forgive our sins. Help us to trust You and follow Your ways. Amen.
15. **Say:** God is holy. Let's take time to respond to Him.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.

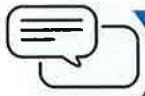

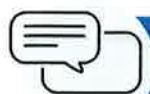
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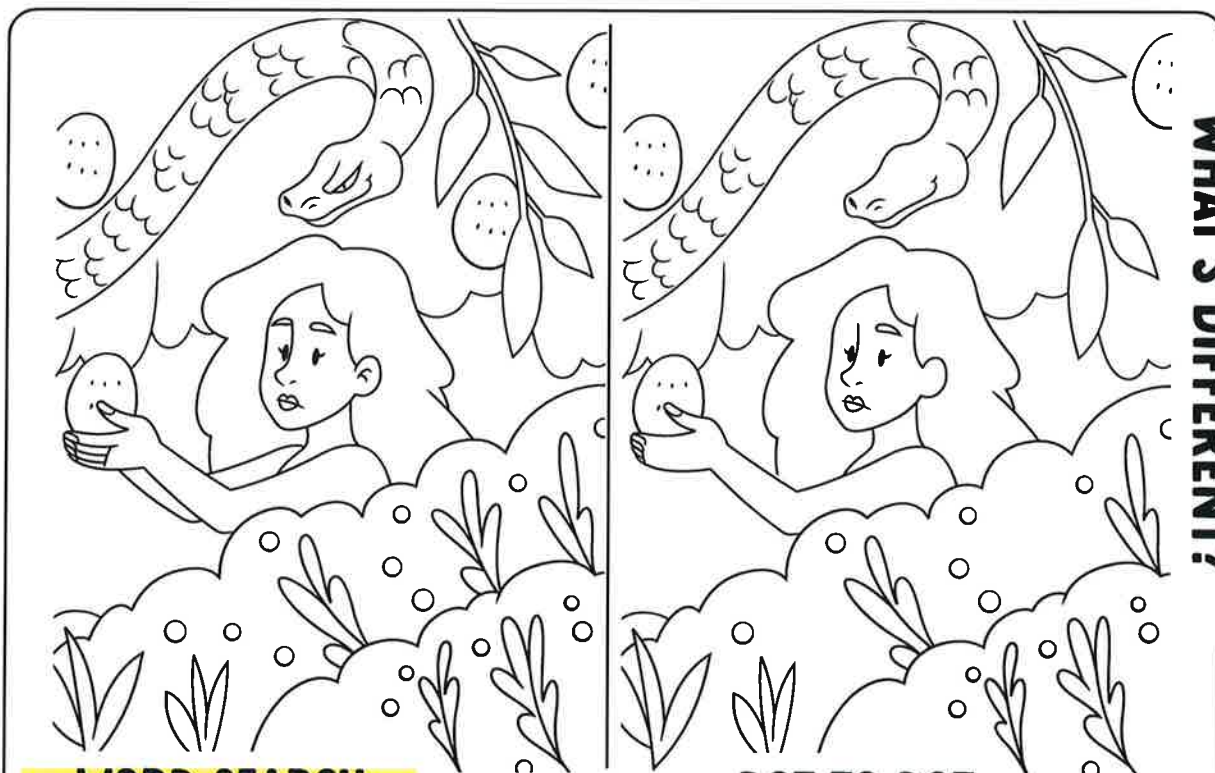
