



TOWER OF BABEL

BIBLE PASSAGE: Genesis 11:1-9

FOCUS VERSES: Jeremiah 10:6; Psalm 86:8-10; John 14:6

Summary: God instructed people to fill the Earth. Instead, they chose to gather in one spot and build a city, including a great tower so that they could make a name for themselves. God protected them from their wrong desires by confusing their language. They couldn't understand each other and stopped trying to build the city. God scattered the people throughout the earth.

We will go deeper in God's truth by answering these questions:



WHO IS GREATER THAN GOD?

No one will ever be greater than God. Because He is the Creator, He is in charge of all things.



IS THERE A WAY FOR US TO GET TO GOD?

Because our sin separates us from God, believing in Jesus is the only way to have a relationship with Him.



HOW IS GOD INVITING ME TO RESPOND?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: HELPING KIDS BELIEVE

There are key elements in Brite that help kids grow in understanding the Bible so they can believe in Jesus.

- **God's Big Story.** Kids need to understand that individual Bible stories are pieces of one bigger story. God's story of creation, the fall, redemption and restoration helps kids develop a worldview that is consistent with reality.
- **He/We/Me Questions.** These questions help kids discover that every passage can teach us something about who God is and what He wants for His people. Kids can also begin to listen to the Holy Spirit to determine what God is inviting them to do in response to His Word.
- **Point to Jesus.** Kids need to understand that the whole Bible points to Jesus. Don't miss opportunities each week to remind kids of the Gospel and what Jesus has done for them.
- **Use the Bible.** As you teach, hold a Bible in your hand to reinforce where truth comes from. Include times for kids to physically touch Bibles and practice looking up verses. You'll be surprised how much they love this!

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: IS JESUS REALLY THE ONLY WAY TO HEAVEN?

Almost half of American adults believe that you can work your way to heaven.* Most people, even when we know Jesus, default to a works-based approach to our faith. Combine this with the plurality of religious beliefs kids are exposed to, and it is likely that kids can be confused about salvation. In today's lesson, kids will learn that God made a way for us to be with Him through Jesus. There may be kids in your group who believe that everyone goes to heaven. Some may believe that all religions are the same. Encourage kids to talk about what they have heard. Gently correct theology while being sensitive that these conversations may be very personal if kids have loved ones who believe different things. Avoid sounding judgmental by pointing to Scripture and being cautious with broad statements. Remind kids that only God knows individuals' hearts and that He gives us the big job of sharing His truth with others.

Bible TEACHING

TOWER OF BABEL GENESIS 11:1-9



PRAY: God, Your ways are the best way and no one is greater than You! May we see in Your Word today that Your plans always win and our best hope is found in following Jesus. Amen.

Place the box with nothing written on the side in front of your space. This will be the first box of your tower. Have the other boxes nearby, ready to be stacked.

Say: The world did not get better after Adam and Eve sinned. The wickedness grew greater and greater, to the point that God sent a massive flood, destroying the Earth and all of the people except for one family.

Invite a volunteer to stack the "wickedness grew" cardboard box on the first box. Have the volunteer read the words on the box for the group.

Say: God instructed Noah to build an ark and God used the ark to protect Noah's family and many animals. After the flood, God told His people to multiply, spread out and fill the whole earth.

Say: At this time, everyone on Earth spoke the same language. Instead of spreading out, many gathered together in one area.

Invite a volunteer to stack the "gathered together" cardboard box on the stack of boxes. Have the volunteer read the words on the box for the group.

Read Genesis 11:4 directly from the Bible: *Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth."*

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, 5 large cardboard boxes, permanent marker, dollar bill, flashlight, remote control

PREP:

Write the following phrases on the side of four boxes: "wickedness grew," "gathered together," "make a tower," and "their way." Place the dollar bill, flashlight and remote control inside the fifth box with no writing on the side.

LEADER TIP:

Use bigger boxes for a more dramatic effect.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Invite a volunteer to stack the “make a tower” cardboard box on the stack of boxes. Have the volunteer read the words on the box for the group.

Show teaching illustration: The Tower of Babel

Say: The people had made a grand plan, but it wasn’t God’s plan. They were focused on making sure other people noticed them by doing things their way instead of God’s way.

Invite a volunteer to stack the “their way” cardboard box on the stack of boxes. Have the volunteer read the words on the box for the group.

Say: God knew all of the people working together to try to live life their own way was not good. He saved them from themselves.

Say: God confused their language. All of a sudden, everyone was speaking a different language and no one could understand each other. It was impossible for them to work together to build a tower. God scattered them all over the world, just like He had told them to do in the first place.

Show teaching illustration: People Scattered

Scatter the boxes around the front of your space.

Say: The place was called Babel, and it is remembered as the place where God confused languages. The people believed the city would be a symbol of their own greatness, but instead God proved He is the greatest of all! Still today people try to achieve greatness in lots of wrong ways.

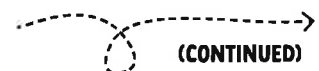
Pick up the box with no writing, open the top and pull out the dollar bill.

Say: Some people believe if they get piles of money that will make them great.

Pull the flashlight out of the box, turn it on and shine it on yourself.

Say: Others believe if they live in the spotlight and get really famous and popular that will make them great.

Pull the remote control out of the box.

 (CONTINUED)

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: Some believe if they can get big, important jobs so that they can control other people, that is how they will make themselves great. But everyone should learn the important lesson the people of Babel had to learn—no one is greater than God.

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus



POINT TO JESUS

Say: God wants a relationship with His people, but it has to be on His terms, not ours. No one is greater than Him. Because He is great and holy, our sin separates us from Him. We can't do anything on our own to fix that. He has given us a path to a relationship with Him that is based on His grace and forgiveness, not our hard work. Even if we are famous and the whole world knows who we are, it doesn't matter if we don't know Jesus.

Read John 14:6 directly from the Bible: *Jesus said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."*

Say: We can only have a relationship with God when we turn from our sin and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

WHAT DID YOU SAY?

SUPPLIES:

Printable pages, scissors, paper bag

PREP:

Print the printable pages double-sided and cut out (1 card per kid). Place cards in the bag.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids with anxiety and who get overwhelmed easily, give frequent encouragement during their turn or allow them to speak from their seat.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is the Creator. What did you see this week that God created?
4. **Say:** Each of you will get a chance to share a message with the group. But you will have to follow a special challenge while you do it!
5. *Call kids up one at a time and have them choose a card out of the bag.*
6. *Give kids a chance to share their message using their challenge card.*
7. *Allow the group to try and guess the message before going on to the next one.*
8. *Repeat the process until all kids that want to share a message have had the chance.*
9. **Discuss:** How did you feel while trying to understand each other's messages?
10. **Discuss:** How did it feel to communicate and not be understood?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Today we are learning about a group of people who had a hard time communicating with each other. God reminded them that no one is greater than Him!



THE GREATEST TOWER

SUPPLIES:

Cups (10 per kid)

PREP:

None

LEADER TIP: For larger groups, divide kids into teams and compete to see who can build the tallest tower.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids with mobility needs, allow extra space and time for specialized equipment or buddy them up with a familiar friend to assist.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is the Creator. What did you see this week that God created?
4. *Pass out 10 cups to everyone.*
5. **Discuss:** If we all work together, how tall of a tower can we make?
6. *Encourage kids to make predictions about how tall the tower will be.*
7. **Say:** Let's work together to build the greatest tower ever! Maybe we can even get up to the ceiling!
8. *Have everyone brainstorm how to stack the cups to make the largest tower.*
9. *Have kids work together to assemble their tower.*
10. *Allow as many attempts as you have time for.*
11. **Discuss:** Were we able to achieve our goal? Could we have made the tower even taller and greater? What would have helped us make it greater?
12. **Discuss:** Have you ever been the greatest at something? What was it?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Today we are learning a story where people tried to build a tower to make themselves great. Instead, God showed He was and is the greatest of all time ever!



MIXED-UP WORDS

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, teaching slide, printable page

PREP:

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide. Print the printable page (1 per 2 kids).

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Pair kids who may struggle with this activity with a friend who can help.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find Colossians 1:16 in their Bible. Read it aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** What does this verse tell us God created?
3. **Discuss:** What do thrones, dominions, rulers and authorities have in common? What does it tell us about God that He created all of those?
4. **Say:** All things were created by God! No one will ever be greater than God. Because He is the Creator, He is in charge of all things.
5. **Discuss:** The people in our story tried to make themselves great. How did they get confused and mixed up in our story?
6. **Discuss:** What happened to their words?
7. **Say:** Let's practice our verse by mixing up a few of the words!
8. *Divide kids into pairs and have them sit together.*
9. **Say:** One at a time, you will say the memory verse to your partner. The challenge will be to say one word incorrectly. You can mix a word up, swap a new one or even use an appropriate sound effect instead. Your partner will listen closely and see if they can spot the one word you mixed up!
10. *Give pairs time to say the verse and spot the mixed-up word.*
11. *Say the verse together as a group and then have the pairs switch roles.*
12. *Say the verse together as a group again.*



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Our verse tells us that all things were created by God and through God. Nothing is greater than He is!



GREATEST OF ALL TIME

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, printable pages, painter's tape

PREP:

Print the printable pages. Hang the Bible story pages on the walls around your space. Place a Bible by each page. Keep the Leader Guide with you.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Strategically divide kids into groups who may need extra support.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** How did God show He was the greatest in today's story?
2. **Discuss:** Have you ever heard the term "The GOAT"? What does it mean?
3. **Say:** It means "greatest of all time" and usually applies to an athlete who is better than all the other athletes in their sport.
4. **Discuss:** Do you know of GOATs in any sports?
5. *Lead kids to find Psalm 86:8-10 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
6. **Discuss:** What does this verse tell us about God?
7. **Discuss:** Will there ever be anyone greater than God?
8. **Say:** God is the GOAT of everything, ever! There is no one greater than God and there will never be anyone greater than Him. The Bible is full of all the things that God has done to prove that He is the greatest of all time ever!
9. **Say:** Let's discover some amazing things that God has done. In groups, you will read a Bible story and then discuss how God showed His greatness.
10. *Divide kids into six groups and send each group to a printable page.*
11. *Give groups time to read the passage and discuss it.*
12. *Mingle around the groups and use the Leader Guide as needed to assist.*
13. *Invite each group to share with everyone what they learned.*
14. **Discuss:** Will there ever be anyone greater than God? Why?
15. **Discuss:** Which of the accomplishments you discovered means the most to you? Why?

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

No one will ever be greater than God. Because He is the Creator, He is in charge of all things.



Discipleship DISCUSSION

HOW CAN I KNOW THIS IS TRUE?

Discuss: What do archaeologists do?

Say: Archaeologists study history by digging up artifacts and studying ancient ruins. The Tower of Babel is not still standing – it would be very old by now! Archaeologists believe that another name for it was Etemananki (EH-tuh-meh-NAHN-kee) and it was torn down by Alexander the Great. The base of this tower can still be found in modern day Iraq.

Say: Even if the towers and buildings aren't still standing, we can trust that the stories in God's Word are true and He is also truthful and trustworthy.

Read Proverbs 18:10 directly from the Bible: *The name of the LORD is a strong tower; the righteous man runs into it and is safe.*

BUT WHAT ABOUT ... IS JESUS REALLY THE ONLY WAY TO HEAVEN?

Discuss: Have you ever heard someone say something like "all paths lead to God"? What would that mean?

Discuss: Have you ever heard kids talk about other ways that people can go to heaven?

Discuss: What does God have to say about that?

Say: Some people say that if God loves everyone, He will make many paths to get to Him. Some people think all gods and all religions are ultimately the same and if you just believe in anything, you will go to heaven. All of that sounds good, but the truth is we can only go to heaven when our sin is removed, and there are no other paths that remove our sin. Being good doesn't remove our sin, because we will always sin more. We need grace and forgiveness. That only comes through Jesus. John 14:6 says: *Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."*



BRICK GOSPEL

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, Take-Home page, writing supplies, LEGO® bricks (several per kid)

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid).

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Support kids with fine motor needs when making the cross (e.g., provide a pattern to look at, positive peer or sit close to a leader).

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Say:** No one is greater than God! Let's do an activity with LEGO bricks to learn about how we can have a relationship with God.
2. *Take out the LEGO bricks and have kids pick up two pieces of the same size.*
3. **Say:** These two pieces represent God and us. When God created the world, He made everything perfect. He and the people had a perfect relationship. Put your two pieces together.
4. **Discuss:** What happened to break their relationship?
5. **Say:** Sin broke the relationship between God and people. Take your two bricks apart and place them in front of you.
6. **Discuss:** How did the people in today's story try to get to God?
7. **Discuss:** What are ways that people try to fix their relationship with God?
8. **Say:** Some people try to do lots of good things so they can earn a friendship with God. Others think that as long as they are sorry for what they do, that will fix it.
9. *Lead kids to find John 14:6 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
10. **Discuss:** What does this verse tell us?
11. **Say:** Believing in Jesus and accepting His forgiveness for our sins is the only way we can have a relationship with Jesus. Use some bricks to make a cross and then lay it between God and us, forming a bridge and showing that Jesus made the way for us to be with God.
12. **Discuss:** What do you believe about Jesus?
13. **Pray:** God, You are strong and powerful, loving and caring. You care about each of us personally. No one is or ever will be greater than You. Amen.
14. **Say:** No one is greater than God. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.

3. *Divide kids into groups of three and give them building blocks and a Discussion Guide. Give groups time to build their towers and discuss.*
4. **Discuss:** Did any of your towers get you to God? How can we have a relationship with God if it isn't through our own efforts?
5. *Lead kids to find John 14:6 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
6. **Discuss:** Is there a way for us to get to God?
7. **Say:** Because our sin separates us from God, believing in Jesus is the only way to have a relationship with Him.
8. *Pass out a cross printable page to each group. Encourage kids to break their towers if they are still standing and place the cross on the pile of blocks.*
9. *Lead kids to find Ephesians 2:8-9 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
10. **Say:** God's gift of grace through Jesus is the only way to get to God!
11. *Give kids time to pray silently or in their groups and then pray for everyone aloud.*
12. **Pray:** God, You are strong and powerful, loving and caring. You care about each of us personally. No one is or ever will be greater than You. Amen.
13. **Say:** No one is greater than God. Let's take time to respond to Him.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.

LEADER GUIDE

Creation (Genesis 1 and Isaiah 45:12)

God demonstrated His greatness by creating everything in the world with power, wisdom, and perfect design.

God Parted the Red Sea (Exodus 14 and Psalm 136:13–15)

God showed His greatness by performing a mighty miracle. He parted the sea to rescue His people and defeat their enemies. He showed His power over nature and nations.

God Rained Food from Heaven (Exodus 16)

God displayed His greatness by providing for His people's needs in the desert, showing His care, faithfulness, and ability to provide in impossible situations.

God Wins a Contest (1 Kings 18:18–39)

God revealed His greatness by sending fire from heaven to prove He alone is the true God. He has supreme power over false gods and human challenges.

God Made the Sun Stand Still (Joshua 10:1–14)

God demonstrated His greatness by controlling the sun and moon to give His people victory in battle, showing His authority over creation and history.

God Sent Jesus to Die and Rise Again (Matthew 28:1–8 and Acts 2:22–24)

God displayed His greatest greatness by defeating death through Jesus' resurrection, showing His power, love, and ultimate authority over sin and life itself.

Going to Church

Read: 1 Samuel 16:7.

Truth: Church helps us grow and learn about God, but just showing up can't take away our sin. God wants our hearts, not a checklist. That's why we need Jesus.

Discuss: What's the difference between knowing about God and actually knowing Him?

Add a few blocks to your tower.

Being the Best

Belief: "If I'm the best at school, sports, or helping others, maybe God will notice me."

Read: Luke 12:6-7.

Truth: God already notices you. He loves you more than you can imagine. You don't have to earn His attention.

Discuss: What are ways people sometimes try to earn God's love or approval?

Add a few blocks to your tower.

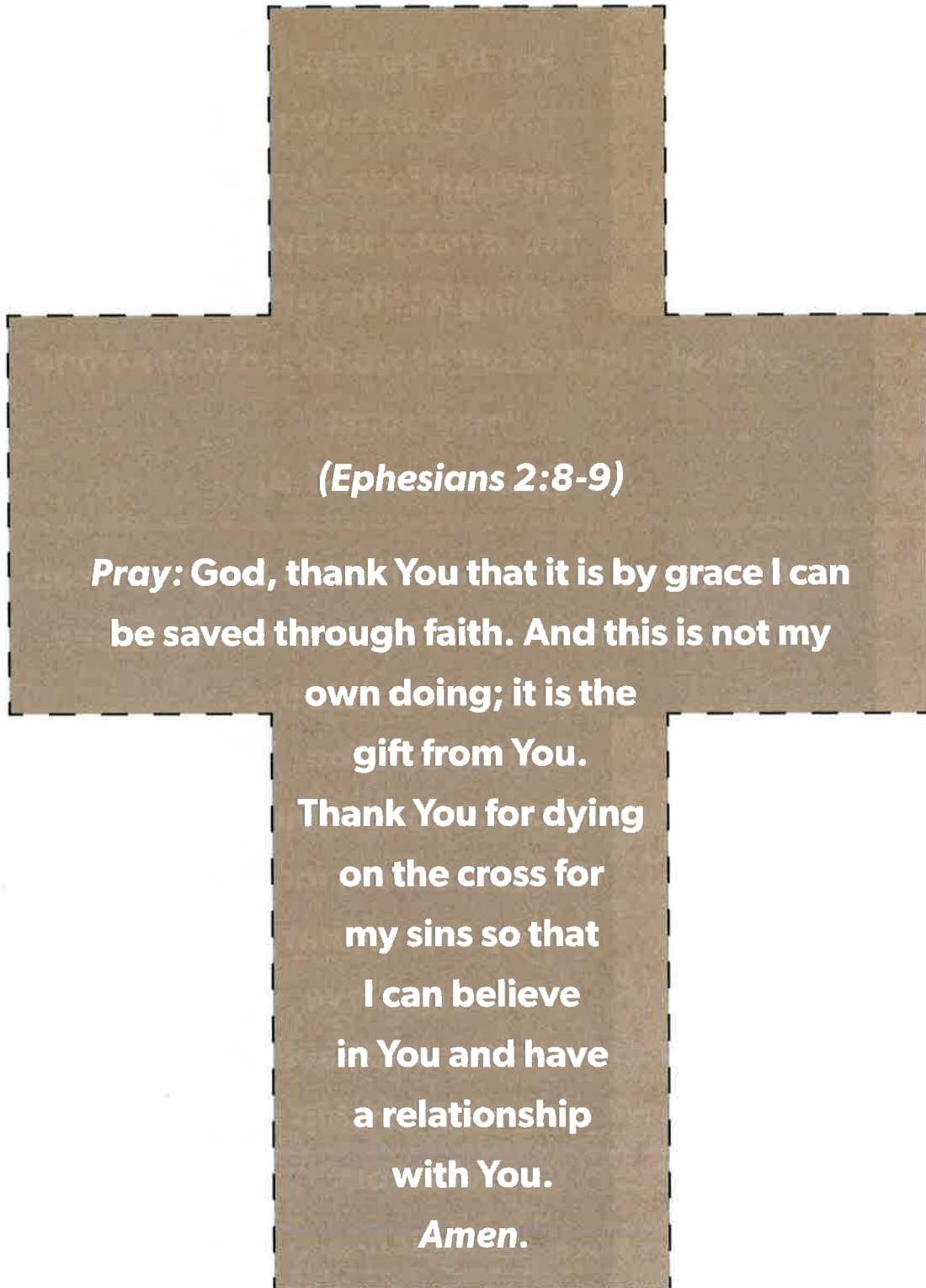


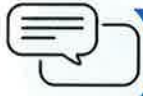

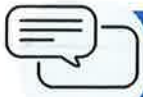

TOWER OF BABEL

(GENESIS 11:1-9) God instructed the people to fill the earth, but instead, they gathered in one spot and built a tower to make a name for themselves. God protected them by confusing their language and scattering them across the earth.

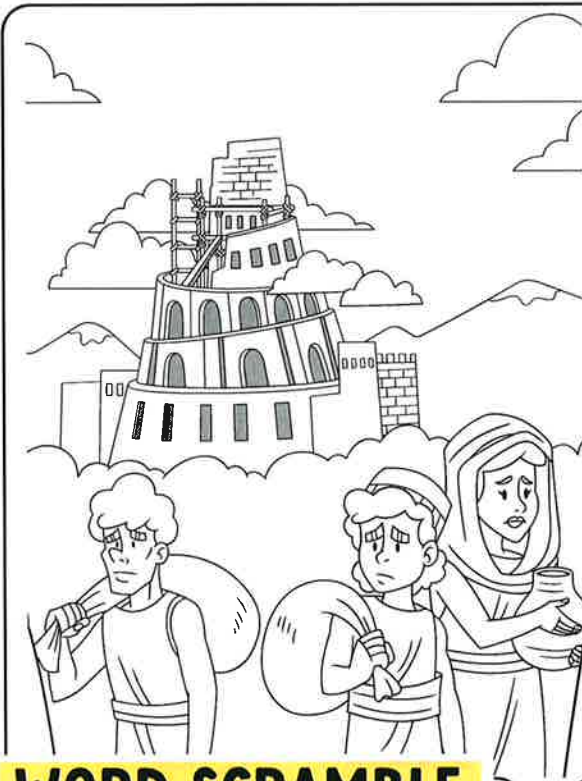
