BIBLE PASSAGE: Genesis 3

FOCUS VERSES: Romans 3:23; Isaiah 59:2; Exodus 15:11; James 4:17

Summary: God created a perfect world where people were in a perfect relationship with Him. A serpent tempted Eve. She and Adam ate fruit from the tree. They became separated from God. They were no longer perfect, and the world was broken by their sin. They hid from God in shame, but the Lord did not leave them without hope. He promised a Savior who would defeat the serpent and free all people from the power of sin.

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: HELPING KIDS BELONG

Child disciplinarians create environments where every kid feels loved and known and has a sense of belonging.

- **Kids need to feel safe.** For kids to feel like church is a place where they belong, they must feel physically, emotionally and spiritually safe. Set boundaries for behavior and make your group a friendly, welcoming space for everyone.
- **Kids need to feel noticed.** You will have kids who come in loud, seeking attention. You will have kids who barely say a word and try to blend in. Every kid needs you to look in their eyes and acknowledge how glad you are they are there. Stand by the door as kids enter and personally welcome each one.
- **Kids need to feel known.** Use Belong activities to connect with kids and get to know them on a personal level. Ask questions about their families and interests. Remember special interests they name (even if you have to write it down.)

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: DOES GOD PUNISH US?

In 2017, 50 percent of adult believers said they believe God has punished them in their lifetime.* Many kids grow up with an unhealthy fear of God that follows them into adulthood. They could grow up obeying out of fear instead of love, or they could grow up angry with God. In today's lesson, kids will learn that sin has serious consequences but that God sent a Savior to free us from the consequence of sin that we deserve: eternal separation from Him. His desire isn't to make us face punishment, but His desire is that we would all be free from sin. Help kids see how very much God loves them. The story of Adam and Eve is a sad one where the world was broken by sin, but God's grace, mercy and love for His people are clear.

Bible TEACHING

THE FALL GENESIS 3



PRAY: God, You are perfect and holy and we are not. May these verses make us thankful that although we have gone our own way, You made a way for us to enjoy closeness with You again. Amen.

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, 5 candles, matches, table

PREP:

Place the 5 candles on a table at the front of your space. Have matches out of view but accessible.

LEADER TIP:

Do not allow kids access to matches or lighters. Have a fire extinguisher nearby.

Begin by lighting all the candles.

Say: These candles today represent the light found in God's presence. God created us all to be close to Him and enjoy His light and life forever. When we choose our way instead of God's way, we separate ourselves from closeness to God. Today's story is about the very first time that ever happened.

Say: God's first people, Adam and Eve, lived in the beautiful garden of Eden in a perfect relationship with God. God placed the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the middle of the garden. God told Adam to eat from any tree except for that one. God told him, "If you eat of it, you will surely die."

Show teaching illustration: Tree of Knowledge

Say: There was a serpent who was sneakier and more deceitful than any other wild animal God had made. One day, the serpent said to Eve, "Did God actually say, 'You cannot eat from any tree in the garden'?" Eve replied, "We may eat the fruit from the trees in the garden, but God told us not to even touch the tree of knowledge of good and evil."

Say: Wait a minute! God didn't say not to touch the tree. Eve added to His words! In this moment, do we think Eve is thinking about obeying God or is her mind on that fruit in that tree? It seems like she's thinking about the fruit.

Blow out the first candle.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Read Genesis 3:4–5 directly from the Bible: *But the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die. For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”*

Say: When the woman saw that the fruit looked very good and that it would make her wise, she took the fruit and ate it.

Say: In this moment, Eve definitely chose disobedience and darkness over the light found in God’s presence.

Blow out the second candle.

Say: She also gave some to Adam, and he ate it.

Show teaching illustration: Adam and Eve Eating the Fruit

Say: Now both have chosen sin instead of following God’s command.

Blow out the third candle.

Say: Then both of their eyes were opened. Immediately they were ashamed and hid.

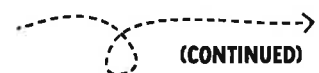
Say: When God walked through the garden, He called to Adam, who was hiding. Adam confessed that he ate the fruit, but he blamed it on Eve. Eve blamed it on the serpent. And everything was different.

Say: The blame-game is just another way Adam and Eve chose darkness over the light found close to God.

Blow out the fourth candle.

Say: Sin had entered God’s perfect world. The world was broken, including Adam and Eve’s relationship with God.

Blow out the fifth candle.

 (CONTINUED)

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: They would have to leave the garden. They would one day die instead of living forever with God in His perfect creation. Everything would be harder. God told them that the ground would be difficult for Adam to work and Eve would have pain when having babies. But then He told the serpent that one day there would be a human Child. The serpent would strike the human's heel, but the human would crush the serpent's head. One day, God would send a Rescuer who would destroy sin and death forever.

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus



POINT TO JESUS

Say: God is perfect and holy. When sin entered His perfectly created world, everything was broken, including His relationship with people. Sin is anything we think, do or say that disobeys God. And everyone sins! That means every person is separated from His holiness. That's why God had a plan from the beginning to send Jesus to take the punishment for our sin.

Relight the candles.

Say: Because Jesus died on the cross and rose again, we can be forgiven. One day He will restore all of broken creation and make it new.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids with mobility needs, allow extra space and time for specialized equipment or buddy them up with a familiar friend to assist.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is the Creator. What did you see this week that God created?
4. **Say:** Let's play a game where we will make choices!
5. **Say:** I will call out different sets of choices and point to a side of our space for each choice. Stand up and go to the side of our space that corresponds with the choice you would make.
6. *Point to one side of your space as you read each choice so the kids know where to go. Have them come back to the middle in between each round.*
7. *Listed below are the choices to use for the game:*

• a backpack full of candy	OR	a hat full of ice cream
• a day at the pool	OR	a day at the beach
• tacos for dinner	OR	chicken nuggets for dinner
• lunch with a movie star	OR	your favorite teacher
• playing with a puppy	OR	riding a pony
• riding a roller coaster	OR	riding an elephant
• playing a game	OR	reading a book
• camping in a tent	OR	going to a store
8. **Say:** Those were some fun and silly choices we made today. But not all choices are silly or fun. Sometimes we are faced with choices that are right or wrong.
9. **Discuss:** Can you think of a right choice? What about a wrong choice?


ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

We all make right choices, and sometimes we all make wrong choices. Today we are learning more about that.



TARGET PRACTICE

SUPPLIES:

Printable page, straws (1 per kid), cotton swabs (5 per kid), painter's tape

PREP:

Print two copies of the printable page. Use the painter's tape to tape the two targets on the wall and a line on the floor a short distance from each target.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids that have health issues and/or struggle with the straw, allow them to throw it like a dart instead.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is the Creator. What did you see this week that God created?
4. **Discuss:** Have you ever tried to throw or shoot something at a target? Did you ever hit the middle of the target?
5. **Say:** Let's play a game to see if you can hit the bull's-eye of this target with these cotton swabs!
6. *Divide kids into two teams and have each team line up across from one of the targets. Give each team a handful of cotton swabs.*
7. **Say:** Each of you will have five chances to place a cotton swab in your straw and blow it on the target, trying to hit the bull's-eye.
8. *Demonstrate trying to hit the target.*
9. *Allow kids to take turns blowing the swabs at the target.*
10. **Discuss:** Who was able to hit the bull's-eye every time?
11. **Discuss:** Do you think if you practiced really hard, you could hit the bull's-eye every time?

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

The Bible teaches that when we disobey God, it is called sin. The word "sin" actually means "missing the mark." It is a lot like the game we played today. Today's true story from the Bible is about how sin entered the perfect world God created.



VERSE TREE

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, teaching slide, printable pages, scissors, glue sticks (1 per kid)

PREP:

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide. Print the printable pages and cut out (1 tree and set of verses per kid).

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Pair kids who may struggle with this activity with a friend who can help.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find Colossians 1:16 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** What was created through and for God?
3. **Discuss:** What happened when Adam and Eve ate the fruit from the tree?
4. **Say:** Sin entered the world after Adam and Eve disobeyed God.
5. **Discuss:** Does God do anything wrong?
6. **Say:** God is holy. He never sins. He created a perfect world that was broken by sin.
7. **Say:** There is good news! God loves us so much, He doesn't want to be separated from us. He always had a plan to save us from our sins. God created us to have a relationship with Him.
8. *Review the verse a few times together.*
9. **Say:** Let's make a tree with the words of our verse to help us remember it!
10. *Pass out a tree template, set of verse leaves and glue to each kid.*
11. *Encourage kids to put the verse in order and glue the leaves on the tree.*
12. *Demonstrate how to glue them to the tree starting with the first words at the top of the tree so the verse is easily read.*
13. *Give kids time to create their trees.*
14. *Review the verse together several times.*

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

God doesn't want our sin to keep us separated from Him! He had a plan to save us, free us from our sin and fix our relationship with Him. God created us for Himself!



GOD AND SIN

SUPPLIES:

Bible, 2 balloons, string, scissors, 2 washcloths

PREP:

Inflate the balloons. Cut a long piece of string and tie it to one balloon. Either hang it from the ceiling so it is at a comfortable height or have someone hold the string and suspend the balloon.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Avoid popping balloons if there are kids with sound sensitivities in the room.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** What happened because of Adam and Eve's sin?
2. **Say:** One consequence of sin is that we are separated from God.
3. **Discuss:** Does God ever sin?
4. **Read:** 1 Samuel 2:2 and Exodus 15:11.
5. **Discuss:** What do these verses tell us about God?
6. **Say:** God never sins. He never does wrong. That's because God is holy. That means He is set apart and perfect.
7. *Point to the balloon with the string.*
8. **Say:** This balloon represents God. The other balloon represents sin.
9. **Discuss:** What is sin?
10. **Say:** Sin is anything we think, say or do that disobeys God.
11. **Discuss:** What are some examples of sins that everyone commits?
12. **Discuss:** Can sin be near God?
13. *Choose two kids. Give each kid a washcloth and have them rub the washcloth on the balloon to create an electric charge.*
14. *Move the sin balloon close to the God balloon.*
15. **Discuss:** What happened? What does this tell us about God and sin?
16. **Say:** God is holy. He never sins. He created a perfect world that was broken by sin. People were separated from God.

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

The amazing thing is that that isn't the end of the story! God had a great big plan to save us from our sins so that we can be with Him again!



Discipleship DISCUSSION

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR FOLLOWERS OF JESUS?

Discuss: How does this true story from the Bible show us that God is good?

Say: Even though we mess up, God never does. He is holy and good. He loves people so much that He had a plan all along to rescue us from sin. He has always been completely good and always will be!

Read Mark 10:18b directly from the Bible: *No one is good except God alone.*

BUT WHAT ABOUT ... IS GOD PUNISHING ME?

Discuss: Have you ever heard someone say God was mad at them when something bad happened?

Discuss: What do you think about that?

Discuss: What do you think God says about that?

Say: Sometimes you may have wondered, "When bad things happen, is God punishing me?" It's not wrong to wonder about this. Bad things happen as a consequence of sin entering the world. Sometimes it IS a consequence of something we have done, but because we live in a sinful and fallen world, none of us are free from trouble and sadness. When it comes to specific bad things that happen in our lives, we may never know why they occurred. But we can be certain that God isn't "getting back at us" for a sin we committed or because He doesn't love us anymore. God loves us always, no matter what. He proved that by sending Jesus to take the punishment for our sin. Romans 5:8 says: *but God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*



DISAPPEARING SIN

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, strong paper towel (1 per kid + 1), permanent marker, washable markers, bin, water

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Draw a person outline in permanent marker on a paper towel (1 per kid + 1). Fill the bin with water.

LEADER TIP: Make sure to practice this ahead of time as different brands of washable markers and paper towels react differently with water.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Say:** The Bible tells us in Romans 3:23 that everyone sins. When sin entered the world through Adam and Eve's disobedience, the whole world fell into sin.
2. **Discuss:** What is the good news for us?
3. **Say:** Have you ever seen a disappearing illusion? Those tricks are really fun to watch, but they are not real. It's hard to make something really disappear. However, when God forgives us, He cleanses us (1 John 1:9) and removes our sin (Psalm 103:12). Our sin really does disappear!
4. *Take out a paper towel and point to the person on it.*
5. **Say:** This is us. We have all sinned.
6. **Discuss:** What are some ways that you've sinned before?
7. *Write kids' responses on the person outline with washable markers.*
8. **Say:** God doesn't want these sins to separate us from Him! He had a plan to save us from our sin. We can ask God for forgiveness. Now when He sees us, He doesn't see our sin!
9. *Dip the paper towel in the water carefully and swish it around. Then pull it out. The "sins" will disappear!*
10. *Give everyone a paper towel with a person outline on it. Encourage them to write or draw some examples of sin, or they can color it with scribbles to represent sin. Let them each dip their person in the water to make the sin disappear.*
11. **Pray:** God, You are holy and perfect. Thank You for forgiving our sins. Please help us to trust You and follow Your ways. Amen.
12. **Say:** God is holy. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.



THANK YOU BRACELET

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, printable page, scissors, tape

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Print the printable page and cut out (1 per kid).

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** Did Adam and Eve follow God's way or their own way? Why?
2. **Discuss:** Why do people do wrong things?
3. **Say:** Sin is anything we think, say or do that disobeys God. Everyone sins, choosing our way instead of God's way.
4. **Read:** Isaiah 59:2.
5. **Discuss:** What is the consequence of our sin?
6. **Say:** God is holy and perfect. The consequence of our sin is separation from God. God loves us so much, He doesn't want to be separated from us forever.
7. **Discuss:** What did God do to save us from our sin?
8. **Say:** God sent Jesus to take the punishment for our sin. When we choose to believe in Jesus, He gives us new life in Him. Let's make a bracelet and then pray and thank God for sending Jesus to save us from our sin.
9. *Pass out the supplies. Read the wording on the bracelet aloud.*
10. *Give kids time to decorate their bracelets.*
11. **Say:** Let's talk to God. Let's thank Him for loving us so much that He sent Jesus to take the punishment for our sins and fix our relationship with Him.
12. *Invite kids to hold their bracelets and pray to God.*
13. **After a few minutes, pray:** Dear God, thank You for always forgiving us when we sin. Thank You for making a way for us to be with You forever. Amen.
14. *Help kids secure the bracelets around their wrists with tape.*
15. **Say:** God is holy. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.

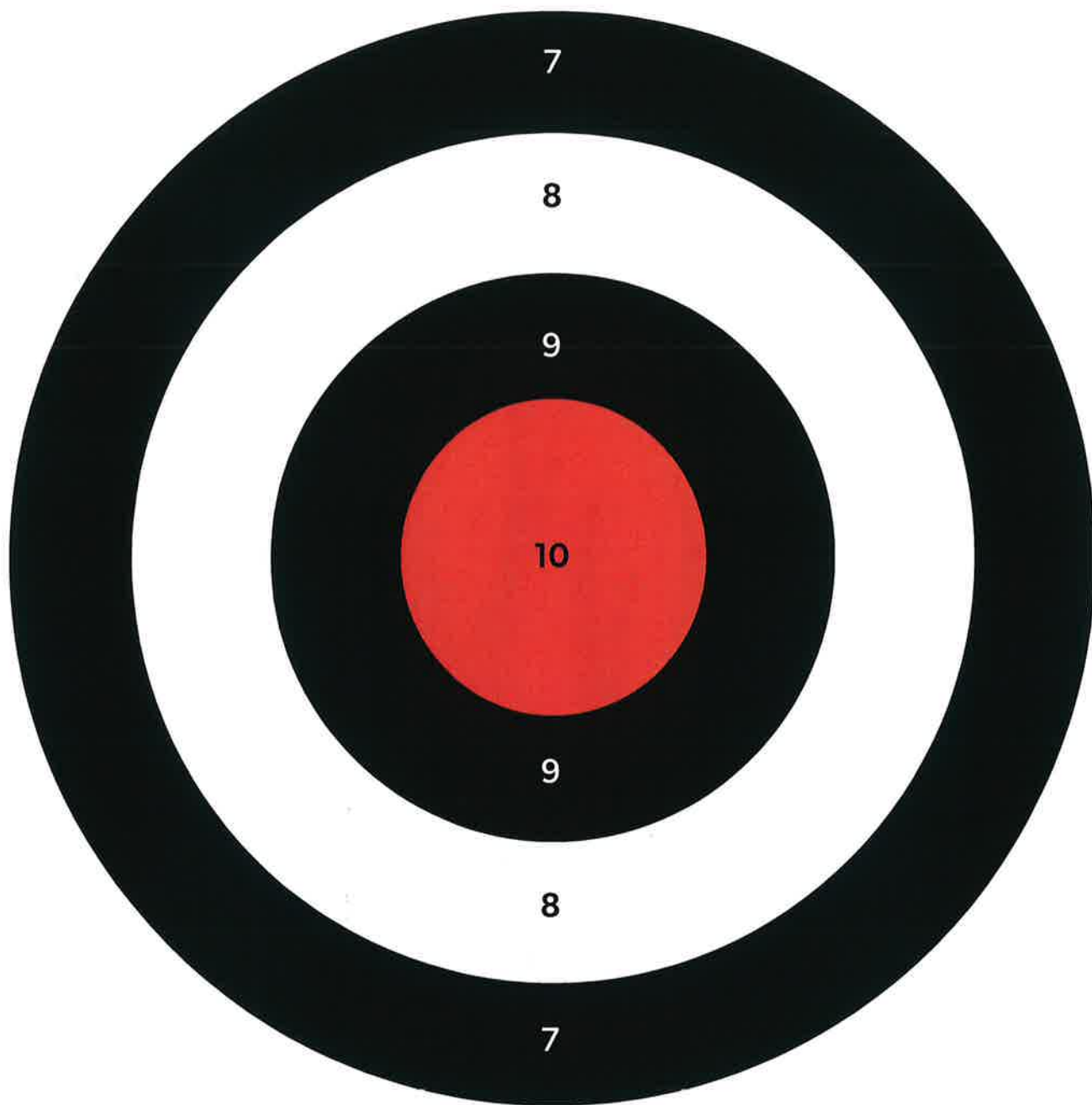
