



TOWER OF BABEL

BIBLE PASSAGE: Genesis 11:1-9

FOCUS VERSES: Jeremiah 10:6; Psalm 86:8-10; John 14:6

Summary: God instructed people to fill the Earth. Instead, they chose to gather in one spot and build a city, including a great tower so that they could make a name for themselves. God protected them from their wrong desires by confusing their language. They couldn't understand each other and stopped trying to build the city. God scattered the people throughout the earth.

We will go deeper in God's truth by answering these questions:



WHO IS GREATER THAN GOD?

No one will ever be greater than God. Because He is the Creator, He is in charge of all things.



IS THERE A WAY FOR US TO GET TO GOD?

Because our sin separates us from God, believing in Jesus is the only way to have a relationship with Him.



HOW IS GOD INVITING ME TO RESPOND?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: HELPING KIDS BELIEVE

There are key elements in Brite that help kids grow in understanding the Bible so they can believe in Jesus.

- **God's Big Story.** Kids need to understand that individual Bible stories are pieces of one bigger story. God's story of creation, the fall, redemption and restoration helps kids develop a worldview that is consistent with reality.
- **He/We/Me Questions.** These questions help kids discover that every passage can teach us something about who God is and what He wants for His people. Kids can also begin to listen to the Holy Spirit to determine what God is inviting them to do in response to His Word.
- **Point to Jesus.** Kids need to understand that the whole Bible points to Jesus. Don't miss opportunities each week to remind kids of the Gospel and what Jesus has done for them.
- **Use the Bible.** As you teach, hold a Bible in your hand to reinforce where truth comes from. Include times for kids to physically touch Bibles and practice looking up verses. You'll be surprised how much they love this!

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: IS JESUS REALLY THE ONLY WAY TO HEAVEN?

Almost half of American adults believe that you can work your way to heaven. * Most people, even when we know Jesus, default to a works-based approach to our faith. Combine this with the plurality of religious beliefs kids are exposed to, and it is likely that kids can be confused about salvation. In today's lesson, kids will learn that God made a way for us to be with Him through Jesus. There may be kids in your group who believe that everyone goes to heaven. Some may believe that all religions are the same. Encourage kids to talk about what they have heard. Gently correct theology while being sensitive that these conversations may be very personal if kids have loved ones who believe different things. Avoid sounding judgmental by pointing to Scripture and being cautious with broad statements. Remind kids that only God knows individuals' hearts and that He gives us the big job of sharing His truth with others.

Bible TEACHING

TOWER OF BABEL GENESIS 11:1-9



PRAY: God, Your ways are the best way and no one is greater than You! May we see in Your Word today that Your plans always win and our best hope is found in following Jesus. Amen.

Place the box with nothing written on the side in front of your space. This will be the first box of your tower. Have the other boxes nearby, ready to be stacked.

Say: The world did not get better after Adam and Eve sinned. The wickedness grew greater and greater, to the point that God sent a massive flood, destroying the Earth and all of the people except for one family.

Invite a volunteer to stack the "wickedness grew" cardboard box on the first box. Have the volunteer read the words on the box for the group.

Say: God instructed Noah to build an ark and God used the ark to protect Noah's family and many animals. After the flood, God told His people to multiply, spread out and fill the whole earth.

Say: At this time, everyone on Earth spoke the same language. Instead of spreading out, many gathered together in one area.

Invite a volunteer to stack the "gathered together" cardboard box on the stack of boxes. Have the volunteer read the words on the box for the group.

Read Genesis 11:4 directly from the Bible: *Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth."*

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, 5 large cardboard boxes, permanent marker, dollar bill, flashlight, remote control

PREP:

Write the following phrases on the side of four boxes: "wickedness grew," "gathered together," "make a tower," and "their way." Place the dollar bill, flashlight and remote control inside the fifth box with no writing on the side.

LEADER TIP:

Use bigger boxes for a more dramatic effect.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Invite a volunteer to stack the “make a tower” cardboard box on the stack of boxes. Have the volunteer read the words on the box for the group.

Show teaching illustration: The Tower of Babel

Say: The people had made a grand plan, but it wasn’t God’s plan. They were focused on making sure other people noticed them by doing things their way instead of God’s way.

Invite a volunteer to stack the “their way” cardboard box on the stack of boxes. Have the volunteer read the words on the box for the group.

Say: God knew all of the people working together to try to live life their own way was not good. He saved them from themselves.

Say: God confused their language. All of a sudden, everyone was speaking a different language and no one could understand each other. It was impossible for them to work together to build a tower. God scattered them all over the world, just like He had told them to do in the first place.

Show teaching illustration: People Scattered

Scatter the boxes around the front of your space.

Say: The place was called Babel, and it is remembered as the place where God confused languages. The people believed the city would be a symbol of their own greatness, but instead God proved He is the greatest of all! Still today people try to achieve greatness in lots of wrong ways.

Pick up the box with no writing, open the top and pull out the dollar bill.

Say: Some people believe if they get piles of money that will make them great.

Pull the flashlight out of the box, turn it on and shine it on yourself.

Say: Others believe if they live in the spotlight and get really famous and popular that will make them great.

Pull the remote control out of the box.



Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: Some believe if they can get big, important jobs so that they can control other people, that is how they will make themselves great. But everyone should learn the important lesson the people of Babel had to learn—no one is greater than God.

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus



POINT TO JESUS

Say: God wants a relationship with His people, but it has to be on His terms, not ours. No one is greater than Him. Because He is great and holy, our sin separates us from Him. We can't do anything on our own to fix that. He has given us a path to a relationship with Him that is based on His grace and forgiveness, not our hard work. Even if we are famous and the whole world knows who we are, it doesn't matter if we don't know Jesus.

Read John 14:6 directly from the Bible: *Jesus said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."*

Say: We can only have a relationship with God when we turn from our sin and trust in Jesus as our Savior.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For active learners, waiting their turn will be difficult. Provide specific instructions of how and where to wait and positive peers next to them.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is the Creator. What did you see this week that God created?
4. *Line the kids up so they are all in a single file, facing the same direction.*
5. *Give the kid at the end of the line a secret message, such as "Turn out the light" or "Give a friend a high-five." Tell them they must use only their hands and facial expressions to share the message. They cannot talk.*
6. *The kid in front of them will turn to face them to receive the message.*
7. *Repeat these steps until you reach the kid at the front of the line.*
8. *Have the kid at the front of the line share the message and see how close it was to the original message.*
9. **Discuss:** How did it feel to have to figure out the message?

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

We experienced what it was like to communicate with someone who had no idea what we were saying. Today we are learning about a group of people who ended up having a tricky time communicating!



MARSHMALLOW TOWER

SUPPLIES:

Mini-marshmallows (10 per kid), toothpicks (10 per kid), plates (1 per 2 kids)

PREP:

None

LEADER TIP: To prep ahead, place 20 mini-marshmallows and 20 toothpicks on each plate.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Support active learners by giving them specific instructions and then give only one or two toothpicks/marshmallows at a time in order to prevent unsafe misuse of tools.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is the Creator. What did you see this week that God created?
4. **Say:** Let's work in pairs to build the biggest and strongest tower using these toothpicks and marshmallows!
5. *Divide kids into pairs.*
6. *Pass out supplies to each pair.*
7. **Say:** You can build however you would like, but your tower must be able to stand on its own.
8. *Give kids time to create their towers.*
9. *Have pairs present their towers to everyone.*
10. **Say:** Your towers look amazing! Was it easy or hard to work together? Would it have been harder if you couldn't understand each other?
11. **Discuss:** Do you think it would be hard to build a real-life strong tower? Why?

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

Today we are learning a story about when people built a huge tower to make a name for themselves. God confused their language and proved that no one is greater than God.



TOWER VERSES

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, teaching slide, string, scissors, 3 sets of blocks

PREP:

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide. Cut a piece of string so that it will be longer than all the blocks stacked together.

LEADER TIP: Make as many smaller groups as you like but ensure you have enough blocks for each group to build the verse (21 blocks per group).

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find Colossians 1:16 in their Bible. Read the verse aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** What does our verse tell us about God?
3. **Discuss:** How is God different from people?
4. *Divide kids into three groups. Give each group a set of blocks.*
5. *Have kids take turns saying a word of the verse and adding a block to their tower.*
6. *Congratulate kids once their towers are built.*
7. *Say the verse together several times.*
8. **Say:** Now I will see if your tower is greater than my string! To win, your tower must be taller than this string.
9. *Measure each tower with the string.*
10. **Discuss:** What was greater, my string or your tower?
11. **Discuss:** Who is greater than God?
12. **Say:** No one will ever be greater than God. Because He is the Creator, He is in charge of all things.
13. **Say:** Just like my string was greater, God is always greater!

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

Our awesome Creator is also our Savior. He loves each of you so much! You were made through Him and for Him!



GOD IS GREAT GAME

SUPPLIES:

Bible, printable page, scissors, paper bag, ball

PREP:

Print the printable page and cut out. Place the cards in the bag.

LEADER TIP: Play music with the game! Just stop the music, and whoever is holding the ball when the music stops picks a card.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids with mobility needs, allow extra space and time for specialized equipment or buddy them up with a familiar friend to assist.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** Why did the people in the story build the tower?
2. **Discuss:** In today's story, what did God do to show that He is the greatest?
3. **Say:** No one will ever be greater than God. He created everything and is in charge of everything.
4. **Say:** Let's play a game to learn about what makes God the greatest, greater than anyone else.
5. *Gather kids in a circle.*
6. **Say:** To play, we will toss the ball around the circle. When I say stop, we will pick a card from this bag and learn about what makes God the greatest!
7. **Say:** After we read the verse, we will all yell, "No one is greater than God!"
8. *Start tossing the ball around the circle.*
9. *Randomly stop the game.*
10. *Invite whoever is holding the ball to pick a card out of the bag.*
11. *Read the card aloud and discuss the question or do the activity together.*
12. *Invite everyone to yell out, "No one is greater than God!"*
13. *Continue playing until all the cards have been picked or as long as you have time.*
14. **Discuss:** Who is greater than God?
15. **Say:** No one will ever be greater than God. Because He is the Creator, He is in charge of all things.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

The Bible is full of stories that show how great God is. The greatest thing He did was send Jesus to die for our sins so we can live with Him forever.



Discipleship DISCUSSION

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR FOLLOWERS OF JESUS?

Discuss: How does this true story from the Bible show us that God is good?

Say: God works all things for good, even our own choices to do things our way instead of His. The people in today's story were prideful, yet God loved them too much to let them do their own thing and continue to disobey Him.

Read Nahum 1:7 directly from the Bible: *The Lord is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble; He knows those who take refuge in Him.*

BUT WHAT ABOUT ... IS JESUS REALLY THE ONLY WAY TO HEAVEN?

Discuss: Have you ever heard someone say something like "all paths lead to God"? What would that mean?

Discuss: Have you ever heard kids talk about other ways that people can go to heaven?

Discuss: What does God have to say about that?

Say: Some people say that if God loves everyone, He will make many paths to get to Him. Some people think all gods and all religions are ultimately the same and if you just believe in anything, you will go to heaven. All of that sounds good, but the truth is we can only go to heaven when our sin is removed, and there are no other paths that remove our sin. Being good doesn't remove our sin, because we will always sin more. We need grace and forgiveness. That only comes through Jesus. John 14:6 says: *Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."*



SHARE AND CARE

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, whiteboard, dry-erase marker, paper (1 per kid)

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid).

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** What were the people trying to do in our story? Did it work? Why not?
2. **Discuss:** Is there a way for us to get to God?
3. **Say:** Because our sin separates us from God, believing in Jesus is the only way to have a relationship with Him.
4. **Say:** God made one way for us to live with Him forever. We can trust in Jesus as our Savior and live with God forever!
5. *Use the whiteboard to draw the symbols and talk through the Gospel message:*
 - **Circle:** God made the world and He is in charge.
 - **Down arrow:** Sin entered the world when Adam and Eve disobeyed God. Sin is anything we think, say or do that disobeys God. We all sin and cannot save ourselves.
 - **Cross:** God loved us so much He sent Jesus to die on the cross for our sins. Three days later He rose again, making it possible for us to be forgiven and be right with God.
 - **Up arrow:** When we trust in Jesus as our Savior, He makes our relationship right with God and we can live with Him forever.
 - **Sideways arrow:** We can choose to follow Him and share His love with others!
6. *Have kids use their papers to copy the symbols from the whiteboard. If time allows, have kids partner up and practice sharing the Gospel using the symbols.*
7. **Pray:** God, You are strong and powerful, loving and caring. Thank You for being so great and caring for everyone. Amen.
8. **Say:** No one is greater than God. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.



MADE A WAY

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, printable pages, painter's tape

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Print the printable pages. Make two lines of painter's tape on the floor of your space. Make them far enough apart from each other that kids will not be able to reach across when they try.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For active learners and added structure, provide a specific spot for them to sit while on the floor or allow them to sit on a chair with the group.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** Why did God confuse the language of the people?
2. **Say:** God knew that the people would continue trying to reach God by trying to do great things on their own.
3. *Have kids line up on one side of the painter's tape line. Encourage kids to try to reach the other side without stepping into the space in the middle. Tell kids to just keep trying harder. Have everyone sit down on that side.*
4. **Discuss:** Could the people build a tower high enough to get to God? Can we work hard enough to get to God?
5. **Read:** John 14:6.
6. **Discuss:** What does this tell us about having a friendship with God?
7. **Say:** The only way to be with God is by believing in Jesus and accepting His forgiveness for our sin. God has done amazing things in the Bible to show that no one is greater than Him, but the best thing God did was to send Jesus for us.
8. *Place the printable pages on the floor, forming a path from one painter's tape line to the other, across the middle of the empty space.*
9. **Say:** When we trust in Jesus as our Savior, we will be saved. Walk across the path to the other side! When you get there, tell us one thing to praise God for!
10. *Close your time in prayer, praising Jesus that He made a way for us to be saved!*
11. **Pray:** God, You are strong and powerful, loving and caring. Thank You for being so great and caring for everyone. Amen.
12. **Say:** No one is greater than God. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.
