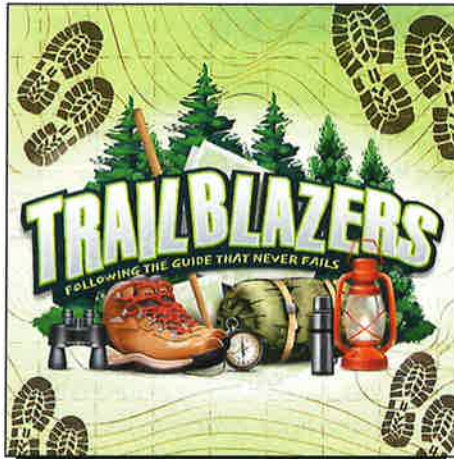




THE SUN STOOD STILL

BIBLE PASSAGE: Joshua 10; 13

FOCUS VERSES: Hebrews 10:23, Numbers 23:19,
Deuteronomy 7:9

Summary: The Israelites, led by Joshua, conquered Canaanite cities as God had promised. When several kings attacked a city named Gibeon, Joshua came to help. God told him not to fear and promised victory. Joshua prayed for the sun to stand still, and God answered, giving them more time to fight. The Israelites defeated their enemies, conquered more land, and Joshua divided it among the twelve tribes. The Promised Land became theirs, just as God said.

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: BE PLAYFUL

When a kid does not meet expectations, engaging in play with them is often not our first response. However, when we approach a kid with a warm and playful demeanor, the kid will often begin to calm so we can better identify the need driving the behavior. Need help being more playful? Try these ideas:

- **Use your “fun” voice.** While it’s easy to go straight to our authoritative voice when a kid’s behavior is challenging, next time use your “fun” voice when redirecting or correcting. A playful voice signals to the kid that you are on their side and will work with them.
- **Play.** Relationships are built through shared fun experiences. As you build a relationship with a kid, correction and coaching will be more effective. Sit down on the floor, grab a truck, or join a kid who is coloring.
- **Start with play.** Telling a kid that our room is a fun space is not enough. We need to show them. Greeting them with a fist bump or high five is a great way to start your interaction with connection and fun. Have toys and craft supplies accessible to kids as soon as they arrive. Offering play immediately upon arrival helps ease the transition from their caregiver.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: DIVORCE

One of the most significant ways kids experience the pain of broken promises is when divorce happens within their family. Research reveals 30 percent of kids experience their parents’ divorce.* When a kid experiences divorce, their whole world is affected. They may struggle emotionally, physically and socially. Also, their impression of promises and adults doing what they say may be jaded. You will likely have kids in your group whose parents have been through a divorce. In today’s lesson, they will learn that God always does what He says. Kids who have been hurt may struggle with believing that. They may wonder why a promise-keeping God would let their family go through so much. You can listen to kids’ struggles without judging their family. Point to God’s faithfulness, even when it takes time to see how He’s moving. Kids can learn that God won’t lie or break promises.

Bible TEACHING

THE SUN STOOD STILL JOSHUA 10; 13



PRAY: God, You do amazing things! Things we can't even understand! If You say it, You do it. Help us to learn from Joshua and this mighty miracle today. Amen.

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, envelope

PREP:

None

LEADER TIP:

For smaller groups, kids can play multiple roles.

Say: After many years of wandering in the wilderness, Moses had died and Joshua was the new leader of the Israelites. They began conquering cities to take over the land that God had promised.

Have one volunteer stand and salute. That volunteer is now Joshua. After saluting, Joshua can sit back down.

Say: The kings of the land heard how Joshua and the people had defeated cities around them. They wanted to stop him, so they plotted to join together to attack the city of Gibeon.

Have three volunteers stand and pretend to speak angrily to one another. Allow them a few seconds of acting and then have them sit back down.

Say: The men of Gibeon sent word to ask Joshua for help, telling him about the attack that was coming.

Call a volunteer to come to the front of the space, hand them an envelope and have them take it to Joshua. The volunteer can then sit back down.

Show teaching illustration: Men of Gibeon Send Message to Joshua.

Say: Joshua gathered his brave fighting men and headed to Gibeon.

Have three new volunteers stand and flex their muscles. Allow them a few seconds of acting and then have them sit back down.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: Along the way, God spoke to Joshua.

Read Joshua 10:8 directly from the Bible: *And the LORD said to Joshua, "Do not fear them, for I have given them into your hands. Not a man of them shall stand before you."*

Say: Joshua and his men surprised the enemies, attacking them suddenly. The LORD caused the enemies to panic and run.

Have three volunteers stand and act scared and panicked. Allow them to run in place for a few seconds and then sit back down.

Say: Joshua and the Israelites chased after them, knowing that if night came, some of the enemy would escape and their victory would not be complete. Joshua asked God to make the sun stand still so that they could have more daylight to finish the battle.

Have Joshua stand and fold their hands in prayer while you read the verse.

Read Joshua 10:12 directly from the Bible: *At that time Joshua spoke to the LORD in the day when the Lord gave the Amorites over to the sons of Israel, and he said in the sight of Israel, "Sun, stand still at Gibeon, and moon, in the Valley of Aijalon."*

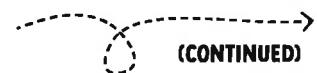
Invite Joshua to sit back down.

Show teaching illustration: *Joshua Prays & Sun Stands Still.*

Say: God answered! God slowed down the sun and it didn't set for a whole day. The Israelites were victorious!

Have the entire group stand and celebrate a great win! After a few seconds of acting, have them sit back down.

Say: Joshua led the Israelites to conquer more cities and to occupy Canaan, the Promised Land. Joshua divided up the land among the twelve tribes of Israel, giving each group their own inheritance.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: God kept His promise to Joshua that they would win the battle. He kept an even bigger promise when they took over Canaan. Just like He had promised Abram, Isaac, Jacob and Moses, God gave His people their own land.

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus.



POINT TO JESUS

Say: Throughout the Old Testament, God promised hundreds of times that He would send a Rescuer who would save the people from their sin. God kept His promise by sending Jesus, a descendant of Abraham, to Earth to die on the cross for our sins. God promises that when we trust in Jesus for forgiveness of our sins, we will live forever with Him. He always does what He says.

LEADER TIP: Kids will be promising to do something with these objects. Swap them out for easy items you have on hand. Just ensure that every group gets one.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Strategically divide kids into groups with stronger peers who could naturally assist.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God never fails. How have you seen this week that God hasn't failed you?
4. *Divide kids into four groups and give each group one of each item.*
5. **Discuss:** What can you do with these items?
6. *Have kids decide in their groups something they could accomplish with their items. It could be Hula Hooping for one minute straight, throwing a ball through the Hula Hoop into the basket or using the jump rope in a creative way. They will have one minute to perform their task for the group.*
7. *Have each group promise to accomplish their task one at a time and perform their task for everyone.*
8. **Discuss:** Were you able to keep your promise? What went right? What went wrong? Did you fail?
9. **Discuss:** How could you have kept your promise?
10. **Say:** You all worked so hard to keep your promise but sometimes we fail.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Today, we are discovering not only that God keeps every promise He makes but why He does that. God always does what He says He will do!



HOLDING TIGHT

SUPPLIES:

None

PREP:

None

LEADER TIP: For abuse-prevention purposes, adults should not join in this game.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Some kids may not like crowded spaces or people touching them. Allow them to participate by guiding other kids in untangling from the outside of the circle.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God never fails. How have you seen this week that God hasn't failed you?
4. *Divide kids into teams of four.*
5. **Say:** Let's get ourselves into a tricky situation and see if we can work together to get out of it!
6. *Encourage teams to circle up arm-width apart with one another. Kids will reach across the circle and hold hands with two different people, but not two people who are standing on either side of them. Their right hands should be holding other right hands and their left hands holding left hands. Each team will be in a big knot.*
7. *Allow teams to try to untangle themselves. They may not let go of each other's hands. Help and instruct as needed.*
8. *After groups are finished, bring them together for group discussion.*
9. **Discuss:** How hard (or easy) was it to hold onto each other's hands while you were trying to untangle yourselves? Did anyone let go of any of their teammates' hands?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Sometimes it can be hard for us to hold onto God and trust what He says. The great news is that God doesn't have a hard time holding onto us and doing what He says He will do. Today we are learning about Joshua and how God held onto Joshua and kept His promise.



SUNS AND MOONS

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, teaching slide, printable pages, scissors, painter's tape, chairs (1 per kid)

PREP:

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide. Print the printable pages and cut out. Tape a verse card underneath each chair.

LEADER TIP: For large groups, print multiple copies of the verse on different colored paper and divide kids into colored teams.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Assist struggling readers, by allowing them to pair up with a comfortable friend.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find Luke 1:37 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** What seemed impossible for the Israelites?
3. **Discuss:** How did God show that anything was possible for Him?
4. **Say:** Let's work on practicing our verse!
5. *Have everyone sit in a chair with a verse card taped underneath.*
6. *Instruct kids that when you start the game, they will reach under their chair and grab a verse card. Kids will divide into groups based on if their card has a sun or a moon on it. They will work in their groups to put their verse in order and sit down.*
7. *Start the game and cheer kids on! Assist as needed.*
8. *Once both groups have finished and are sitting down, recite the verse together several times.*
9. **Discuss:** Do you ever have a hard time keeping promises that you have made?
10. **Discuss:** Do you think God has a hard time keeping His promises? What does our memory verse have to say about that?
11. *Lead kids to find Numbers 23:19 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
12. **Discuss:** Why does God keep His promises?
13. **Say:** God is completely good. He never lies or changes His mind.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

It is good news that God doesn't ever change His mind. He keeps every promise because nothing is impossible with God.



GOD'S TRACK RECORD

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, writing supplies printable pages, scissors

PREP:

Print the printable pages and cut out. Keep the Leader Guide with you.

LEADER TIP: For smaller groups, give each group multiple track record cards or do the entire activity together and call on various kids to read the verses aloud.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** What promise did God keep in today's story?
2. **Discuss:** What is a track record?
3. **Say:** A track record is a history of what someone has done.
4. **Discuss:** What is God's track record for keeping His promises?
5. **Discuss:** Why does God keep His promises?
6. *Lead kids to find Numbers 23:19 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
7. **Say:** God is always good! He never changes or lies. He kept every promise He made in the Bible, and we can trust His track record to keep them in the future.
8. **Say:** The Bible is full of promises God made. Let's take a look at God's track record of keeping His promises.
9. *Divide kids into six groups. Pass out a track record card to each group.*
10. *Have kids work together in their groups to read in their Bibles what God's promise was and if He kept His promise.*
11. *Give groups time to complete the activity and help as needed.*
12. *Invite each group to share their promise of God and if He kept it.*
13. **Discuss:** Can you trust God to keep His promises?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

God always keeps His promises! He is always good and we can trust what He says.

 Discipleship DISCUSSION**HOW CAN I KNOW THIS IS TRUE?**

Discuss: What would you think if the sun stopped moving in the sky?

Say: The Bible says God made the sun stand still so Joshua could win the battle. An ancient Israelite record called the Book of Jashar (mentioned in Joshua) recorded this moment, showing the event was remembered in history. Scientists have studied ancient eclipse records and found that a solar eclipse in 1207 BC was visible in this region, which some link to this event. Archaeologists have uncovered cities like Gibeon and Lachish, where this battle took place, confirming the locations are real. At Gibeon, excavations revealed large stone-cut pools, wine cellars, and jar handles stamped with "GB'N" from the Late Bronze Age. At Lachish, digs found massive destruction layers with burned grain stores and collapsed walls from around 1200 BC. These discoveries show the story happened in real places and remind us that God has power even over the sun and sky.

Read Joshua 10:13 directly from the Bible: *And the sun stood still, and the moon stopped, until the nation took vengeance on their enemies.*

BUT WHAT ABOUT ... DIVORCE?

Discuss: What are some important promises that adults make?

Discuss: What happens when adults who are married to each other don't keep their promise to stay married?

Discuss: What do you think God has to say about that?

Say: God designed marriage to be between a man and a woman forever. But even after a husband and wife promise to stay married forever, they sometimes don't. Some families go through a divorce, which is very hard for everyone. The Bible tells us that God doesn't like divorce. He knows how much it hurts the whole family. But He always loves the people who are involved with the divorce. Some of you may have parents who are divorced, and you know how hard it can be. Our world is broken by sin. Moms and dads are human and make mistakes. Sometimes the adults we love don't keep their promises. That hurts. We can turn to God and talk to Him about our hurt. We can also trust that He will always be there for us and always keeps every promise. Psalm 46:1 reminds us: *God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.*



STANDING ON HIS PROMISES

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, Take-Home page, writing supplies, printable pages

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Print the printable pages (1 verse per 2 kids).

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids needing more structure during the activity, buddy them with a calm friend and check in with them frequently to ensure on-task behaviors.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** How did God keep His promise to Joshua?
2. **Discuss:** Does God keep promises to us?
3. **Discuss:** How can we know what God's promises are?
4. **Say:** We can learn the many promises God has made to His people by studying the Bible.
5. **Discuss:** Does God still keep His promises when things go wrong? What about if divorce happens, or when our friends are unkind to us? Does God still keep His promises when we feel sad or alone?
6. **Say:** Let's look at God's Word and dig into some of His promises that can help us in our times of need.
7. *Spread printable pages on the floor around your space.*
8. *Divide kids into pairs and have them stand by a printable page.*
9. **Say:** As a pair, you will look up the Bible verse you're standing on. Talk about what God is or has promised in that verse. Discuss how you can use the verse to be reminded of God's promises when you feel sad, lonely, unlovable, angry, etc.
10. *Give pairs time to look up their verse and discuss. Ask if any pairs want to share with the whole group what they talked about.*
11. **Discuss (as a whole group):** How can you hold onto that verse this week? How can you use what you learned today throughout the week?
12. **Pray:** God, thank You for all the promises that You give us in the Bible. Help us to remember Your promises and trust that You will do what You say. Amen.
13. **Say:** God does what He says. Let's take time to respond to Him.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.



FREEZE PRAYERS

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, Take-Home page, writing supplies, printable pages, painter's tape, flashlight

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Print the printable pages. Hang them around your space.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids with mobility needs, allow extra space and time for specialized equipment or buddy them up with a familiar friend to assist.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Say:** Today we have learned that God really does keep His promises.
2. **Discuss:** How can we know what God's promises are?
3. **Say:** God's Word, the Bible, is filled with His promises to us. We can learn the many promises God has made to His people by studying the Bible.
4. **Discuss:** Does God still keep His promises when things go wrong?
5. **Say:** Joshua asked God to make the sun stand still so he could finish the job God gave him. When we pray, we can also stop and look at God's promises. Today we'll walk, freeze and pray using God's promises from the Bible.
6. *Instruct kids to wander around your space. Randomly turn on the flashlight and call out, "The sun stood still!" while shining it on one of the printable pages. Everyone will gather around that page and follow the prompts.*
7. *Then call out, "the sun is moving!" and kids begin walking again.*
8. *Continue playing the game with the rest of the printable pages.*
9. **Say:** Joshua trusted God because he knew God always keeps His promises. We can know God's promises when we read the Bible, just like we did today. When you pray this week, try stopping, like the sun stood still, and remembering a promise God gives His people.
10. **Say:** While God may not always answer our prayers exactly how we would like, we can trust that He hears us, He is good and no prayer is too big for Him.
11. **Pray:** God, thank You for all the promises that You give us in the Bible. Help us to remember Your promises and trust that You will do what You say. Amen.
12. **Say:** God does what He says. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.

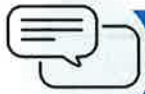

THE SUN STOOD STILL

BIBLE PASSAGE: JOSHUA 10; 13 Led by Joshua, the Israelites conquered Canaan as God promised. When kings attacked Gibeon, God assured victory. Joshua prayed, the sun stood still, and Israel won. The Israelites defeated their enemies, conquered more land, and Joshua divided it among the twelve tribes. The Promised Land became theirs, just as God said.

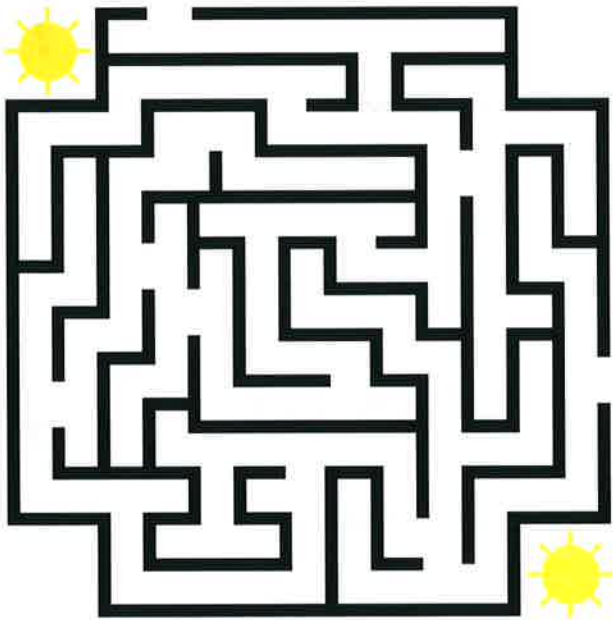
