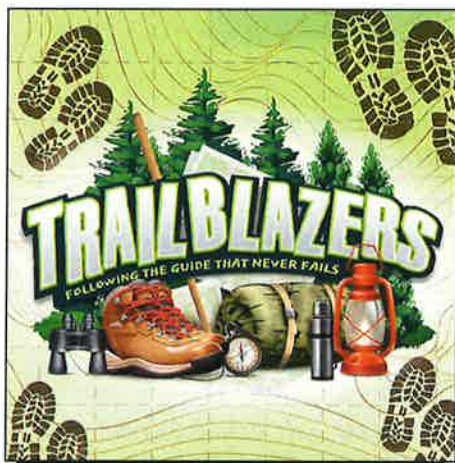




DEBORAH LEADS

BIBLE PASSAGE: Judges 4–5

FOCUS VERSES: 1 John 4:4; Matthew 19:26;
1 Corinthians 15:57

Summary: Deborah was a judge in Israel. Because of their disobedience, Israel had been taken over by the king of Canaan and his general, Sisera. Deborah told Barak to go and fight them, but Barak insisted that Deborah had to come too. The Lord caused the Canaanite army to panic, but Sisera escaped and hid in a tent. A woman named Jael killed him with a tent peg. The Lord was victorious.



MONTHLY *Memory Verse*

God is victorious.

We will go deeper in God's truth by answering these questions:



CAN ANYTHING DEFEAT GOD?

No! God is all-powerful. There is nothing or no one anywhere who is more powerful than He is.

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: BIG EMOTIONS AND HELPFUL RESPONSES

While it may appear that a kid is overreacting to a situation, we don't know the whole story. Their reaction may be a response to events that happened before they entered our church. Responding with empathy and understanding will help a kid calm down and feel known.

- **Believe the kid.** Often if a kid is upset, we attempt to reassure them by saying "you're okay" or "don't cry." Instead of reassuring, this message communicates that their feelings are not valid. When we believe a kid's emotions are real, we will be less likely to dismiss their feelings.
- **Help kids name their feelings.** Some kids need help identifying what they are feeling. For example, if they're crying say, "It seems like you're sad." Or if they just kicked a chair, "It looks like you're angry because you just kicked a chair." This will help the kid begin to consider the emotion they are feeling.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: VIOLENCE

Unfortunately, violence is prevalent in our culture. A recent study revealed that 60 percent of kids had witnessed abuse, violence or crime.* Kids who have been exposed to violence can struggle with emotional and mental health issues, as well as potentially engaging in troublesome behavior. Media and entertainment have desensitized many to violence, and unfortunately, many kids live with the reality of violence every day. Kids will likely pick up on the violence in the story today. Remind kids that this story describes what happened, but it isn't telling us what to do. Jael killed a man with a tent peg, but that doesn't mean God is saying we should act violently toward others. Remember, if a kid mentions abuse or violence that has happened to them, report that immediately and find help for the family. Remind kids that violence of any type is not part of God's design for the world. Violence is a result of the fall and is a terrible part of the broken world we live in. One day Jesus will make all things new, and violence will not be a part of His forever kingdom.

Bible TEACHING

DEBORAH LEADS JUDGES 4–5



PRAY: God, You are victorious in all You do.
Thank You for hearing us when we call.
Help us see Your power and love for
Your people in today's story. Amen.

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, butcher paper,
marker, painter's tape, scissors

PREP:

Cut a large piece of butcher paper.
Write "Total Victory Checklist" on the
top and draw five checkmark boxes
descending from the top. Tape the
paper at the front of your space.

LEADER TIP:

For more engagement, allow kids to
checkmark the boxes.

Say: God's people settled into the Promised Land, but they quickly forgot all that God had done for them. They turned away from Him and chose to worship false gods. When this happened, God allowed them to be taken over by an enemy. The people cried out to God for help. He then raised up a leader, called a judge, to deliver them from the enemy. They would live at peace until they turned from God again. This pattern happened over and over.

Say: Following this pattern was foolish, but crying out to God at the lowest point was the right move! God is a victorious God who has more than enough power to help at all times. Let's make a checklist of the ways God brings total victory for His people.

Say: God raised up a woman named Deborah to be the judge over Israel.

Write "Raise up a leader" next to the first box. Check the box and have kids shout, "God is victorious—check!"

Say: Deborah summoned a man named Barak and said, "God has commanded you to gather 10,000 men. God will draw out the general of the enemy army and deliver him over to you."

Write "Give a battle plan" next to the second box. Check the box and have kids shout, "God is victorious—check!"

Read Judges 4:8 directly from the Bible: Barak said to her, "If you will go with me, I will go, but if you will not go with me, I will not go."

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Show teaching illustration: Barak Asks Deborah to Come With Him.

Say: Deborah agreed, and told him that the Lord would use a woman to take down the enemy.

Write "Promise victory" next to the third box. Check the box and have kids shout, "God is victorious—check!"

Say: Barak and Deborah led their army of 10,000 men. Sisera, the enemy general, heard they were coming and prepared his army, including 900 iron chariots.

Read Judges 4:14 directly from the Bible: *And Deborah said to Barak, "Up! For this is the day in which the LORD has given Sisera into your hand. Does not the LORD go out before you?" So Barak went down from Mount Tabor with 10,000 men following him.*

Say: When Barak attacked, God caused Sisera's army to panic. The Israelites destroyed the whole army, but Sisera jumped from his chariot and escaped on foot.

Write "Overcome the enemy" next to the fourth box. Check the box and have kids shout, "God is victorious—check!"

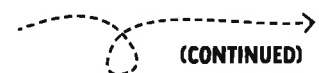
Show teaching illustration: The Enemy King Runs Away.

Say: Sisera ran to the tent of a woman named Jael, thinking that this family was peaceful with his people. Sisera hid and fell asleep. While he slept, Jael snuck over to him and drove a tent peg right through his head. God had, indeed, used a woman to defeat the enemy!

Write "Kept His promise" next to the fifth box. Check the box and have the kids shout, "God is victorious—check!"

Say: Deborah and Barak sang a great song, praising God for His victory. They sang, "To the LORD I will sing; I will make melody to the LORD, the God of Israel."

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED



POINT TO JESUS

Say: God was victorious in the battle and the Israelites were free. But their freedom didn't last. Soon they turned back to their evil ways and were oppressed by another enemy. The Israelites had a much bigger problem than enemy kings. In fact, we all have the same problem. We all sin and rebel against God. The good news is that God is victorious over our sin as well. We can't do anything to make our sin better. But Jesus died on the cross to take the punishment for our sin. He rose from the dead, defeating death and sin forever!

CARD NINJA

SUPPLIES:

10 plastic cups, playing cards (5 per kid), table

PREP:

Set up the cups on one edge of the table.

LEADER TIP: Ensure no one is standing where kids will be throwing their cards.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids with mobility needs, have alternate movements such as blowing on the cup while up close, or pair them with a friend to work with.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God never fails. How have you seen this week that God hasn't failed you?
4. **Discuss:** Have you ever been victorious before?
5. *Invite kids to share experiences of winning challenges or games in their lives.*
6. **Say:** Let's test our ninja skills!
7. **Say:** We will compete to see who will be victorious in knocking a cup off the edge of the table using only playing cards. You will fling your card sideways towards the cups and try to get enough force to knock one off.
8. *Give everyone five playing cards.*
9. *Have kids stand on the opposite side of the table and take turns throwing their cards at the cups.*
10. *The first person to knock a cup off the table wins.*
11. *Reset the cups and play as many rounds as you have time for.*

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Today's true story from the Bible is about a group of people who fought a tough battle and were victorious!



WHO WINS?

SUPPLIES:

Printable pages, scissors

PREP:

Print the printable pages on cardstock and cut out (1 set of cards per kid).

LEADER TIP: Instead of having the kids play in pairs, divide them into two teams.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Pair kids who may struggle with this activity with a friend who can help.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God never fails. How have you seen this week that God hasn't failed you?
4. **Discuss:** Have you ever been victorious before?
5. *Invite kids to share experiences of winning challenges or games in their lives.*
6. **Say:** Let's play a game!
7. **Say:** To play I will divide you into pairs. Each person will get a set of cards. First you will each shuffle your cards and place them face down in a pile. Then you will both lay the top card down face up.
8. **Say:** As a pair you will need to decide which animal would win in a battle. Whoever has the stronger animal, keeps the cards. If you think the animals are equally matched, put them back in your stack and keep playing. The first person to collect all the cards wins.
9. *Divide kids into pairs.*
10. *Pass out a set of cards to each kid.*
11. *Start the game and help as needed.*
12. **Discuss:** Who was victorious in your game?

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Today we are learning how God is victorious. If we had a contest between God and anything or anyone else, He would win. No one can defeat God.



BALLOON BATTALION

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, teaching slide, printable page, scissors, balloons (1 per kid)

PREP:

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide. Print the printable page and cut out. Inflate the balloons.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: For kids struggling with personal space, allow modified movement such as balloon between knees and not touching others.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find Luke 1:37 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** How were the Israelites overtaken at the beginning of our story?
3. **Discuss:** How did God do the impossible?
4. **Discuss:** Why is it important for us to remember that nothing is impossible with God?
5. **Discuss:** Can anything defeat God?
6. **Say:** No! God is all-powerful. There is nothing or no one anywhere who is more powerful than He is.
7. **Say:** Just as the Israelite army worked together to defeat the Canaanite army, we will work together to be victorious with our own challenge.
8. *Instruct kids to line up shoulder to shoulder in a line on one side of your space.*
9. *Place the memory verse cards on the opposite side of your space.*
10. *Pass out a balloon to each kid.*
11. *Show kids how to place a balloon between themselves and the person standing next to them (between elbows or shoulders).*
12. **Say:** The way to win this challenge is to walk as a group to the opposite side of our space without dropping a balloon. If a balloon drops, the entire group must go back to the beginning and start again.
13. **Say:** Once you get to the other side, you will work together to put the verse in the correct order.
14. *Start the game and cheer kids on! Help kids as needed.*
15. *Once assembled, recite the verse together several times.*



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

The Israelites were able to defeat the Canaanites because God who would give them victory! Nothing is impossible with God!



LEARN AND SHARE

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, printable pages, scissors,
writing supplies

PREP:

Print the printable pages and cut out
(1 verse set per 4 kids).

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Allow for extra time and cueing of ideas to support struggling learners.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** How was God victorious in our story today?
2. **Discuss:** Can anything defeat God?
3. **Say:** No! God is all-powerful. There is nothing or no one anywhere who is more powerful than He is.
4. **Say:** You will first form learning groups where you dig into what the Bible tells us about God's power. Pay close attention and take notes because then we will form new sharing groups.
5. **Say:** One person from each learning group will be a part of a new sharing group where you will share what you discovered about God's power.
6. *Divide kids into learning groups with four kids each. Give each group a verse set and give groups time to read, discuss their verses and take notes on their page.*
7. *Now form sharing groups by placing one person from each learning group into a new sharing group. Each verse should be represented in the sharing group with each group containing one kid representing each verse.*
8. *Invite kids to share with each other what they learned in their learning group.*
9. **Discuss:** What is something that stood out to you from your discussion?
10. **Say:** There is nothing more powerful than God. That is one reason we can know He is always victorious.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

God is greater than all things which means He will always be victorious. Even if we can't see it or understand it, God is in control. He always wins.



Discipleship DISCUSSION

HOW CAN I KNOW THIS IS TRUE?

Discuss: What would you think if God used someone unexpected to lead an army to victory?

Say: The Bible tells how God used Deborah to lead Israel against Sisera. Archaeologists have uncovered the ancient site of Hazor, Sisera's ally, showing it was a powerful Canaanite city with large gates and palaces, just as Judges describes. Excavations there also reveal a violent destruction layer, showing the city was suddenly defeated. In the nearby Kishon River Valley, where the battle took place, the ground can quickly turn muddy after heavy rain, matching Judges 5, which says the river swept the enemy away. These discoveries show Deborah's story happened in real places and real conditions, and God used them to bring victory.

Read Judges 5:21 directly from the Bible: *The torrent Kishon swept them away, the ancient torrent, the torrent Kishon. March on, my soul, with might!*

BUT WHAT ABOUT ... VIOLENCE?

Discuss: Without describing what you saw, what are some ways that you have seen violence or people hurting other people? Movies? TV shows? Social media?

Discuss: How does it make you feel when you see something violent like that?

Discuss: What do you think God has to say about that?

Say: Our Bible story today contained some violence. It sounded like something out of a movie! It's important to remember that this story is telling us what happened in this situation, but it isn't telling us that it is something we should do. The Old Testament tells us about a lot of battles and wars that happened. God used these battles to protect His people or to punish people who were against Him. Those are God's decisions, not ours. God calls us to love others and to treat others kindly. Proverbs 3:31 says: *Do not envy a man of violence and do not choose any of his ways.* All violence is a result of living in a world broken by sin. It is not what God designed for us. One day, Jesus will return and make this whole world new again. There will be no fighting or violence or pain. Until then, we can seek God's help when we are afraid of violence around us. If something violent is happening to you, that is not okay or what God wants for you. Talk to an adult you trust.



SONG OF PRAISE

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, Take-Home page, writing supplies, printable page

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Print the printable page (1 per 3 kids).

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Strategically divide kids into groups with stronger peers who could naturally assist.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** How did God give the Israelites victory?
2. **Discuss:** What did Deborah and Barak do after God gave them the victory?
3. **Say:** Deborah and Barak sang a song of praise to the Lord.
4. **Discuss:** How can we face tough times in life?
5. **Say:** We can worship God even when life is hard. We can praise Him for who He is because He is always victorious.
6. *Lead kids to find 1 Corinthians 15:7 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
7. **Say:** We can always praise God because we have victory in Jesus!
8. *Divide kids into groups of three and give each group a printable page and writing supplies.*
9. **Say:** Your group will use your printable page to write your own song of praise. Work together to fill in the blanks and then put it to a tune, or you could recite it like a poem. You could even add motions if you want!
10. *Give groups time to create their song of praise.*
11. *Invite groups to share their songs.*
12. **Discuss:** Why can we praise God even when we've had tough times?
13. **Say:** We have so much to praise God for! He is victorious over everything, and we can praise and trust Him because He is bigger than anything we face.
14. **Pray:** God, we praise You for always being victorious. Help us to trust You even during tough times and remember that nothing is impossible for You. Amen.
15. **Say:** God is victorious. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.



PRAISING IN THE PAIN

SUPPLIES:

2. **Say:** We might not face a battle like Deborah, but we all face tough situations in our lives. Let's talk to God about a hard situation you are facing. Tell God what is happening, how you are feeling and ask Him for help.
3. *Give kids a few moments to silently talk to God about their lives.*
4. *Lead kids to find 1 John 4:4 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
5. **Discuss:** What comfort and hope does this verse give us?
6. **Discuss:** How can we face tough times in life?
7. **Say:** We can worship God even when life is hard. We can praise Him for who He is because He is always victorious.
8. **Discuss:** What are some characteristics of God?
9. *Brainstorm a list of characteristics of God and write the words on the balloons. Examples: victorious, all-powerful, good, all-knowing, in control, always with us.*
10. **Discuss:** Which of these characteristics helps you when life feels tough?
11. *Play the worship music and have kids toss the balloons around. Invite kids to call out the characteristics of God and praise Him.*
12. **Discuss:** Why can we praise God even when we face tough times?
13. **Pray:** God, we praise You for always being victorious. Help us to trust You even during tough times and remember that nothing is impossible for You. Amen.
14. **Say:** God is victorious. Let's take time to respond to Him.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.

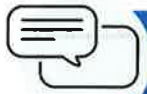
