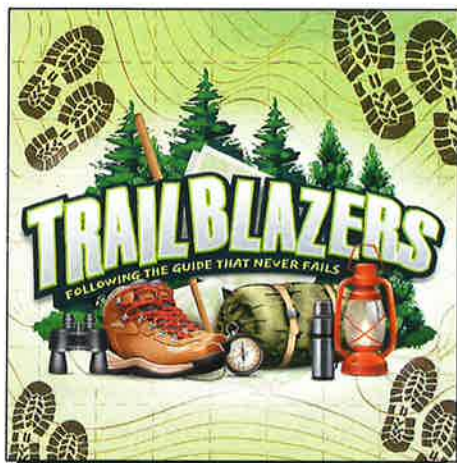




## THE SUN STOOD STILL

**BIBLE PASSAGE:** Joshua 10; 13

**FOCUS VERSES:** Hebrews 10:23, Numbers 23:19,  
Deuteronomy 7:9

**Summary:** The Israelites, led by Joshua, conquered Canaanite cities as God had promised. When several kings attacked a city named Gibeon, Joshua came to help. God told him not to fear and promised victory. Joshua prayed for the sun to stand still, and God answered, giving them more time to fight. The Israelites defeated their enemies, conquered more land, and Joshua divided it among the twelve tribes. The Promised Land became theirs, just as God said.

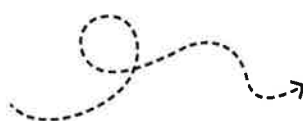

# Leader TRAINING

## LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: BE PLAYFUL

When a kid does not meet expectations, engaging in play with them is often not our first response. However, when we approach a kid with a warm and playful demeanor, the kid will often begin to calm so we can better identify the need driving the behavior. Need help being more playful? Try these ideas:

- **Use your “fun” voice.** While it’s easy to go straight to our authoritative voice when a kid’s behavior is challenging, next time use your “fun” voice when redirecting or correcting. A playful voice signals to the kid that you are on their side and will work with them.
- **Play.** Relationships are built through shared fun experiences. As you build a relationship with a kid, correction and coaching will be more effective. Sit down on the floor, grab a truck, or join a kid who is coloring.
- **Start with play.** Telling a kid that our room is a fun space is not enough. We need to show them. Greeting them with a fist bump or high five is a great way to start your interaction with connection and fun. Have toys and craft supplies accessible to kids as soon as they arrive. Offering play immediately upon arrival helps ease the transition from their caregiver.

## NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: DIVORCE

One of the most significant ways kids experience the pain of broken promises is when divorce happens within their family. Research reveals 30 percent of kids experience their parents’ divorce.\* When a kid experiences divorce, their whole world is affected. They may struggle emotionally, physically and socially. Also, their impression of promises and adults doing what they say may be jaded. You will likely have kids in your group whose parents have been through a divorce. In today’s lesson, they will learn that God always does what He says. Kids who have been hurt may struggle with believing that. They may wonder why a promise-keeping God would let their family go through so much. You can listen to kids’ struggles without judging their family. Point to God’s faithfulness, even when it takes time to see how He’s moving. Kids can learn that God won’t lie or break promises.

# Bible TEACHING

## THE SUN STOOD STILL JOSHUA 10; 13



**PRAY:** God, You do amazing things! Things we can't even understand! If You say it, You do it. Help us to learn from Joshua and this mighty miracle today. Amen.

**SUPPLIES:**

Bible, teaching slides, envelope

**PREP:**

None

**LEADER TIP:**

For smaller groups, kids can play multiple roles.

**Say:** After many years of wandering in the wilderness, Moses had died and Joshua was the new leader of the Israelites. They began conquering cities to take over the land that God had promised.

*Have one volunteer stand and salute. That volunteer is now Joshua. After saluting, Joshua can sit back down.*

**Say:** The kings of the land heard how Joshua and the people had defeated cities around them. They wanted to stop him, so they plotted to join together to attack the city of Gibeon.

*Have three volunteers stand and pretend to speak angrily to one another. Allow them a few seconds of acting and then have them sit back down.*

**Say:** The men of Gibeon sent word to ask Joshua for help, telling him about the attack that was coming.

*Call a volunteer to come to the front of the space, hand them an envelope and have them take it to Joshua. The volunteer can then sit back down.*

*Show teaching illustration: Men of Gibeon Send Message to Joshua.*

**Say:** Joshua gathered his brave fighting men and headed to Gibeon.

*Have three new volunteers stand and flex their muscles. Allow them a few seconds of acting and then have them sit back down.*

# Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

**Say:** Along the way, God spoke to Joshua.

**Read Joshua 10:8 directly from the Bible:** *And the LORD said to Joshua, "Do not fear them, for I have given them into your hands. Not a man of them shall stand before you."*

**Say:** Joshua and his men surprised the enemies, attacking them suddenly. The LORD caused the enemies to panic and run.

*Have three volunteers stand and act scared and panicked. Allow them to run in place for a few seconds and then sit back down.*

**Say:** Joshua and the Israelites chased after them, knowing that if night came, some of the enemy would escape and their victory would not be complete. Joshua asked God to make the sun stand still so that they could have more daylight to finish the battle.

*Have Joshua stand and fold their hands in prayer while you read the verse.*

**Read Joshua 10:12 directly from the Bible:** *At that time Joshua spoke to the LORD in the day when the Lord gave the Amorites over to the sons of Israel, and he said in the sight of Israel, "Sun, stand still at Gibeon, and moon, in the Valley of Aijalon."*

*Invite Joshua to sit back down.*

**Show teaching illustration:** *Joshua Prays & Sun Stands Still.*

**Say:** God answered! God slowed down the sun and it didn't set for a whole day. The Israelites were victorious!

*Have the entire group stand and celebrate a great win! After a few seconds of acting, have them sit back down.*

**Say:** Joshua led the Israelites to conquer more cities and to occupy Canaan, the Promised Land. Joshua divided up the land among the twelve tribes of Israel, giving each group their own inheritance.

# Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

**Say:** God kept His promise to Joshua that they would win the battle. He kept an even bigger promise when they took over Canaan. Just like He had promised Abram, Isaac, Jacob and Moses, God gave His people their own land.

*Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus.*



## POINT TO JESUS

**Say:** Throughout the Old Testament, God promised hundreds of times that He would send a Rescuer who would save the people from their sin. God kept His promise by sending Jesus, a descendant of Abraham, to Earth to die on the cross for our sins. God promises that when we trust in Jesus for forgiveness of our sins, we will live forever with Him. He always does what He says.

## CAN YOU KEEP IT?

### SUPPLIES:

Printable pages, painter's tape

### PREP:

Print the printable pages. Tape them on the walls around your space.

**ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:** For kids with hearing and vision needs, place them close to the leader for better understanding.

### INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God never fails. How have you seen this week that God hasn't failed you?
4. **Discuss:** What is a promise? What are examples of things people promise?
5. **Say:** Taped on the walls you'll see the words, "yes" (*thumbs up*), "no" (*thumbs down*), and "maybe" (*shoulder shrug*). I will read some promises, and you will travel to the wall that matches your answer to the promise.
6. *Begin reading promises and have kids move to show their answer. Discuss why kids chose their answer.*
7. *Promise suggestions:*
  - I promise to never eat grass.
  - I promise to brush my teeth this week.
  - I promise to be kind to my siblings.
  - I promise to listen to my teacher.
  - I promise to read four hours every day.
  - I promise to eat an elephant.
  - I promise to never eat dessert again.
8. *After promises have been read and discussed, gather kids together again.*
9. **Discuss:** Do you think it's important to keep promises? Why? Have you always kept all of the promises you have made?



### ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Some of those promises would be harder to keep than others. Today, we are learning that every single thing God promises is "Yes!" because He does what He says He will!



# THE SUN STOOD STILL

**SUPPLIES:**

Building blocks (several per kid),  
yellow ball

**PREP:**

None

**LEADER TIP:** Have examples of how God has never failed you in your life!

**ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:** For active and easily frustrated kids, allow for breaks or positive language when working through frustrations.

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God never fails. How have you seen this week that God hasn't failed you?
4. **Say:** Let's play a game! You will work in pairs to build a tower together.
5. **Say:** If I am standing still and holding the yellow ball in the air, you will build. If I start walking around and waving the yellow ball back and forth, you must freeze and stop building until I stand still again with the ball in the air.
6. *Divide kids into pairs.*
7. *Distribute building supplies to the groups.*
8. *Go to the center of your space, hold the ball high and allow kids to start working. After a minute, begin walking around, waving the ball back and forth. Remind kids as needed to freeze. Go back to the center, stand still and hold the ball in the air and have kids begin building. Repeat several times. Play the game as long as you have time for.*

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

Today, we are learning a story from the Bible about a time when God made something stand still. It wasn't a person, but He made something stand still to help His people.



## STOP AND GO VERSE

**SUPPLIES:**

Bibles, teaching slide

**PREP:**

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide.

**LEADER TIP:** Remind kids to use their walking feet during this activity.

**ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:** For kids who are hard of hearing, give a visual cue for starting and stopping (e.g., open hand when starting and closed hand when stopping).

### INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find Luke 1:37 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** What does this verse tell us about God?
3. **Discuss:** What impossible thing did God do in today's story?
4. **Discuss:** What promise did God keep in today's story?
5. **Say:** Let's play a game to practice our verse!
6. **Say:** You will line up shoulder to shoulder on one side of our space and I will stand on the other side with my back to you.
7. **Say:** You will walk toward me. When I call, "stop" and turn around, you will freeze and we will say the Bible verse together. We will continue until everyone gets to me. If you don't freeze when I call "stop," you will start over.
8. *Play the game, making sure to say the memory verse together several times.*
9. *Play as many rounds as time allows.*
10. **Say:** God does what He says. He always keeps His promises. The Bible is full of stories where God keeps His promises to His people.
11. **Discuss:** Why does God keep His promises?



### ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

God is always good! He never lies or changes His mind. He can do anything. That means that when God promises something, we can trust that He will do it!



# JUMP FOR GOD'S PROMISES

**SUPPLIES:**

Bible, printable page

**PREP:**

Print the printable page.

**ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:** For kids with mobility issues, modify the movement for their specific needs (e.g., motions with hands only instead of jumping up and down).

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. **Discuss:** What promise did God keep in today's story? How did He keep His promise?
2. **Say:** Let's look at some promises God made in the Bible and see if He kept His promise!
3. **Say:** I will read a promise that God made in the Bible. If you think God kept this promise, I want you to jump up and down. If you think He didn't keep His promise, you will sit down.
4. *Use the printable page to lead kids in the activity.*
5. **Discuss:** How many promises did God keep?
6. **Say:** God kept every promise He made! There was never a promise He didn't keep. He keeps 100 percent of the promises He made.
7. **Read:** Numbers 23:19.
8. **Discuss:** Why does God keep His promises?
9. **Say:** God is completely good. He never lies or changes His mind.
10. **Say:** As people we don't always keep our promises. Even if we want to keep all our promises, sometimes we break them. When God makes a promise, He always keeps it!

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

God is amazing and awesome! He always does what He says and keeps His promises. We can trust His promises because He never lies or changes His mind. He is always good.



## Discipleship DISCUSSION

### WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR FOLLOWERS OF JESUS?

**Discuss:** How does this true story from the Bible show us that God is good?

**Say:** Joshua asked for God to stop the sun, and He did! God also kept His promise to the Israelites, giving them the land He had promised. God is good and can never lie. He always does what He says!

**Read Numbers 23:19 directly from the Bible:** *God is not man, that He should lie, or a son of man, that He should change His mind. Has He said, and will He not do it? Or has He spoken, and will He not fulfill it?*

### BUT WHAT ABOUT ... DIVORCE?

**Discuss:** What are some important promises that adults make?

**Discuss:** What happens when adults who are married to each other don't keep their promise to stay married?

**Discuss:** What do you think God has to say about that?

**Say:** God designed marriage to be between a man and a woman forever. But even after a husband and wife promise to stay married forever, they sometimes don't. Some families go through a divorce, which is very hard for everyone. The Bible tells us that God doesn't like divorce. He knows how much it hurts the whole family. But He always loves the people who are involved with the divorce. Some of you may have parents who are divorced, and you know how hard it can be. Our world is broken by sin. Moms and dads are human and make mistakes. Sometimes the adults we love don't keep their promises. That hurts. We can turn to God and talk to Him about our hurt. We can also trust that He will always be there for us and always keeps every promise. Psalm 46:1 reminds us: *God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.*



## PROMISE MATCH

### SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, printable pages, painter's tape, scissors

### PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Print the printable pages and cut out (1 set of symbol cards per kid). Hang the verse signs on the walls around your space.

**LEADER TIP:** Play the song "The B-I-B-L-E" while kids gather and match cards.

**ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:** Pair kids who may struggle with this activity with a friend who can help.

### INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** What promise did God keep to Joshua? How did He keep His promise?
2. **Discuss:** God kept His promise! How can we know what God's promises are?
3. **Say:** We can learn the many promises God has made to His people by studying the Bible.
4. **Discuss:** Does God still keep His promises when things go wrong?
5. **Discuss:** When we have questions or problems in life, we can run to the Bible for answers and reminders of God's promises!
6. *Gather kids off to one side and spread out all the symbol cards in the middle of your space. You will call out a symbol and kids will race to find the matching card.*
7. *Once everyone has one, kids will tape them to the wall with the corresponding verse page. Read the verse and promise aloud. Repeat with all the symbols.*
8. **Discuss:** Which promise could you use when you are sad? Lonely? Scared?
9. **Say:** God always keeps His promises. Sometimes it might not feel that way when things don't go our way. We can remember all the promises God made in the Bible and trust that God does what He says!
10. *Review each symbol card and promise. Encourage kids to take any symbol cards home that help them remember the promises God made in the Bible.*
11. **Pray:** God, thank You for all the promises that You give us in the Bible. Help us to remember Your promises and trust that You will do what You say. Amen.
12. **Say:** God does what He says. Let's take time to respond to Him.

### ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

*Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.*



## STAND AND PRAY

### SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, printable pages

### PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid).

**ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:** For struggling learners, allow for idea sharing with a buddy in order to make best connections to the situations.

### INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** What did God tell Joshua about the battle He would fight? Did God keep His promise?
2. **Discuss:** How can we know what God's promises are?
3. **Say:** We can learn the many promises God has made to His people by studying the Bible.
4. **Say:** God has made so many promises to us in the Bible! We can remember those promises and trust that God does what He says. He will always keep His promises.
5. *Hold up one verse sign and read the verse from your Bible.*
6. **Discuss:** What does God promise in this verse?
7. *Place the verse sign on the floor around your space. Continue until you have read, discussed and placed all the verses.*
8. **Say:** Now think about something that is happening in your life and choose a verse that you want to remember and go stand by it.
9. *Give kids time to walk around and choose a verse to stand by.*
10. **Say:** I will start a prayer and then give you a moment to talk to God silently about your life and His promise. Then I will close the prayer.
11. *Pray a short opening prayer and then give kids time to silently pray to God.*
12. **Pray:** God, thank You for all the promises that You give us in the Bible. Help us to remember Your promises and trust that You will do what You say. Amen.
13. **Say:** God does what He says. Let's take time to respond to Him.

### ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

*Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.*

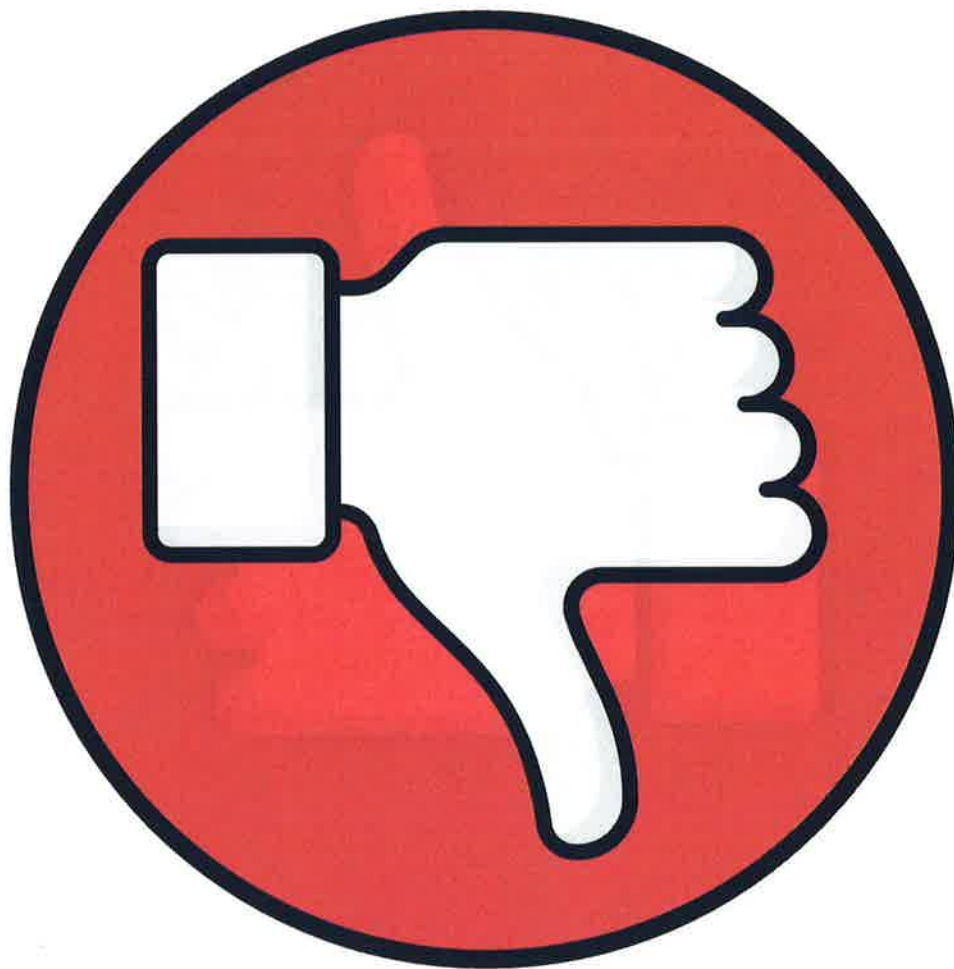

**Instructions:** Read each promise and allow kids to vote on whether God kept His promise.

**Promise 1:** God promised to free the Israelites from slavery.

- **Say:** The Israelites were in slavery in Egypt. God promised Moses that He would save His people. Jump up if you think God kept His promise. Sit down if you think He didn't keep His promise.
- *Let kids vote.*
- **Say:** God freed the Israelites and He sent them to cross the Red Sea away from Egypt. But the Egyptian King changed his mind and chased after the Israelites to enslave them again. But God kept His promise. He parted the Red Sea and the Israelites crossed on dry land.
- **Read:** Exodus 14:30.

**Promise 2:** God promised to give the Israelites a land.

- **Say:** God promised to make the Israelites a great nation and He would give them a land to live in and call their own. Jump up if you think God kept His promise. Sit down if you think He didn't keep His promise.
- *Let kids vote.*
- **Say:** God gave the Israelites the land! God gave them victory to defeat their enemies.
- **Read:** Joshua 21:43-45.

**Promise 3:** God promised to give Abraham a son.

- **Say:** God promised to give Abraham a son even though Abraham and his wife Sarah were very old. Jump up if you think God kept His promise. Sit down if you think He didn't keep His promise.
- *Let kids vote.*
- **Say:** Abraham's son was born and his name was Isaac.
- **Read:** Genesis 21:1-3.

**Promise 4:** God promised to send a Savior.

- **Say:** Adam and Eve sinned and broke their relationship with God. Sin entered the world. God promised to send a Savior to rescue us from our sin. Jump up if you think God kept His promise. Sit down if you think He didn't keep His promise.
- *Let kids vote.*
- **Say:** God sent Jesus as a baby and was born to Mary. We celebrate His birth at Christmas. He lived a perfect life and then died on the cross to take the punishment for our sins and make a way for us to be with God.
- **Read:** Luke 2:4-7.
