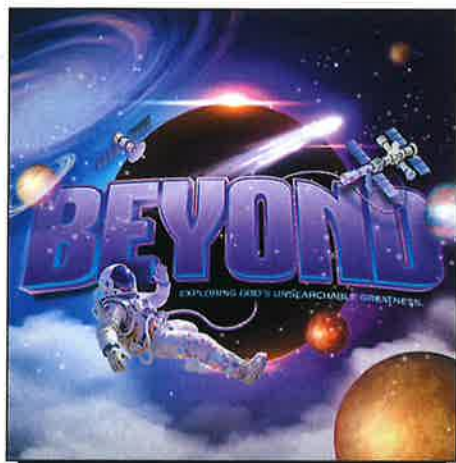




ELIJAH AND MT. CARMEL

BIBLE PASSAGE: 1 Kings 18:16–45

FOCUS VERSES: 1 Corinthians 8:6, Jeremiah 10:10a,
Psalm 18:6, Jeremiah 29:12

Summary: Elijah told King Ahab to send the prophets of Baal to Mt. Carmel. Elijah asked the prophets to call on their god to send fire to burn up a sacrifice. They cried and prayed and danced, but nothing happened. Elijah prepared his altar and even drenched it with water. He prayed to God, and the Lord sent down fire, burning up the sacrifice and everything around it. God showed all of the people that He was the one true God.

We will go deeper in God's truth by answering these questions:



IS GOD REAL?

The God of the Bible is the one true God. He is real and He is holy.



DOES GOD HEAR US?

God is real, so we can trust He hears us when we call to Him anytime, anywhere.



HOW IS GOD INVITING ME TO RESPOND?

Kids will reflect and respond to the truth they learned about God.

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: PRAYER - BEING STILL

Today's kids are often overscheduled and constantly on the go. It is hard for them to grasp the discipline of being still and quiet. How are they ever to learn how to settle themselves and pray if they can't even be still?

- **Practice Still.** At the beginning of class or as a transition activity before the lesson, invite kids to find their own space in the room. Turn on some worship music and challenge kids to be still and quiet for one minute. As kids learn about stillness, you can extend this time to allow them to practice it further.
- **Return to Still.** After the lesson, take a moment to help kids return to a state of stillness and quietness as they reflect on what they learned. Invite kids to talk silently to God about things they understood, things they didn't understand and what they learned about Him.
- **Still Song:** Play a worship song and invite kids to sit still and listen for all the things they learn about God during the song.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: PLURALISM

In a survey by Barna, 50 percent of adults indicated that they believe Muslims and Christians worship the same God.* Pluralism accepts that all religious beliefs can be true and coexist. Pluralism says that you can believe what you believe, and I can believe what I believe, and we can both be right. Kids in your group have likely been exposed to this messaging through social media, YouTube or the shows or movies they watch. Our world says there are many gods. Today's story can help kids understand that in a world that says any god is good enough, the Lord is the one true God. Be sensitive to kids who come from other backgrounds or who might have relatives who are of another religion. It is important that kids don't feel that you are being condescending or judgmental towards other faiths. Speak truth in love.

Holy: set apart; perfect

Bible TEACHING

ELIJAH AND MT. CARMEL

1 KINGS 18:16-45



PRAY: God, You are the one true God! You proved it to Elijah, and You prove it to us too. Help us learn from this story and trust You more. Amen.

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, printable pages

PREP:

Print the printable pages double-sided (1 per kid).

LEADER TIP:

Allow kids to keep the printable page for the review game.

Pass out one printable page to each kid.

Say: Today we will hear an awesome story about how God proved He is real! We will also hear about a fake god named Baal and some of his followers. Every time you hear something in the story that proves our God is real, hold up the word "REAL." Every time the false god Baal is shown to be fake, hold up "FAKE." Let's get started.

Say: The nation of Israel was in bad shape. The people continued rebelling against God and eventually, the kingdom split into a northern kingdom and a southern kingdom. An evil king named Ahab reigned over Israel. He married Jezebel, who worshiped Baal, a false god. Jezebel ordered soldiers to kill many of the prophets of the Lord. She was trying to wipe out all worship of the one true God.

Say: God raised up a prophet named Elijah. God worked miracles through Elijah. Do you think this proves our God is real?

Lead kids to hold up the word "REAL."

Say: God sent Elijah to confront King Ahab. Elijah told Ahab to send all the prophets of the false gods to Mount Carmel and to gather the Israelites around to watch.

Show teaching illustration: It's Time to Choose!

Say: When the people had gathered, Elijah said to them, "How long will you go back and forth between two opinions? If the Lord is God, serve Him. If Baal is god, follow him." But the people didn't respond.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: Elijah told them to bring two bulls, one for him and one for the prophets of Baal. They would each put their bull on the altar and then ask Baal to send down fire. The people would know which god was real when they saw which one answered.

Say: The prophets of Baal put their bull on the altar. They cried out to Baal for hours, saying, "Oh Baal, answer us!" But nothing happened. Do you think this proves Baal is fake?

Lead kids to hold up the word "FAKE."

Say: They danced around the altar, crying louder. Elijah mocked them. He said, "Maybe you need to be louder. Maybe Baal is busy or in the bathroom or asleep." The prophets cried even louder, but no one answered. Do you think this proves Baal is fake?

Lead kids to hold up the word "FAKE."

Say: It was Elijah's turn. He used twelve stones to build an altar, symbolizing the twelve tribes of Israel. He dug a trench around the altar and laid the wood and bull on it. Then he told them to pour four jugs of water on the altar and the wood. Then he asked for it again. And again! The water soaked the altar and filled the trench.

Read 1 Kings 18:36–37 directly from the Bible: *And at the time of the offering of the oblation, Elijah the prophet came near and said, "O LORD, God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, let it be known this day that You are God in Israel, and that I am Your servant, and that I have done all these things at Your word. Answer me, O LORD, answer me, that this people may know that You, O LORD, are God, and that You have turned their hearts back."*

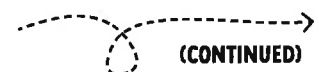
Show teaching illustration: Fire Falls on the Mountain.

Say: Immediately, God sent fire down from heaven. It burned up the bull, the wood, the stones and even the dust. Do you think this proves our God is real?

Lead kids to hold up the word "REAL."

Say: When the Israelites saw this, they fell on their faces and said, "The Lord, He is God! The Lord, He is God!"

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus.



Bible TEACHING CONTINUED



POINT TO JESUS

Say: God showed that He is the one true God. When Elijah called out to Him, God answered in power. God is real and He loves us so much that He provided one way for our sins to be forgiven. He sent His Son, Jesus, to die for us. When we pray to Jesus and ask Him to forgive us, He answers us powerfully. He forgives our sins and makes our relationship right with the one true God.

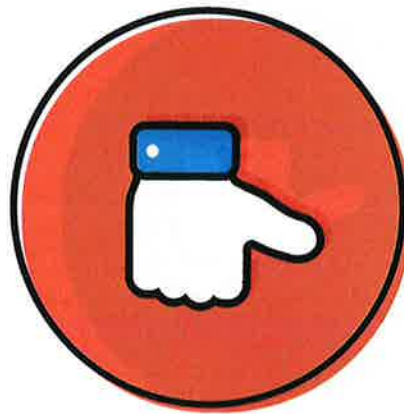

Goal: To engage kids in faith conversations that help them navigate a broken world with biblical wisdom

ROLL A PRAYER

SUPPLIES: Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, die

OR

LAUNCHING PRAYERS

SUPPLIES: Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, parachute, inflatable beach ball, permanent marker



STICKY NOTE CONTEST

SUPPLIES:

Sticky notepads (1 per 2 kids), timer

PREP:

None

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Partner kids intentionally. Make sure each pair has someone who is okay with sticky notes being placed on them.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is greater than anything! How have you seen God's greatness this week?
4. **Say:** Let's have a quick sticky note contest!
5. **Say:** I will divide you into pairs. Each pair will get a pad of sticky notes. One person will put sticky notes on the other person's arms. The pair with the most sticky notes on the person's arms in 30 seconds wins!
6. *Divide the kids into pairs and give each pair a pad of sticky notes.*
7. *Have the partner who is getting the notes stuck on them hold their arms out straight from their body. Remind kids that sticky notes are only to be stuck to their partner's arms.*
8. *Start the 30-second timer and cheer on the kids.*
9. *Declare a winning pair.*
10. *Have the pairs change places and play the game again.*
11. **Say:** Have you ever won a contest before? What was it?

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Today we are hearing a story about when God was in a contest with a fake god named Baal. Who do you think won the contest? We are learning that God is all-powerful and the only true God!



COLOR FEELINGS

SUPPLIES:

6 variously colored pom-poms, paper bag

PREP:

Place the pom-poms in the bag.

LEADER TIP: Adapt the color code to fit the colors of pom-poms you have.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Emotions can be complex for some kids. Consider having an image that depicts each emotion as a visual cue.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. *Gather kids in a seated circle.*
3. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
4. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is greater than anything! How have you seen God's greatness this week?
5. **Discuss:** God gave each of us big feelings! What are some feelings we have?
6. **Say:** I have a bag with colorful pom-poms in it. I will pull out a color, and we will all go around the circle and discuss a feeling that relates to that color.
7. *Go around until every kid has a chance to share their feelings. Continue until you have covered all the colors.*
8. **Color code:**
 - **Blue:** What makes you feel sad?
 - **Red:** What makes you feel angry?
 - **Yellow:** What makes you feel happy?
 - **Purple:** What makes you feel scared?
 - **Orange:** What makes you feel excited?
 - **Green:** What makes you feel brave?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

We learned a lot about each other! How would you feel if you were challenged to a contest and had to prove that God is real? Today we are learning about Elijah, who had to do just that. He felt brave because he knew God is the one true God!



MEMORY VERSE ALTAR

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, teaching slide, printable pages, painter's tape

PREP:

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide. Print the printable pages. Keep the Leader Guide with you.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Lead kids to find Psalm 145:3 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.*
2. **Discuss:** How did God show He was great and worthy on Mount Carmel? What did He do that no one else could do?
3. **Discuss:** Is God real?
4. **Say:** The God of the Bible is the one true God. He is real and He is holy.
5. **Say:** An altar was used to worship God and show Him that He was the greatest!
6. **Say:** We will build our memory verse together into an altar like Elijah did.
7. *Gather kids by a wall or space that you can tape the memory verse pages to.*
8. *Spread the memory verse pages in front of you in random order. Invite someone to find the first part of the verse with the number 1 on it.*
9. *Tape the number 1 page on the bottom left corner of your wall. You will be building the memory verse altar from there. Use the Leader Guide to help you.*
10. *Invite kids one at a time to select the next part of the verse and tape it to the correct spot.*
11. *Once the verse is assembled as an altar, say the verse together several times.*
12. **Discuss:** What did God do to the altar to show that He is the one true God?
13. *Tape the flame at the top of the altar.*

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

God is the one true God! Great is the Lord, and He is greatly to be praised!



FIND THE PROOF

SUPPLIES:

Bible, printable page, coloring supplies

PREP:

Print the printable page (1 per kid).

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** How did God show He is the one true God in today's story?
2. **Read:** 1 Corinthians 8:6 and Jeremiah 10:10a.
3. **Discuss:** What do these verses tell us about God?
4. **Discuss:** Is God real?
5. **Say:** The God of the Bible is the one true God. He is real and He is holy.
6. *Pass out supplies.*
7. **Say:** I will tell you a story from the Bible that shows God is the one true God, and you will find the picture on your paper that matches it and color it in.
8. *Read the following statements one at a time and help the kids find pictures on their printable pages.*
 - **Creation (Genesis 1):** God showed He is the one true God by making the world and everything in it just by speaking.
 - **Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1–9):** God showed He is the one true God when He confused people's language so they couldn't communicate with each other and grow powerful.
 - **The Burning Bush (Exodus 3):** God showed He is the one true God by speaking to Moses from a burning bush. The bush was on fire, but it didn't burn up.
 - **The Sun Stood Still (Joshua 10; 13):** God showed He is the one true God by making the sun stand still so that the Israelites could win a battle.
 - **Elijah and Baal (1 Kings 18):** God showed He is the one true God by winning a contest against Baal.
 - **Jesus and the Resurrection (Matthew 28):** God showed He is the one true God by raising Jesus from the dead and defeating sin and death.
9. **Discuss:** Do you believe God is real? Why?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

The God of the Bible is the one true God. He is real, and He is holy.



Discipleship DISCUSSION

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR FOLLOWERS OF JESUS?

Discuss: How does this true story from the Bible show us that God is good?

Say: God answered Elijah's prayer and showed His power to all of those who were following a false god. God is so good in His willingness to let us see who He is and know Him personally.

Read Psalm 27:13 directly from the Bible: *I believe that I shall look upon the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living!*

BUT WHAT ABOUT ... PLURALISM?

Discuss: Have you ever heard of people who believe in different gods? What have you heard they might believe in?

Discuss: Some people say it doesn't matter what god you believe in, as long as you believe in something. What do you think about that?

Discuss: What do you think God has to say about that?

Say: In our world, there are many other religions in which people believe in other gods. Some religions, like Hinduism, believe in multiple gods. The Bible is very clear that there is one true God. God has created one way for us to have a relationship with Him, and that is through His Son, Jesus. John 14:6 says: *Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."* We should always be respectful and kind to people, even if they believe differently than we do. But that doesn't mean all beliefs are the same. When we have the chance, we should share with others the truth of who the real God is and how much He loves them.



ROLL A PRAYER

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, die

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid).

LEADER TIP: Use a large, inflatable die!

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** What did Elijah ask God? Did God hear His prayers?
2. **Discuss:** How did God prove He is the one true God to everyone on Mt. Carmel?
3. **Read:** Jeremiah 29:12 and Psalm 18:6.
4. **Discuss:** What do these verses tell us about God?
5. **Discuss:** Does God hear us?
6. **Say:** God is real, so we can trust He hears us when we call to Him anytime, anywhere.
7. **Say:** Let's use a die to discuss the places, times and things we can pray about.
8. **Here are the discussion topics, based on each roll:**
 - **1 or 3:** When can you talk to God?
 - **2 or 5:** Where can you talk to God?
 - **4 or 6:** What can you talk to God about?
9. Choose one kid to go first and roll the die.
10. Prompt them what to share according to the number they rolled. Ensure everyone has a turn to roll the die and discuss the corresponding question.
11. **Discuss:** When did God hear your prayer and answer it?
12. **Discuss:** Why does God always hear our prayers?
13. **Pray:** God, You are the one, true God. You are real and powerful. Thank You for always hearing our prayers. Amen.
14. **Say:** The Lord is the one, true God. Let's take time to respond to Him.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.



LAUNCHING PRAYERS

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, parachute, inflatable beach ball, permanent marker

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Inflate the beach ball.

LEADER TIP: If you don't have a parachute, use a bedsheet instead!

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Some kids might not like the sensation of the waving parachute. They can bounce the prayer ball with their hands instead.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** What did Elijah ask God? Did God hear his prayers?
2. **Read:** Jeremiah 29:12 and Psalm 18:6.
3. **Discuss:** Does God hear us?
4. **Say:** God is real, so we can trust He hears us when we call to Him anytime, anywhere.
5. *Invite kids to share any prayer requests they have. Write each request on the beach ball with a permanent marker.*
6. *Invite kids to talk to God quietly about their prayer requests. After a minute, pray aloud for all the requests and thank God for always hearing our prayers.*
7. *Lay the parachute flat. Have kids gather around it and hold a piece of it.*
8. *Place the beach ball on the parachute.*
9. **Say:** Let's bounce our prayer ball up to remember that our prayers are lifted up to God. He always hears our prayers!
10. *Roll the ball around on the parachute and launch it in the air. Play with the parachute as long as time allows. When finished, have kids sit on the parachute.*
11. **Discuss:** What can you remember when you feel like God isn't answering your prayers?
12. **Say:** Sometimes God answers yes, sometimes no and sometimes the answer is to wait. God is real and we can trust that He will always hear our prayers!
13. **Pray:** God, You are the one, true God. You are real and powerful. Thank You for always hearing our prayers. Amen.
14. **Say:** The Lord is the one, true God. Let's take time to respond to Him.

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.
