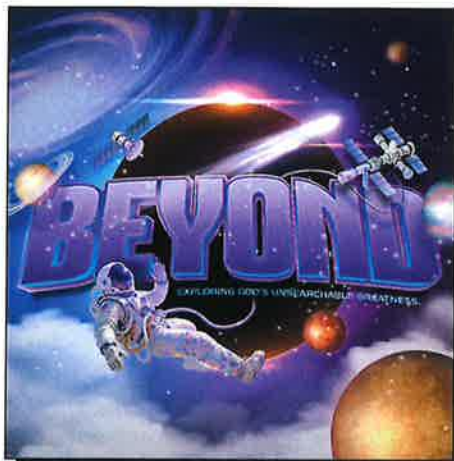




THE FIERY FURNACE

BIBLE PASSAGE: Daniel 3

FOCUS VERSES: Psalm 95:6; Revelation 4:11;
Hebrews 12:28; Romans 1:16

Summary: When Babylon captured Israel, young men like Daniel and his friends were taken to serve the king. King Nebuchadnezzar built a gold statue and commanded all to worship it or be thrown into a fiery furnace. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego refused, choosing to honor God. Even when given another chance, they stood firm. They were thrown into the furnace, but the king saw a fourth figure with them, protecting them from harm.

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: PRAYER REQUESTS

Kids are amazing intercessors, but sometimes can widen the prayer requests so wide that sometimes their prayer requests could benefit with more focus.

- **Whiteboard Requests.** Draw four circles on the board and label each accordingly: "Myself," "People Living at My House", "My Family" and "My Friends." As kids share their requests, explain that they must fit into one of the three circles.
- **Family Requests.** When taking prayer requests, ask kids to share requests for their immediate family, church family or mission's family.
- **20-Second Request.** When sharing prayer requests, explain to kids that each person gets 20 seconds to share their requests so all kids have time to share what they would like the class to pray for that day.
- **Answered Prayers Closing.** So often we bring request after request to God but never return to thank Him for how He answers our prayers. At the end of each week, circle back and ask the kids to share their answered prayers, then have a praise party thanking Him.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: PERSECUTION

Over 360 million Christians experience significant persecution in the countries in which they live, including facing kidnapping, jail and even loss of life.* Just like Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, believers around the world risk their lives by following the one true God. Some kids in your group may have even encountered times when they were made fun of for being a Christian or for doing the right thing. In today's lesson, kids will see that Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego stayed true to their faith even when it made life much harder for them. You can help kids see that God uses persecution to point others toward Him. Around the world the church is growing in countries of persecution. Lead the kids in your group to pray for those around the world who are persecuted.

Bible TEACHING

THE FIERY FURNACE DANIEL 3



PRAY: God, thank You for this great example of courage in Your Word. Teach us to give You all our praise, no matter what happens around us. Amen.

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, chair, upbeat music, music player

PREP:

Have some music ready to play during the teaching time. Place a chair at the front of your space.

LEADER TIP:

For smaller groups, have kids play multiple parts.

Say: Just like Isaiah had prophesied, Babylon conquered Judah and God's people were taken captive. Babylon took many young men away from their homes in Judah to train them in the Babylonian ways. These young men included Daniel and three of his friends. The friends were given new names: Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego.

Call four volunteers to the front to play Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego.

Say: They honored God in this foreign land and followed His ways.

Have the four actors put their hands over their hearts and make a "serious" face.

Say: God showed His favor on the four young men. They stood out among all the other young men and were given special privileges and honor. Daniel went to work in the king's court.

Have Daniel return to their seat and everyone else wave goodbye.

Say: Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were promoted to oversee all of the business of Babylon.

Have the three remaining actors shake hands and congratulate one another.

Say: One day, King Nebuchadnezzar built a massive golden statue. It was 90 feet tall.

Call a new volunteer to the front to play the statue. Have them carefully stand on the chair and freeze in place.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: He commanded the people to bow down and worship the giant statue every time they heard music. Anyone who refused to bow down would be thrown into a blazing furnace as punishment.

Play 30 seconds of music. Invite a few volunteers to the front to bow to the statue.

Say: The music played and everyone bowed down, except Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. They refused to worship something other than the one true God.

Show teaching illustration: Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego Won't Bow Down.

Have Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego fold their arms and shake their heads no.

Say: When this was reported to King Nebuchadnezzar, he was furious and ordered Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego to come before him.

Allow the statue to return to their seat. Call a new volunteer to sit in the chair and play King Nebuchadnezzar. Have Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego stand before him.

Say: The king asked, "Is it true that you will not serve my gods or worship my golden image? If you don't, you will be thrown into the fiery furnace. And what god will deliver you from that?"

Have King Nebuchadnezzar spread their hands wide as if asking a question.

Say: Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego answered him, "King, even if you throw us in the furnace, our God is able to save us. But even if He doesn't, we still won't worship anything or anyone else."

Have Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego shake their heads no and wag their fingers.

Say: Nebuchadnezzar was even angrier. He gave an order for the furnace to be made seven times hotter than normal. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were tied up and thrown inside.

Have King Nebuchadnezzar pretend to angrily tie them up. Call four new volunteers to be the fiery furnace. Have them sit in a circle, raise their hands and wiggle their fingers to represent fire. Have Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego stand inside the circle.

Say: After a few minutes, Nebuchadnezzar checked on them. He exclaimed, "Didn't we throw three men in there? There are four walking around, and one looks like a son of the gods."

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Show teaching illustration: Fourth Man in the Fire.

Call a new volunteer to stand in the circle as the fourth person in the fire.

Say: The king cried out, "Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, come out!"

Have King Nebuchadnezzar motion for them to come out. Allow the furnace volunteers and the fourth figure to return to their seats.

Say: Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego came out of the furnace completely unharmed. They didn't even smell like smoke. God was with them in the fire and had rescued them. King Nebuchadnezzar praised God and made a new law that no one could speak badly about Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego's God and declared that no one could rescue like the one true God.

Read Daniel 3:28 directly from the Bible: *Nebuchadnezzar answered and said, "Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, who has sent His angel and delivered His servants, who trusted in Him, and set aside the king's command, and yielded up their bodies rather than serve and worship any god except their own God."*

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus.



POINT TO JESUS

Say: Who was in the fire with the three young men? Some people believe it was an angel. Some people believe it was Jesus Himself. Many scholars believe there are moments in the Old Testament when Jesus may have appeared on Earth before He was born as a baby. Either way, we know God was with them. Just like God was present in the fire with Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, Jesus stepped down to be with us in our broken world. Not only did He join us here, but He paid the price for our sins, making it possible for us to live with Him forever.

PREP:

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Kids with mobility challenges can raise their hand in place of standing.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is greater than anything! How have you seen God's greatness this week?
4. *Have kids sit down.*
5. **Say:** I will show you a page with three items on it. One of the items doesn't belong. When you see the one that doesn't belong, stand up as fast as you can!
6. *Show kids one of the printable pages. Choose the kid who stood up the fastest to identify the item that didn't belong.*
7. **Discuss:** How did you know this item didn't fit the group?
8. *Have everyone sit down again.*
9. *Repeat until all the pages have been used.*
10. **Discuss:** Was there any time it was hard to pick out the mismatched item? Why or why not?
11. **Discuss:** Has there ever been a time when you felt like you didn't belong?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

You did a great job finding the item that didn't match the group! Today we're learning about a group of men who were different from everyone else in their city.



KING'S COMMANDS

SUPPLIES:

None

PREP:

None

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: Consider the physical needs of your group when choosing commands. Kids with physical limitations can be the “King’s Assistant” and identify the last kid.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. *Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.*
2. **Discuss:** What was the best and worst part of your week?
3. **Discuss:** This month we are learning that God is greater than anything! How have you seen God’s greatness this week?
4. *Have everyone stand up.*
5. *You will be the king and give kids commands to follow as quickly as they can. The last person to follow the command will be out.*
6. **Command suggestions:**
 - Lift hands up
 - Dab
 - Sit down
 - Stand up
 - Spin around
 - Give a high-five
 - Do The Floss dance
 - Jump up and down
 - Stand on one foot
7. *If time permits, repeat the game by choosing a new king.*
8. **Discuss:** How did it feel to keep following someone’s commands?
9. **Discuss:** Were there any commands that you didn’t like? What did you want to do when you heard them?


ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Today we are learning about Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego and a king that commanded them to do something they knew was not right.



PASS THE VERSE

SUPPLIES:

Bibles, teaching slide, ping-pong ball

PREP:

Print or show the Memory Verse teaching slide.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Lead kids to find Psalm 145:3 in their Bibles. Read it aloud together.
2. **Discuss:** How did God show His greatness in the fiery furnace?
3. **Say:** The king commanded everyone to bow down and worship the statue. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego knew that only God is worthy of worship.
4. **Discuss:** Why is God worthy of worship?
5. **Say:** God is greater than anyone or anything. No one is like Him.
6. Gather kids in a circle.
7. Have kids close their eyes and stick their hands out in front of them. Give one kid the ping-pong ball.
8. Have kids pass the ball around the circle and say the verse, one word at a time.
9. When the verse ends, have everyone keep their eyes shut and put their hands behind their backs.
10. Have kids open their eyes and guess who has the ping-pong ball.
11. Repeat as long as time allows.
12. **Discuss:** You couldn't see where the ball was, but you knew it was still there. How did you know?
13. **Discuss:** In the fiery furnace, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego couldn't see how God would rescue them, but they knew that God was worthy of all their worship.

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego trusted God's greatness by going into the fiery furnace. God was with them in the furnace and the king believed in Him! God is great and worthy of our praise!



WORTHY WALK

SUPPLIES:

Bible, printable pages, painter's tape

PREP:

Print the printable pages and tape them on the walls around your space.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS: If your group is highly active, you can hide the pictures and have kids find them and bring them back to the group.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** Why didn't Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego worship the statue?
2. **Say:** They knew that only God is worthy to be worshiped.
3. **Discuss:** Why is God worthy of worship?
4. **Say:** God is greater than anyone or anything. No one is like Him.
5. **Say:** Let's take a walk and learn why God is worthy of our worship.
6. **Say:** We will walk to each picture, read the verse and learn what makes only God worthy of our worship.
7. *Gather kids and walk to the first picture. Look at the picture, read the verse and written statement, and discuss any questions.*
8. *Continue until you have looked at and discussed all the pictures.*
9. **Say:** Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego knew that only God is worthy of worship. We can look at the world around us and see that too!
10. **Discuss:** What is your favorite thing about God?

**ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

No one is greater than God! Only He is worthy of our worship!



Discipleship DISCUSSION

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR FOLLOWERS OF JESUS?

Discuss: How does this true story from the Bible show us that God is good?

Say: Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were in a terrifying situation, but they were not alone. God was literally with them in the fire. God showed His goodness with His presence, but the three men also recognized that God was still good even if He didn't rescue them.

Read Isaiah 41:10a directly from the Bible: *Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God.*

BUT WHAT ABOUT ... PERSECUTION?

Discuss: Have you heard about countries where people are treated badly for believing in Jesus?

Discuss: Why would people mistreat Christians?

Discuss: What does the Bible have to say about that?

Say: There are people all over the world who are hurt or put in jail because they believe in Jesus. Another word for this is "persecution." There are some countries, many in the Middle East and Central Asia, where Christians are harmed every day. Most of us do not have to live in fear because we follow Christ, but we may encounter times where we are treated differently because of our faith or when we have to make some hard choices to honor Jesus when no one else is. In Matthew 5:10, Jesus says: *"Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."* He told the people that persecution happened to the Old Testament prophets and it would keep happening. We know people persecuted Jesus too. No matter our situation, we can remember that God is with us and He is with believers all over the world. Pray for those who are in scary situations because they follow Jesus.



STAND FIRM

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, plastic egg (1 per kid), small stickers (several per kid), modeling dough (1 handful per kid)

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid).

LEADER TIP: Write "Stand firm" on all the eggs in permanent marker at the end.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Discuss:** How did the three men in our story honor and worship God?
2. **Say:** They knew God was with them and trusted He would give them courage.
3. **Discuss:** How do we worship God even when those around us don't?
4. **Say:** We can trust God is always with us, and He gives courage to honor Him no matter what is happening.
5. *Give each kid an egg.*
6. **Say:** Sometimes it's hard to honor and follow God when all of your friends are doing things you know are wrong. Sometimes it feels like we can't stand firm and we just wobble like this egg.
7. *Encourage kids to push their egg over and watch it roll around.*
8. **Read:** Joshua 1:9 and Isaiah 41:10.
9. **Say:** Let's pretend that this dough is God's promise to always be with us.
10. *Pass out modeling dough to each kid. Demonstrate how to open their eggs and place a large hunk of modeling dough in the bottom of the eggs.*
11. **Discuss:** What happens when you push your egg over now?
12. *Pass out stickers and let kids decorate their eggs.*
13. **Discuss:** How does knowing God is with you help you do the right thing even when it is hard?
14. **Pray:** God, You are worthy of our worship. Thank You for always being with us. Help us to have courage to honor You no matter what is happening. Amen.
15. **Say:** Only God is worthy of worship. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.



COURAGE PRAYER

SUPPLIES:

Bible, Take-Home page, coloring supplies, printable pages, painter's tape

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid). Print the printable pages and tape them on the walls around your space. Leave enough space between them.

LEADER TIP: Play quiet worship music as kids are praying.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Read:** Isaiah 41:10.
2. **Discuss:** Who is always with you?
3. **Discuss:** How did the three men in the story have the courage to honor God?
4. **Discuss:** How do we worship God even when those around us don't?
5. **Say:** We can trust God is always with us, and He gives courage to honor Him no matter what is happening.
6. **Say:** Let's pray and talk to God about times when we need to follow God even when it's hard and we feel alone. There are pictures around our space. These pictures represent places where we can have courage to honor and follow God.
7. *Review the places: school, soccer practice (after-school activity), friends' houses and playground. Discuss times in each of these places when kids might need to have courage to do things God's way.*
8. **Say:** Now I will give you a few minutes to pray. You can stand by each of the pictures and ask God to help you have courage. Think about times when you needed courage to stand for what is right and asked God to help you.
9. *Give kids time to pray at each picture.*
10. *End the prayer time by praying for everyone to remember that God is always with them. Ask God to give them courage to honor Him, no matter what is happening around them.*
11. **Discuss:** What can you remember to help you have courage?
12. **Pray:** God, You are worthy of our worship. Thank You for always being with us. Help us to have courage to honor You no matter what is happening. Amen.
13. **Say:** Only God is worthy of worship. Let's take time to respond to Him.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Lead kids to use the "Me Question" box on their Take-Home pages. Ask fun, relationship-building questions while kids wait to be picked up. As parents arrive, connect with them and point out the Take-Home page.

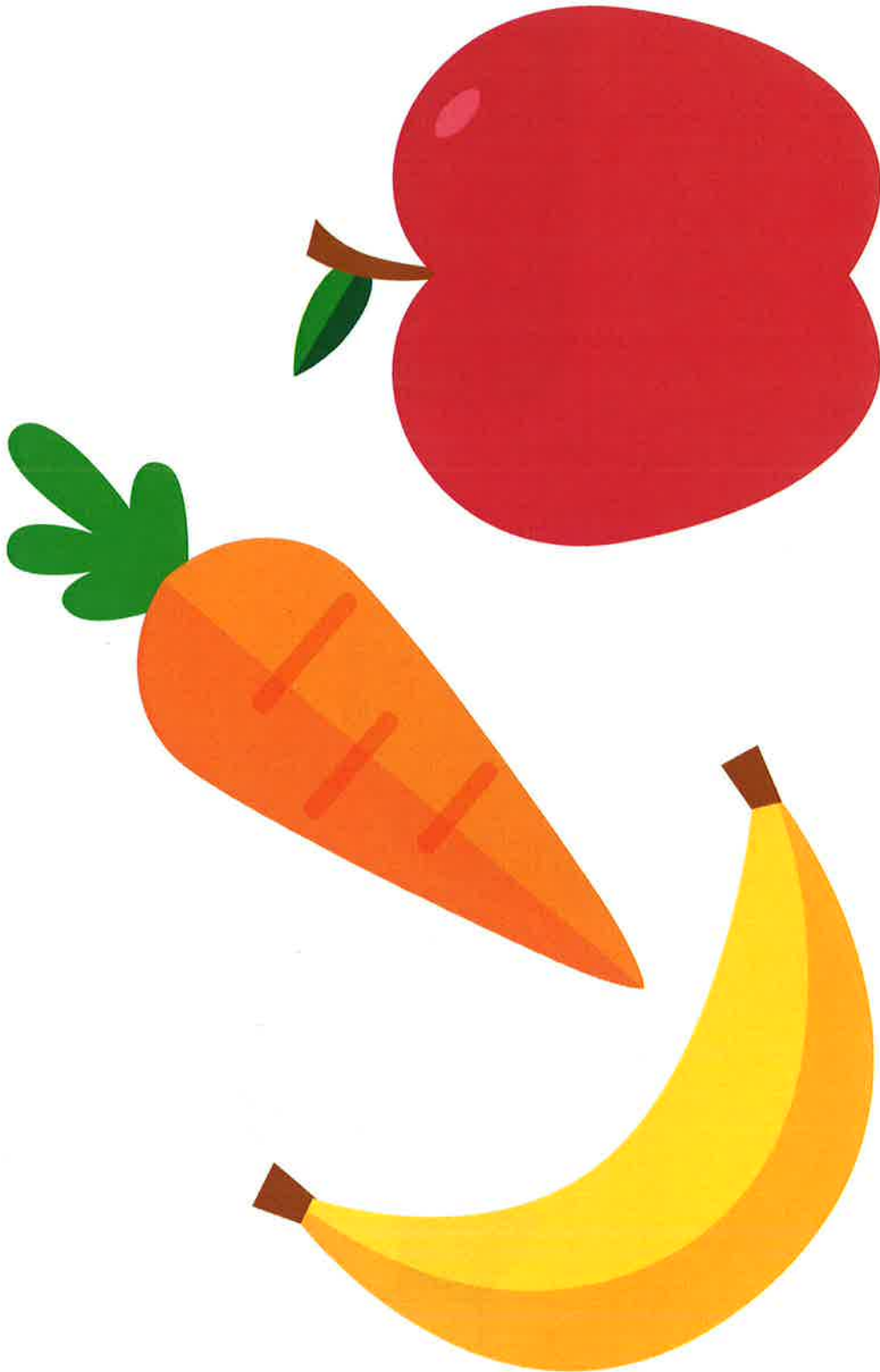

Say: This is the castle of a great king. Kings are powerful and important, but there is no one as powerful and important as God. Psalm 95:3 says: *For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods.*



Discuss: Who has been to the Grand Canyon? It's incredible and huge. This canyon was formed over many years. Psalm 95:4a says: *In His hand are the depths of the earth.* Can you imagine holding the Grand Canyon in your hand? That's how great God is!

Say: This is the tallest mountain in the world. It is so high that it is always cold there. Psalm 95:4b says: *The heights of the mountains are His also. God is bigger and greater than the highest mountain.*



Discuss: Have you ever been to the ocean? You can't see the end of it. It looks like it goes on forever and ever. Oceans cover about 70 percent of the Earth, and people believe only a small part (about 10 percent) has been explored. Psalm 95:5 says: *The sea is His, for He made it, and His hands formed the dry land.* God knows all about the ocean and everything in it because He made it.



Say: God has made so many amazing things, but the most important thing He did was send Jesus to take the punishment for our sins. John 3:16 says: *For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.* That is an amazing kind of love.
