



THE SUN STOOD STILL

BIBLE PASSAGE: Joshua 10; 13

FOCUS VERSES: Hebrews 10:23, Numbers 23:19,
Deuteronomy 7:9

Summary: The Israelites, led by Joshua, conquered Canaanite cities as God had promised. When several kings attacked a city named Gibeon, Joshua came to help. God told him not to fear and promised victory. Joshua prayed for the sun to stand still, and God answered, giving them more time to fight. The Israelites defeated their enemies, conquered more land, and Joshua divided it among the twelve tribes. The Promised Land became theirs, just as God said.

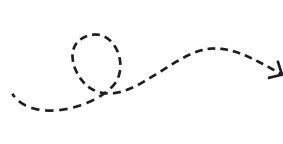

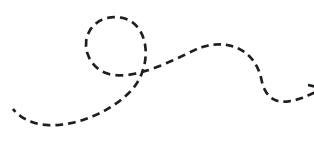

Leader TRAINING

LEADER TRAINING TOPIC: BE PLAYFUL

When a kid does not meet expectations, engaging in play with them is often not our first response. However, when we approach a kid with a warm and playful demeanor, the kid will often begin to calm so we can better identify the need driving the behavior. Need help being more playful? Try these ideas:

- **Use your “fun” voice.** While it’s easy to go straight to our authoritative voice when a kid’s behavior is challenging, next time use your “fun” voice when redirecting or correcting. A playful voice signals to the kid that you are on their side and will work with them.
- **Play.** Relationships are built through shared fun experiences. As you build a relationship with a kid, correction and coaching will be more effective. Sit down on the floor, grab a truck, or join a kid who is coloring.
- **Start with play.** Telling a kid that our room is a fun space is not enough. We need to show them. Greeting them with a fist bump or high five is a great way to start your interaction with connection and fun. Have toys and craft supplies accessible to kids as soon as they arrive. Offering play immediately upon arrival helps ease the transition from their caregiver.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: DIVORCE

One of the most significant ways kids experience the pain of broken promises is when divorce happens within their family. Research reveals 30 percent of kids experience their parents’ divorce.* When a kid experiences divorce, their whole world is affected. They may struggle emotionally, physically and socially. Also, their impression of promises and adults doing what they say may be jaded. You will likely have kids in your group whose parents have been through a divorce. In today’s lesson, they will learn that God always does what He says. Kids who have been hurt may struggle with believing that. They may wonder why a promise-keeping God would let their family go through so much. You can listen to kids’ struggles without judging their family. Point to God’s faithfulness, even when it takes time to see how He’s moving. Kids can learn that God won’t lie or break promises.

Welcome



Say: Let's see if you can guess exactly how long 30 seconds is. When you think 30 seconds have passed, clap your hands. Let's find out who can get the closest without going over.

Start the timer and let kids clap when they think 30 seconds have passed. Play again using different lengths of time.

Say: Was 30 seconds longer or shorter than you expected? Did you get better at guessing time as we played? We can improve because time is steady—seconds, minutes and hours never change. But what if I told you there was once a day that lasted longer than twenty-four hours? And even more amazing—what if that long day proved that God always does what He says?

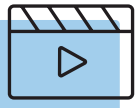

INTRO VIDEO

Play Intro Video then transition into discussion.

Say: Isaiah had some trouble finishing the hike in that ridiculous blazer.

Discuss: Have you ever started something, but wanted to quit halfway through?

Say: The great news today is that God never quits, and He finishes everything He starts. Today's Brite Idea is: God does what He says.

WHAT IS GOD'S BIGGER STORY?

Show teaching slide: God's Big Story

Say: The Bible is real and true. God gave us the Bible so we could know Him. The Bible is filled with many books and stories, but they are all a part of one BIG story — God's story.

Creation: God is the one true God and He has always existed. He is the Creator of all things, including you and me. He is good, He loves us, and we are made in His image.

Fall: Adam and Eve sinned and disobeyed God. Sin broke the world, and people were separated from God. People could not fix their sin problem on their own.

Redemption: God sent His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross, to take the punishment for our sins, and to rise from the dead to conquer death. When we trust in Jesus as our Savior, our relationship with God is made right again through His grace, and He gives us new life.

Restoration: When we walk with Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit and learn God's Word, He renews us. One day, Jesus will return to renew all things.

WHERE IS TODAY'S BIBLE STORY?

Show teaching image: Pillar of Cloud

Say: Last week we learned about the wilderness and how God provides for us.

Show teaching slide: Books of the Bible

Say: This week's story comes from the book of Joshua. Joshua is found in the Old Testament between the books of Deuteronomy and Judges.

Show teaching slide: Find It in the Bible Timeline

Say: This story falls in the "Promised Land" period of the Bible. Today's true story tells us what happened as the Israelites continued to claim the land God gave them!

Show teaching slide: Biblical Theme

Say: This month we are focusing on the powerful truth that God never fails.

Say: This week we are learning that God always does what He says, even when it takes doing something impossible!

LET'S FIND IT IN OUR BIBLES!

Open your Bible and show the kids the title page for the book of Joshua. Help kids turn in their Bibles to today's Bible passage (Joshua 10; 13).

Bible TEACHING

THE SUN STOOD STILL JOSHUA 10; 13



PRAY: God, You do amazing things! Things we can't even understand! If You say it, You do it. Help us to learn from Joshua and this mighty miracle today. Amen.

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, envelope

PREP:

None

LEADER TIP:

For smaller groups, kids can play multiple roles.

Say: After many years of wandering in the wilderness, Moses had died and Joshua was the new leader of the Israelites. They began conquering cities to take over the land that God had promised.

Have one volunteer stand and salute. That volunteer is now Joshua. After saluting, Joshua can sit back down.

Say: The kings of the land heard how Joshua and the people had defeated cities around them. They wanted to stop him, so they plotted to join together to attack the city of Gibeon.

Have three volunteers stand and pretend to speak angrily to one another. Allow them a few seconds of acting and then have them sit back down.

Say: The men of Gibeon sent word to ask Joshua for help, telling him about the attack that was coming.

Call a volunteer to come to the front of the space, hand them an envelope and have them take it to Joshua. The volunteer can then sit back down.

Show teaching illustration: Men of Gibeon Send Message to Joshua.

Say: Joshua gathered his brave fighting men and headed to Gibeon.

Have three new volunteers stand and flex their muscles. Allow them a few seconds of acting and then have them sit back down.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: Along the way, God spoke to Joshua.

Read Joshua 10:8 directly from the Bible: *And the LORD said to Joshua, "Do not fear them, for I have given them into your hands. Not a man of them shall stand before you."*

Say: Joshua and his men surprised the enemies, attacking them suddenly. The LORD caused the enemies to panic and run.

Have three volunteers stand and act scared and panicked. Allow them to run in place for a few seconds and then sit back down.

Say: Joshua and the Israelites chased after them, knowing that if night came, some of the enemy would escape and their victory would not be complete. Joshua asked God to make the sun stand still so that they could have more daylight to finish the battle.

Have Joshua stand and fold their hands in prayer while you read the verse.

Read Joshua 10:12 directly from the Bible: *At that time Joshua spoke to the LORD in the day when the Lord gave the Amorites over to the sons of Israel, and he said in the sight of Israel, "Sun, stand still at Gibeon, and moon, in the Valley of Aijalon."*

Invite Joshua to sit back down.

Show teaching illustration: *Joshua Prays & Sun Stands Still.*

Say: God answered! God slowed down the sun and it didn't set for a whole day. The Israelites were victorious!

Have the entire group stand and celebrate a great win! After a few seconds of acting, have them sit back down.

Say: Joshua led the Israelites to conquer more cities and to occupy Canaan, the Promised Land. Joshua divided up the land among the twelve tribes of Israel, giving each group their own inheritance.

Bible TEACHING CONTINUED

Say: God kept His promise to Joshua that they would win the battle. He kept an even bigger promise when they took over Canaan. Just like He had promised Abram, Isaac, Jacob and Moses, God gave His people their own land.

Show teaching slide: Point to Jesus.



POINT TO JESUS

Say: Throughout the Old Testament, God promised hundreds of times that He would send a Rescuer who would save the people from their sin. God kept His promise by sending Jesus, a descendant of Abraham, to Earth to die on the cross for our sins. God promises that when we trust in Jesus for forgiveness of our sins, we will live forever with Him. He always does what He says.

PREP:
